L 6	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
L7	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-160 of Title 43A, unless there			
L8	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
L 9	There is hereby established within the Oklahoma Department of

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SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-161 of Title 43A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

In order to maximize the effectiveness of state government through collaboration with faith-based and community initiatives to serve Oklahomans with respect to public purposes, such as improving public safety, overcoming addiction, strengthening families and communities, and overcoming poverty, the Office shall, to the extent permitted by law:

- 1. Promote and foster the development of relationships and coordination between state government and faith-based and community initiatives and serve as a resource for and liaison between state government and such initiatives;
- 2. Coordinate activities designed to mobilize public support for faith-based and community initiatives through volunteerism, special projects, and public-private partnerships;
- 3. Ensure that state government decisions and programs are consistent with the goal of partnering with faith-based and community initiatives when doing so is in the public interest, and monitor how such decisions and programs affect faith-based and community initiatives;
- 4. Work with state, local, and community policymakers, volunteers, and public officials to facilitate coordination with and empowerment of faith-based and other community organizations, where

doing so, would improve such groups' service to the communities involved; and

- 5. Showcase and herald successful and innovative faith-based and community organizations and civic initiatives.
- SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-162 of Title 43A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - A. The Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services shall carry out the training, engagement, and implementation of the Office of Faith-based and Community Initiatives.
 - B. The Office may enter into such contractual and promotional agreements necessary to maximize the effectiveness of state government through collaboration with faith-based and community initiatives to serve Oklahomans with respect to public purposes.
 - C. The Office may work with local governments, private organizations, and citizens as it plans and engages in activities related to the Office.
- SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2-163 of Title 43A, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
 - The Oklahoma Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse

 Services shall annually submit to the Governor, the President Pro

 Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate, and the Speaker of the

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Oklahoma House of Representatives, within ninety (90) days after the
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    end of its fiscal year, a report setting forth its operation and
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    accomplishments of the Office of Faith-based and Community
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    Initiatives.
        SECTION 5. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
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
