14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

15 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law not to be
16 codified in the Oklahoma Statutes reads as follows:

17 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Fees Assessed
18 and Imposed Reasonably (FAIR) Act".

19 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 19 O.S. 2021, Section 220, is
20 amended to read as follows:

21 Section 220. A. Beginning July 1, 1991, there is hereby
22 created with the county treasurer of each county within this state a
23 depository revolving fund to be designated the "Court Clerk's
24 Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject

1 to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received
2 as grants from the federal government and any other monies
3 designated by law for deposit into the fund. All monies accruing to
4 the credit of the fund shall be expended by the court clerk for the
5 lawful operation of the court clerk's office. Claims against the
6 fund shall include only expenses incurred for the operation of the
7 court clerk's office in each county, and payment may be made after
8 the claim is approved by the court clerk and either the district or
9 the associate district judge of that county. The monies shall be
10 reported quarterly to the Administrator of the Courts. The
11 necessary forms and procedures shall be developed and implemented by
12 the Administrative Director of the Courts.

13 B. There shall be no monies, other than federal funds,
14 deposited into the fund created herein, unless expressly authorized
15 by the Legislature.

16 C. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the court clerk
17 shall assess an administrative fee of ten percent (10%) on all fees
18 collected by the court clerk for agencies other than the court and
19 not deposited into the court fund. The administrative fee shall not
20 attach to the sheriff's service fees provided for in Sections 153
21 and 153.2 of Title 28 of the Oklahoma Statutes, monies deposited
22 into the Law Library Fund, witness fees paid by the district
23 attorney pursuant to the provisions of Section 82 of Title 28 of the
24 Oklahoma Statutes, and dispute resolution fees provided for in

1 Section 1809 of Title 12 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The
2 administrative fees shall be deposited in the Court Clerk's
3 Revolving Fund.

4 ~~D. Effective July 1, 2016, in addition to the amount collected~~
5 ~~in subsection C of this section, the court clerk shall assess an~~
6 ~~administrative fee of fifteen percent (15%) on all fees collected by~~
7 ~~the court clerk for agencies other than the court and not deposited~~
8 ~~into the court fund.~~

9 ~~E. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving~~
10 ~~fund to be allocated by the Supreme Court for the administration of~~
11 ~~the district courts designated as the "District Court Revolving~~
12 ~~Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal~~
13 ~~year limitations, and shall consist of all monies collected pursuant~~
14 ~~to subsection D of this section. All monies accruing to the credit~~
15 ~~of the fund are hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended~~
16 ~~by the Supreme Court as necessary to perform the duties imposed upon~~
17 ~~the district courts by law. Expenditures from the District Court~~
18 ~~Revolving Fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State~~
19 ~~Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by law with the~~
20 ~~Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for~~
21 ~~approval and payment.~~

22 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 20 O.S. 2021, Section 1313.2, is
23 amended to read as follows:

24 Section 1313.2. A. As used in this section:

1 1. "Arrested" means taking custody of another for the purpose
2 of holding or detaining him or her to answer a criminal charge;

3 2. "Convicted" means any final adjudication of guilt, whether
4 pursuant to a plea of guilty or nolo contendere or otherwise, and
5 any deferred or suspended sentence or judgment;

6 3. "Court" means any state or municipal court having
7 jurisdiction to impose a criminal fine or penalty; and

8 4. "DNA" means Deoxyribonucleic acid.

9 B. Any person convicted of an offense including traffic
10 offenses but excluding parking and standing violations, punishable
11 by a fine of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) or more or by incarceration or any
12 person forfeiting bond when charged with such an offense, ~~shall~~ by a
13 city or county that conducts satellite CLEET academies, may be
14 ordered by the court to pay ~~Ten Dollars (\$10.00)~~ Two Dollars (\$2.00)
15 as a separate fee, which fee shall be in addition to and not in
16 substitution for any and all fines and penalties otherwise provided
17 for by law for such offense.

18 C. 1. Any person convicted of any misdemeanor or felony
19 offense shall pay a Laboratory Analysis Fee in the amount of One
20 Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) for each offense if forensic science
21 or laboratory services are rendered or administered by the Oklahoma
22 State Bureau of Investigation (OSBI), by the Toxicology Laboratory
23 of the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner or by any municipality
24 or county in connection with the case. This fee shall be in

1 addition to and not a substitution for any and all fines and
2 penalties otherwise provided for by law for this offense.

