7	An Act relating to schools; amending 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1-111, which relates to school days;
8	requiring students participating in 4-H activities to be considered present for attendance purposes;
9	directing 4-H agent to provide proof of participation upon request; requiring student be given opportunity
10	to make up missed schoolwork; prohibiting class grades from being adversely affected; providing
11	exception for certain absences; and providing an effective date.
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14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 70 O.S. 2021, Section 1-111, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 1-111. A. Except as otherwise provided for by law, a
18	school day shall consist of not less than six (6) hours devoted to
19	school activities. A district board of education may elect to
20	extend the length of one (1) or more school days to more than six
21	(6) hours and reduce the number of school days as long as the total
22	amount of classroom instruction time is not less than one thousand
23	eighty (1,080) hours per year as required pursuant to Section 1-109
24	of this title.

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B. A school day for nursery, early childhood education, 1 2 kindergarten, and alternative education programs shall be as otherwise defined by law or as defined by the State Board of 3 4 Education. Except as otherwise provided for in this subsection, not 5 more than one (1) school day shall be counted for attendance purposes in any twenty-four-hour period. Two (2) school days, each 6 7 consisting of not less than six (6) hours, may be counted for attendance purposes in any twenty-four-hour period only if one of 8 9 the school days is for the purpose of parent-teacher conferences 10 held as provided for in Section 1-109 of this title.

11 C. Students Except as provided in subsection D of this section, 12 students absent from school in which they are regularly enrolled may 13 be considered as being in attendance if the reason for such absence 14 is to participate in scheduled school activities under the direction 15 and supervision of a regular member of the faculty or to participate 16 in an online course approved by the district board of education. 17 The State Board of Education shall adopt rules to provide for the 18 implementation of supplemental online courses which shall include, 19 but not be limited to, provisions addressing the following: 20 1. Criteria for student admissions eligibility; 21 2. A student admission process administered through the 22 district of residence, which provides the ability for the student to

23 enroll in individual courses;

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1 3. A process by which students are not denied the opportunity 2 to enroll in educationally appropriate courses by school districts. For the purposes of this section, "educationally appropriate" means 3 4 any instruction that is not substantially a repeat of a course or 5 portion of a course that the student has successfully completed, regardless of the grade of the student, and regardless of whether a 6 7 course is similar to or identical to the instruction that is currently offered in the school district; 8

9 4. Creation of a system which provides ongoing enrollment10 access for students throughout the school year;

11 5. A grace period of fifteen (15) calendar days from the first 12 day of an online course for student withdrawal from an online course 13 without academic penalty;

14 6. Mastery of competencies for course completion rather than15 Carnegie units;

16 7. Student participation in extracurricular activities in 17 accordance with school district eligibility rules and policies and 18 any rules and policies of a private organization or association 19 which provides the coordination, supervision, and regulation of the 20 interscholastic activities and contests of schools;

8. Parent authorization for release of state test results to online course providers, on a form developed by the State Department of Education; and

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1	9. A review process to identify and certify online course
2	providers and a uniform payment processing system.
3	D. Except as provided in paragraph 3 of this subsection,
4	students absent from school in which they are regularly enrolled
5	shall be considered as being in attendance if the reason for such
6	absence is to participate in scheduled 4-H activities or programs.
7	1. Upon request from a school principal or attendance officer,
8	a 4-H agent shall provide documentation as proof of student
9	participation in an activity or program sponsored by 4-H.
10	2. Students shall be given the opportunity to make up any
11	schoolwork missed while they are participating in activities or
12	programs sponsored by 4-H. Students shall not have their class
13	grades adversely affected for lack of attendance or participation
14	due to their participation in activities or programs sponsored by 4-
15	<u>H.</u>
16	3. A school principal or his or her designee shall not credit a
17	student who participates in an activity or program sponsored by 4-H
18	as present if the participation occurs during:
19	a. the schedule established by the State Board of
20	Education for the administration of statewide student
21	assessments, or
22	b. any period of time for which the student has been
22 23	b. any period of time for which the student has been disciplined, suspended, or expelled, if the terms of

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participating in an educational field trip or extracurricular activity.

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<u>E.</u> Each district board of education shall adopt policies and procedures that conform to rules for online courses as adopted by the State Board. Such policies shall include criteria for approval of the course, the appropriateness of the course for a particular student, authorization for full-time students to enroll in online courses, and establishing fees or charges. No district shall be liable for payment of any fees or charges for any online course for a student who has not complied with the district's policies and procedures. School districts shall not deny students the opportunity to enroll in educationally appropriate courses and shall provide an admissions process which includes input from the student,

E. <u>F.</u> Districts shall require students enrolled in online
courses to participate in the Oklahoma School Testing Program Act.
Students participating in online courses from a remote site will be
responsible for providing their own equipment and Internet access,
unless the district chooses to provide the equipment. Credit may
not be granted for such courses except upon approval of the State
Board of Education and the district board of education.

22 F. G. Districts may provide students with opportunities for 23 blended instruction. "Blended instruction" shall mean a combination 24 of brick-and-mortar learning and virtual learning environments that

1 includes elements of a student's control over place, pace and path 2 of learning. A student in blended instruction may work on virtual 3 courses at home or at school in a blended flex lab but shall participate in at least one unit or set of competencies as defined 4 5 by Section 11-103.6 of this title at a physical school building in a 6 traditional classroom setting which is the academic equivalent of 7 one (1) hour per day for each instructional day in the school year 8 as defined by Section 1-109 of this title. 9 G. H. The school day for kindergarten may consist of six (6) 10 hours devoted to school activities. SECTION 2.
