**Bill Analysis**

HB 1032 changes the name of the Home Bakery Act of 2013 to the Homemade Food Freedom Act. The measure provides that the production and sale of homemade food products that meet the certain conditions outlined in the measure shall be exempt from licensing requirements. Such conditions shall regulate the sale and delivery of non-time- or -temperature-controlled-for-safety homemade food products and requires such products to be sold directly to the consumer from the producer. Producers are also required to complete at least 8 hours of training approved by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry. Homemade food products must also have a label affixed to its packaging.