3 2. The court clerk shall cause to be deposited the amount of
4 One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) as collected, for every
5 conviction as described in this subsection. The court clerk shall
6 remit the monies in the fund on a monthly basis directly either to:

7 a. the OSBI who shall deposit the monies into the OSBI
8 Revolving Fund provided for in Section 150.19a of
9 Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes for services
10 rendered or administered by the OSBI,

11 b. the Office of the Chief Medical Examiner who shall
12 deposit the monies into the Chief Medical Examiner
13 Revolving Fund provided for in Section 948 of Title 63
14 of the Oklahoma Statutes for services rendered or
15 administered by the Office of the Chief Medical
16 Examiner, or

17 c. the appropriate municipality or county for services
18 rendered or administered by a municipality or county.

19 3. The monies from the Laboratory Analysis Fee Fund deposited
20 into the OSBI Revolving Fund shall be used for the following:

21 a. providing criminalistic laboratory services,
22 b. the purchase and maintenance of equipment for use by
23 the laboratory in performing analysis,
24

1 c. education, training, and scientific development of
2 OSBI personnel, and

3 d. the destruction of seized property and chemicals as
4 prescribed in Sections 2-505 and 2-508 of Title 63 of
5 the Oklahoma Statutes.

6 ~~D. Upon conviction or bond forfeiture, the court shall collect~~
7 ~~the fee provided for in subsection B of this section and deposit it~~
8 ~~in an account created for that purpose. Except as otherwise~~
9 ~~provided in subsection E of this section, monies shall be forwarded~~
10 ~~monthly by the court clerk to the Council on Law Enforcement~~
11 ~~Education and Training (CLEET). Beginning July 1, 2003, deposits~~
12 ~~shall be due on the fifteenth day of each month for the preceding~~
13 ~~calendar month. There shall be a late fee imposed for failure to~~
14 ~~make timely deposits; provided, CLEET, in its discretion, may waive~~
15 ~~all or part of the late fee. Such late fee shall be one percent~~
16 ~~(1%) of the principal amount due per day beginning from the tenth~~
17 ~~day after payment is due and accumulating until the late fee reaches~~
18 ~~one hundred percent (100%) of the principal amount due. Beginning~~
19 ~~on July 1, 1987, ninety percent (90%) of the monies received by~~
20 ~~CLEET from the court clerks pursuant to this section shall be~~
21 ~~deposited in the CLEET Fund, and ten percent (10%) shall be~~
22 ~~deposited in the General Revenue Fund. Beginning January 1, 2001,~~
23 ~~sixty and fifty-three one-hundredths percent (60.53%) of the monies~~
24 ~~received by CLEET from the court clerks pursuant to this section~~

1 ~~shall be deposited in the CLEET Fund created pursuant to subsection~~
2 ~~G of this section, five and eighty-three one-hundredths percent~~
3 ~~(5.83%) shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund and thirty-~~
4 ~~three and sixty-four one-hundredths percent (33.64%) shall be~~
5 ~~deposited in the CLEET Training Center Revolving Fund created~~
6 ~~pursuant to Section 3311.6 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.~~
7 ~~Along with the deposits required by this subsection, each court~~
8 ~~shall also submit a report stating the total amount of funds~~
9 ~~collected and the total number of fees imposed during the preceding~~
10 ~~quarter. The report may be made on computerized or manual~~
11 ~~disposition reports.~~

12 ~~E.~~ Any municipality or county having a basic law enforcement
13 academy approved by CLEET pursuant to the criteria developed by
14 CLEET for training law enforcement officers shall retain from monies
15 collected pursuant to subsections A through ~~D~~ C of this section, Two
16 Dollars (\$2.00) from each fee. These monies shall be deposited into
17 an account for the sole use of the municipality or county in
18 implementing its law enforcement training functions. Not more than
19 seven percent (7%) of the monies shall be used for court and
20 prosecution training. ~~The court clerk of any such municipality or~~
21 ~~county shall furnish to CLEET the report required by subsection D of~~
22 ~~this section.~~

23 ~~F. 1. Any person entering a plea of guilty or nolo contendere~~
24 ~~or is found guilty of the crime of misdemeanor possession of~~

1 ~~marijuana or drug paraphernalia shall be ordered by the court to pay~~
2 ~~a five dollar fee, which shall be in addition to and not in~~
3 ~~substitution for any and all fines and penalties otherwise provided~~
4 ~~for by law for such offense.~~

5 ~~2. The court clerk shall cause to be deposited the amount of~~
6 ~~Five Dollars (\$5.00) as collected, for every adjudicated or~~
7 ~~otherwise convicted person as described in this subsection. The~~
8 ~~court clerk shall remit the monies in the fund on a monthly basis~~
9 ~~directly to the Bureau of Narcotics Drug Education Revolving Fund.~~

10 G. E. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund for
11 the Council on Law Enforcement Education and Training to be
12 designated the "CLEET Fund". The fund shall be subject to
13 legislative appropriation and shall consist of any monies received
14 from fees and receipts collected pursuant to the Oklahoma Open
15 Records Act, reimbursements for parts used in the repair of weapons
16 of law enforcement officers attending the basic academies, gifts,
17 bequests, contributions, tuition, fees, devises and the assessments
18 levied pursuant to the fund pursuant to law.

