8	An Act relating to teacher compensation; creating the Teacher Compensation Review and Adjustment Act; directing State Board of Education to biennially review average annual salaries of teachers in surrounding states; defining terms; requiring Legislature to introduce a bill to provide a salary increase in certain cases; prescribing legislative process for consideration of bill; declaring certain bill to be immediately effective upon enactment; authorizing change of certain time constraints; providing for codification; providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.			
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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 18-114.16 of Title 70, unless			
20	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
21	A. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Teacher			
22	Compensation Review and Adjustment Act".			
23	B. The State Board of Education shall, in each odd-numbered			
24	year, conduct a comprehensive review of the average annual salary of			

1 teachers in the surrounding states of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas,
2 Missouri, New Mexico, and Texas.

- C. As used in the Teacher Compensation Review and Adjustment Act:
 - 1. "Average annual salary":

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- a. means the arithmetic mean of the average annual salary groups defined in paragraph 2 of this subsection and is the average gross salary regularly paid or stipulated to be paid to an individual before deductions for taxes, retirement, health insurance, and other similar expenses,
- b. shall include regular salaries for full-time and parttime employees considered to be in permanent employment positions, and
- c. shall not include:
 - (1) extra duty pay,
 - (2) payments for teaching summer school, unless the employee has a twelve-month contract, or
 - (3) employee benefits, unless the benefits are provided pursuant to 26 U.S.C., Section 125 related to Cafeteria Plans or health flexible spending arrangements that reduce the employee's salary for tax purposes;
- 2. "Average annual salary groups" includes:

a. "all instructional staff salary" which means the average annual salary of full-time equivalent instructional staff and shall be the weighted arithmetic mean of the combined annual salaries of classroom teachers, substitute teachers, principals, supervisors, and other instructional personnel,

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- b. "elementary classroom teacher salary" which means the average annual salary of the full-time equivalent elementary classroom teachers,
- c. "secondary classroom teacher salary" which means the average annual salary of the full-time equivalent secondary classroom teachers, and
- d. "average classroom teacher salary" which means the weighted arithmetic mean of salary figures calculated in subparagraphs b and c of this paragraph; and
- 3. "Teachers" means all of the categories of certified personnel who are eligible for salary compensation based on years of experience and step levels described in Section 18-114.15 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.
- D. If the average annual salary of teachers in the surrounding states is determined to be greater than the average annual salary of teachers in this state, the Legislature shall introduce a bill to provide a salary increase for teachers up to but not to exceed the

average annual salary in the surrounding states, to ensure competitiveness with surrounding states.

E. Any introduced bill required by subsection D of this section shall be passed by a majority vote in legislative committees, and shall proceed directly to the floor of each chamber, where the bill shall, within five (5) legislative days, be scheduled for debate on the floor of each chamber, and thereafter, within three (3) legislative days after the debate is closed, shall be presented for a roll call vote on the chamber of each floor. The bill, if passed in the same manner as other general law, shall have the force and effect of law, and shall be effective immediately upon enactment. The time constraints listed in this subsection may be changed by majority vote of any chamber of subsequent Legislatures.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
