The Commission shall be 20 composed of the following ten (10) members: 21 The Commissioner of the Department of Public Safety or 22 designee; 23 2. The Director of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation 24

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or designee;

- 3. The Director of the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs or designee;
 - 4. The Director of the Oklahoma ABLE Commission or designee;
 - 5. The Cabinet Secretary of Public Safety or designee;
 - 6. The Deputy Cabinet Secretary of Public Safety;
 - 7. The Attorney General or designee;
- 8. One member designated by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate who shall be a current member of the Senate;
- 9. One member designated by the Speaker of the House of Representatives who shall be a current member of the House of Representatives; and
- 10. One member appointed by the Governor as a Special Advisor to the Commission.
- B. The Governor shall appoint the chair of the Commission from within the Commission. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of conducting the business of the Commission. The Commission shall meet monthly and at such other times as may be called by the chair.
- C. Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for serving on the Commission but shall receive travel reimbursement for necessary travel expenses incurred in the performance of their duties by their respective agencies in accordance with the State Travel Reimbursement Act.

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- D. The Law Enforcement Unification Commission shall study, evaluate and make recommendations as follows:
- 1. Unification of the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation, the Oklahoma Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs, the Department of Public Safety and the Oklahoma ABLE Commission;
- 2. Development of a focused, common training and leadership development program for all members of a unified public safety agency that will be beneficial for recruitment of qualified law enforcement officers; and
- 3. Creation of the Oklahoma Office of Inspector General within the Oklahoma Office of the Attorney General.
- E. The Commission shall prepare a report of its findings and recommendations to be submitted to the Governor, President Pro

 Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and the Chair of the Public Safety Committees in both the Senate and the House of Representatives no later than December 1, 2021.
- F. Staffing for the Commission shall be provided by the Senate.

 SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation

 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby

 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and

 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
