**Research Analysis**

SB 689 modifies and limits the membership requirements for the Advisory Committee on Medical Care for Public Assistance Recipients. The measure caps the total membership to fifteen members and requires board membership to include a member representing nursing homes and a member representing one or more behavioral health professions. Additionally, the committee must include the Commissioner of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services or a designee as well as a member of a federally recognized American Indian tribe.

Appointments made to the Advisory Committee will be for a term of three consecutive years beginning on January 1, 2022. Chair and vice-chairs will serve one-year terms not to exceed more than three, consecutive one-year terms.
