**Fiscal Analysis**

HB 2272 requires those with a medical marijuana dispensary, processor, or commercial grower license to make attestations to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs Control (OBNND) to any foreign financial interest in the medical marijuana business within 60 days of approval of their license application. There will be some additional burden on OBNND to receive the additional attestations and additional staff time at Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority (OMMA) to coordinate with OBNDD to identify those who have not made the attestation and to suspend and enforce the licenses with those not in compliance. These costs will be contingent on the number of license holders who fail to make the attestations.
