**Bill Analysis**

SB 1092 directs the Office of Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) to promulgate rules for a flag flying program enabling the people of Oklahoma to request for a flag or flags to be flown at the Oklahoma State Capitol building on specific days for commemorative purposes. The measure provides that only the current flag of the State of Oklahoma, current flag of the United States, original (Star & 46) flag of the State of Oklahoma, original 13 Stars and Stripes flag of the United States also known as the Betsy Ross flag, “An Appeal to Heaven” flag flown by General George Washington, and the Gadsden flag also known as the “Don’t Tread On Me” flag may be flown over the State Capitol. Requests shall be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. OMES may develop a fee structure to provide for the costs associated with the flag flying program including but not limited to the cost of the purchase of the flag, cost of employee services, and cost of certificate confirming date and time flag was flown. An additional fee of \$25.00 per flag flown shall be charged and deposited into the Capitol Preservation Fund.
