**Bill Analysis**

SB 1098 provides that a firearm suppressor and the basic materials from which a firearm suppressor is manufactured shall not be subject to federal law or federal regulations as they relate to the authority of the United States Congress to regulate interstate commerce. A suppressor manufactured in Oklahoma must have the words "Made in Oklahoma" clearly stamped or engraved on it. Such suppressors shall be considered manufactured in the State if no materials other than generic or insignificant parts were imported from outside of the State. Generic and insignificant parts are items that have a manufacturing or consumer product application other than inclusion in a firearm suppressor. Additionally, the measure prohibits any officer of the state or political subdivision from enforcing federal regulations relating to firearm suppressors.
