**Fiscal Analysis**

SB 854 allows a home food establishment to sell non-time/nontemperature control for safety food on site. It raises the sales cap on "home food establishments" from \$20,000 to \$100,000. SB 854 eliminates the need for home food establishments with under \$100,000 in revenue to have be licensed by the State Department of Health. The State Department of Health estimates that they will lose 20 to 50 new licenses at \$425 dollars a license and 200 to 500 renewal licenses at \$335 a license resulting in a total loss of \$75,000-\$188,750 in yearly revenue.

**Full Year Impact:** \$75,000.00 - \$188,750.00
