**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 252 requires all public and charter high schools to offer a minimum of one computer science course beginning in the 2024-25 school year. To implement the provisions of this bill, SDE believes there will be, at a minimum, cost to train existing teachers. Training costs will include course development and delivery, certification exam costs, materials, travel, stipend and other miscellaneous expenses. SDE projects a rough estimate of \$1500 per course. Elementary school teachers would receive two courses; middle and high school teachers would receive four courses. To meet the reporting requirements, SDE estimates an additional cost of \$7500 for personnel time to develop the report. The current student information system will allow for collecting the data from districts.
