Bill Analysis

HB 3319 authorizes appropriate licensing boards to grant a temporary critical need license to health care providers under certain circumstances. Such conditions include a state of emergency declared by the Governor or national emergency declared by the President of the United States, the provider holds a valid license granted by another state or territory, and the health care provider is not currently under investigation and no restrictions or limitations are currently placed on the health care provider's license or credential by the licensing or credentialing state or territory. License shall expire 90 days after the expiration of the state or national emergency declaration. Temporary critical need licensees shall not have prescriptive authority as it relates to controlled dangerous substances unless such licensees are properly registered and adhere to relevant regulations. Licensees may not recommend the use of medical marijuana.
