**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2004 makes many changes to Oklahoma's medical marijuana laws some of which will have a fiscal impact. Expanding discounted licensing fees and reducing licensing fees for transportation will result in a decrease in revenue to OMMA. Giving OMMA the ability to collect fees for licensing reprints, removal of residency requirements for patient licenses, collecting fines for material changes to commercial licenses, increase fines for illegal sales, and the ability to assess a late application fee for commercial licenses will lead to a increase in revenue to OMMA. The ability to assess fines without a required hearing will reduce costs for OMMA. Changing from a stand-alone transportation license to a wholesaler license will require additional training to OMMA staff and may require new software leading to an increase in costs for OMMA.
