## **Bill Analysis**

The FS for SB 186 restores the right to a person who has been convicted of a non-violent felony in a court of the state or court of the United States to possess a firearm 5 years after completion of the sentence for the last felony offense if no additional charges are pending against the person and the person completed his or her sentence. Such person's right to possess a firearm shall be forfeit if he or she is subsequently convicted of a subsequent misdemeanor or felony violation. A person convicted of any of the non-violent felony offenses outlined in the measure shall not be eligible to have gun rights restored. The measure strikes language prohibiting any felon from riding in a vehicle with a firearm in the vehicle. Additionally, the measure strikes obsolete language relating to handgun licenses.
