**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 779 has the Board of Pharmacy create a certification process for distributors/manufacturers of abortion inducing drugs in addition to the physicians that prescribe them. Costs to implement this measure will be paid for by certification fees and current revenues generated. There are an estimated 20 physicians in the state that currently prescribe these drugs. The Board of Pharmacy estimates a cost impact of \$12.2m. With an increase in staff from 12 to 60 to perform the duties required. The Senate Fiscal Staff fiscal impact on this measure is cost neutral to the state due to the non-appropriated status of the agency, with an estimated cost of no more than \$75,000. This cost will be funded by fines and fees and by current revenues.
