**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 806 increases the penalties for assaulting law enforcement officers and corrections personnel while in the performance of their duties. The bill also sets penalties for those convicted of participating in, or remaining present after being lawfully warned to disperse from, any riot, rout, or unlawful assembly. This includes persons who block or obstruct traffic on public highways or streets and who deface/destroy certain property. This bill could result in an increase in Oklahoma's incarcerated population, however the fiscal impact is contingent on the number of people convicted of the offenses listed in the bill. Average daily cost per inmate for maximum, medium, and minimum security is \$108.17, \$61.71, and \$57.39 respectively.
