Research Analysis

The committee substitute to SB 186 clarifies the types of weapons that a convicted felon is not allowed to possess to include sawed-off rifles. The measure also removes a prohibition of a convicted felon from being a passenger in which a firearm is located. The measure also removes a provision that prohibits a person previously adjudicated as a delinquent child or a youthful offender from residing in a home which contains a firearm.

Fiscal Analysis

The committee substitute for the measure would allow persons convicted of felonies, or youthful offenders who otherwise would have been charged with a felony, to be passengers in a vehicle that also contains a firearm.

Upon review, no direct fiscal impact to the state is anticipated from passage of the measure. The measure would not affect state revenues, or require additional state expenditures.
