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1 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

2 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 3 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6301 of Title 74, unless there 4 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

5 Α. The World Health Organization, the United Nations and the World Economic Forum shall have no jurisdiction in the State of 6 7 The state and its political subdivisions, including, but Oklahoma. not limited to, counties, cities, towns, precincts, water districts, 8 9 school districts, school administrative units, or quasi-public 10 entities, shall not engage in the enforcement of, or any 11 collaboration with the enforcement of, any requirements, 12 instructions, mandates, recommendations, or guidance provided by the 13 World Health Organization, the United Nations or the World Economic 14 Forum.

Any mandates, recommendations, instructions, communications 15 Β. 16 or guidance issued by the World Health Organization, the United 17 Nations or the World Economic Forum shall not be used in this state 18 as a basis for action, nor to direct, order or otherwise impose, 19 contrary to the constitution and laws of the State of Oklahoma any 20 requirements whatsoever, including those for masks, vaccines or 21 medical testing, or gather any public or private information about 22 the state's citizens or residents, and shall have no force or effect 23 in the State of Oklahoma.

24 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective June 1, 2024.

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13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
14	SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 26 O.S. 2021, Section 4-112, as
15	amended by Section 18, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (26 O.S. Supp. 2022,
16	Section 4-112), is amended to read as follows:
17	Section 4-112. A. The Secretary of the State Election Board
18	shall devise and distribute a registration application form to be
19	used for registering voters. Such registration application shall
20	contain the following information:
21	1. The applicant's full name and date of birth, county and
22	place of residence, and mailing address pursuant to the provisions
23	of subsection G of this section;
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2. A space or section to designate a political party recognized
 by the laws of the State of Oklahoma with which the applicant
 chooses to be affiliated;

3. The Oklahoma driver license or identification card number if
the applicant has been issued a current and valid driver license or
identification card by Service Oklahoma, or if the applicant does
not have a valid Oklahoma driver license or identification card, the
last four digits of the voter's Social Security number;

9 4. An oath of the eligibility of the applicant to become a10 registered voter; and

5. Such other information as may be deemed necessary by the Secretary to identify such applicant and to ascertain his or her eligibility.

A voter registration application shall be signed by the 14 в. applicant in writing. The applicant shall personally subscribe his 15 or her name to or make his or her mark on the application, and no 16 agent, representative or employee of the applicant may sign or mark 17 on the applicant's behalf. The signature or mark must be the 18 original, handwritten signature, autograph or mark of the applicant. 19 No facsimile, reproduction, typewritten or other substitute 20 signature, autograph or mark will be valid. Notwithstanding any law 21 to the contrary, the Secretary of the State Election Board shall 22 prescribe procedures to authorize any person incapable of personally 23 making a mark to complete a voter registration application with 24

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assistance of an official of any voter registration agency or licensed operator specified in Sections 4-109.2 and 4-109.3 of this title. Provided, for applications submitted electronically, in lieu of the signature requirements set forth in this subsection, the applicant shall consent to the use of his or her driver license or identification card signature as provided in Section 4-109.4 of this title.

8 C. Persons who do not indicate a recognized political party or 9 political organization on their registration application shall be 10 designated as Independents.

D. Any person may apply in writing to the Secretary of the
State Election Board for permission to print, copy or otherwise
prepare and distribute the registration applications designed by the
Secretary of the State Election Board. The Secretary may revoke any
such permission at any time.

16 E. All registration applications shall be distributed to the17 public at no charge.

F. The Secretary also shall prescribe procedures to accept and use the National Mail Voter Registration Form, or its successor, as required by the National Voter Registration Act of 1993. Provided, to be accepted as a valid voter registration application, the form shall include the applicant's original, handwritten signature, autograph or mark as described in subsection B of this section.

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1 G. Applicants for voter registration or for change of voter 2 registration in any way shall provide a residence address and, if different from the residence address, a mailing address. A 3 residence address shall include the street address of the residence, 4 5 including a full house number, street name or number, apartment or suite number, if applicable, and zip code. If a street address is 6 not available for the residence, applicants shall provide such 7 information as the Secretary of the State Election Board deems 8 9 necessary for voter registration purposes. A post office box may not be given as a residence address. A mailing address, which shall 10 include the city and zip code, may be the actual emergency 11 notification or 911 address on file in the local community, a rural 12 route and box number, a post office box number or a street address. 13 The secretary of a county election board may utilize global 14 positioning system (GPS) technology to ensure a voter is assigned to 15 the appropriate precinct. 16 A full or partial Social Security number or driver license 17 Η. number in a voter registration record or a voter registration 18 application shall not be considered a public record and shall be 19 kept confidential by the State Election Board and each county 20

21 election board.

SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
