**Research Analysis**

According to the 2020 Federal Decennial Census, Oklahoma's statewide population is 3,959,353 making the ideal district population for each state Senate district 82,487. SB1X updates the State Senate Redistricting Act of 2021 to divide the 48 state Senate districts accordingly. The measure repeals the district descriptions that were based on the Census Bureau's 2015-2019 American Community Survey population estimates.
