Research Analysis

SB 186 restores the right to a person who has been convicted of a non-violent felony in a court of the state or court of the United States to possess a firearm 5 years after completion of the sentence for the last felony offense if no additional charges are pending against the person and the person completed his or her sentence. The person's right to possess a firearm shall be forfeit if he or she is subsequently convicted of a subsequent misdemeanor or felony violation. A person convicted of child endangerment, domestic abuse, incest, indecent exposure, sexual assault, stalking, violations of a protective order, or violations of the Sex Offender Registration Act shall not be eligible to have gun rights restored.
