Research Analysis

SB 1800 provides that an individual is deemed unemployed with respect to any week during which the individual performed no services and no wages are payable to the individual. For an initial or additional initial unemployment claim filing, an individual is deemed unemployed if the wages payable to the individual during a week of less than full-time work are less than the individual's weekly benefit amount plus \$100 and the individual has incurred a loss of wages or reduction in hours based on their customary work experience or contract of hire. For filing made during a continued claim series, an individual is deemed unemployed if the wages payable to the individual during a week of less than full-time work are less than the individual's weekly benefit amount plus \$100.

The measure also consolidates definitions and repeals 40 O.S. Sections [1-202](#), [1-202.2](#), [1-203](#), [1-204](#), [1-205](#), [1-206](#), [1-207](#), [1-211](#), [1-212](#), [1-213](#), [1-215](#), [1-216](#), [1-219](#), [1-220](#), [1-221](#), [1-226](#), [1-301](#), [2-406.2](#), [2-709](#), [2-711](#), [2-713](#), and [3-118](#).

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Fiscal Analysis
