**Research Analysis**

The conference committee substitute for SB615 requires public schools to designate every multiple occupancy restroom and changing area as for the exclusive use of the male sex or the exclusive use of the female sex. "Sex" is defined in the measure as the physical condition of being male or female based on genetics and physiology, as identified on one's original birth certificate. Public schools must also provide access to single-occupancy restroom or changing room.

If a school district does not comply, its state funding will be reduced by 5 percent for the fiscal year following the year of noncompliance. A parent or legal guardian of a student shall have a cause of action against a noncompliant school district.
