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16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
17	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
18	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6572 of Title 36, unless there
19	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
20	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Transparency in
21	Health Care Prices Act".
22	SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6573 of Title 36, unless there
24	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

As used in the Transparency in Health Care Prices Act:
 1. "Agency" means a government department, agency or a
 government-created entity;

2. "CPT code" means the Current Procedural Terminology code, or
5 its successor code, as developed and copyrighted by the American
6 Medical Association or its successor entity;

3. "Health care facility" means a facility licensed or certified
by the State Department of Health, but shall not include a nursing
care facility, assisted living facility or home care agency;

10 4. "Health care price" means the cash price that a health care 11 provider or health care facility will charge a recipient for health 12 care services that will be rendered. Health care price is the price 13 charged for the standard service for the particular diagnosis and 14 does not include any amount that may be charged for complications or 15 exceptional treatment;

16 5. "Health care provider" means a person who is licensed,
17 certified or registered by this state to provide health care
18 services or a medical group, independent practice association or
19 professional corporation providing health care services;

20 6. "Health care services" or "services" means services included 21 in, or incidental to, furnishing to an individual:

- a. medical, mental, dental or optometric care orhospitalization, or
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1	b. other services for the purpose of preventing,
2	alleviating, curing or healing a physical or mental
3	illness or injury;
4	7. "Recipient" means an individual who receives health care
5	services from a health care provider or health care facility; and
6	8. "Specialty service line" means health care services rendered
7	by a specific medical specialist to include, but not be limited to:
8	a. general surgery,
9	b. obstetrics or gynecology,
10	c. cardiology,
11	d. urology,
12	e. ophthalmology,
13	f. neurology/neurosurgery,
14	g. orthopedics,
15	h. hematology/oncology,
16	i. pathology,
17	j. radiology,
18	k. emergency medicine,
19	1. physical therapy, or
20	m. another specialty service provided by a health care
21	facility.
22	SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6574 of Title 36, unless there
24	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 A. A health care provider shall make available to the public, 2 in a single document, either electronically or by posting conspicuously on the provider's website if one exists, the health 3 4 care prices for at least the twenty most common health care services 5 the health care provider provides. If the health care provider, in the normal course of his or her practice, regularly provides fewer 6 than twenty health care services, the health care provider shall 7 make available the health care prices for the health care services 8 9 the provider most commonly provides.

A Current Procedural Terminology code or other coding system
 commonly used by the health care provider and accepted as a national
 standard for billing; and

The health care provider shall identify the services by:

2. A plain English description.

15 C. The health care provider shall update the document as 16 frequently as the health care provider deems appropriate, but at 17 least annually.

SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6575 of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. A health care facility shall make available to the public, in a single document, either electronically or by posting conspicuously on its website if one exists, the health care prices for at least:

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The twenty most used diagnosis-related group codes or other
 codes for inpatient health care services per specialty service line
 used by the health care facility for billing; and

The twenty most used outpatient CPT codes or health care
 services procedure codes per specialty service line used for
 billing.

B. A health care facility shall include with the health care
prices provided pursuant to subsection A of this section a plain
English description of the services for which the health care prices
are provided.

C. The health care facility shall update the document as
 frequently as it deems appropriate, but at least annually.

SECTION 5. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6576 of Title 36, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

16 A. Nothing in the Transparency in Health Care Prices Act shall 17 require a health care facility or health care provider to report its 18 health care prices to any agency for review, filing or other 19 purposes, or for applications for health care professional loan 20 repayment. The Transparency in Health Care Prices Act shall not 21 grant any agency the authority to approve, disapprove or limit a 22 health care facility's or health care provider's health care prices 23 or change its health care prices.

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1	B. Nothing in this act shall impair contracts between private
2	parties.
3	SECTION 6. This act shall become effective November 1, 2021.
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
