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Bill Analysis

SB 119 requires any persons, organization, or group to submit an application to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services at least 10 business days prior to the beginning date proposed to use the State Capitol or its grounds for an event or demonstration. Applications for use of the State Capitol Park must be submitted 48 hours in advance of the event or demonstration. Approved applicants must agree to restore the event space to its prior condition within 24 hours of its use as well as agree to indemnify and hold harmless the OMES, Capitol Assets Management (CAM), and staff from any and all claims, actions, lawsuits, liability, damage, injury, penalty, fine, loss, sustained directly or indirectly, by any person, authority or entity for injuries or damages of any kind or character, whether through negligence, tort fraud, accident, intentional, or otherwise based upon the use or occupation of the facilities herein described or by reason of any acts or omissions of the permittee, its officers, agents, employees, guests, patrons, invitees or any other party. Intermittent or casual use shall not require an application. CAM and State Capitol Police are authorized by the measure to enter and inspect the premises used by permittee at any reasonable time.

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