19 H. F. 1. Any person arrested or convicted of a felony offense
20 or convicted of a misdemeanor offense of assault and battery,
21 domestic abuse, stalking, possession of a controlled substance
22 prohibited under Schedule IV of the Uniform Controlled Dangerous
23 Substances Act, outraging public decency, resisting arrest, escaping
24 or attempting to escape, eluding a police officer, Peeping Tom,

1 pointing a firearm, threatening an act of violence, breaking and
2 entering a dwelling place, destruction of property, negligent
3 homicide or causing a personal injury accident while driving under
4 the influence of any intoxicating substance shall pay a DNA fee of
5 One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00). This fee shall not be
6 collected if the person has a valid DNA sample in the OSBI DNA
7 Offender Database at the time of sentencing.

8 2. The court clerk shall cause to be deposited the amount of
9 One Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$150.00) as collected for every felony
10 arrest, felony conviction or every conviction for a misdemeanor
11 offense of assault and battery, domestic abuse, stalking, possession
12 of a controlled substance prohibited under the Uniform Controlled
13 Dangerous Substances Act, outraging public decency, resisting
14 arrest, escaping or attempting to escape, eluding a police officer,
15 Peeping Tom, pointing a firearm, threatening an act of violence,
16 breaking and entering a dwelling place, destruction of property,
17 negligent homicide or causing a personal injury accident while
18 driving under the influence of any intoxicating substance as
19 described in this subsection. The court clerk shall remit the
20 monies in the fund on a monthly basis directly to the OSBI who shall
21 deposit the monies into the OSBI Revolving Fund provided for in
22 Section 150.19a of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes for services
23 rendered or administered by the OSBI.

24

1 3. The monies from the DNA sample fee deposited into the OSBI
2 Revolving Fund shall be used for creating, staffing and maintaining
3 the OSBI DNA Laboratory and OSBI Combined DNA Index System (CODIS)
4 Database.

5 ~~F.~~ G. It shall be the responsibility of the court clerk to
6 account for and ensure the correctness and accuracy of payments made
7 to the state agencies identified in Sections 1313.2 through 1313.4
8 of this title. Payments made directly to an agency by the court
9 clerk as a result of different types of assessments and fees
10 pursuant to Sections 1313.2 through 1313.4 of this title shall be
11 made monthly to each state agency.

12 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 22 O.S. 2021, Section 988.9, is
13 amended to read as follows:

14 Section 988.9. A. ~~Any offender sentenced to a community~~
15 ~~sentence pursuant to the Oklahoma Community Sentencing Act which~~
16 ~~requires supervision shall be required to pay a supervision fee.~~
17 ~~The supervising agency shall establish the fee amount, not to exceed~~
18 ~~Forty Dollars (\$40.00) per month, based upon the offender's ability~~
19 ~~to pay. In hardship cases the supervising agency may expressly~~
20 ~~waive all or part of the fee. No supervising agency participating~~
21 ~~in a local community sentencing system shall deny any offender~~
22 ~~supervision services for the sole reason that the offender is~~
23 ~~indigent. Fees collected for supervision services performed by the~~
24 ~~Department of Corrections shall be paid directly to the Department~~

1 ~~to be deposited in the Department of Corrections Revolving Fund.~~
2 ~~Supervision services performed by contracted providers other than~~
3 ~~the Department shall be paid directly to that contracted provider.~~

4 ~~B.~~ In addition to any supervision fee, eligible Eligible
5 offenders participating in a local community sentencing system under
6 a court-ordered community punishment shall be required to pay an
7 administrative fee to support the local system which shall not
8 exceed Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per month to be set by the court.
9 Administrative fees when collected shall be deposited with the
10 Community Sentencing Division within the Department of Corrections
11 and credited to the local community sentencing system for support
12 and expansion of the local community corrections system. In the
13 event the court fails to order the amount of the administrative fee,
14 the fee shall be Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per month.

15 ~~C.~~ B. In addition to any ~~supervision fee and~~ administrative fee
16 authorized by this section, the court shall assess court costs, and
17 may assess program reimbursement costs, restitution, and fines to be
18 paid by the offender. With the exception of supervision fees, other
19 fees, costs, fines, restitution, or monetary obligations ordered to
20 be paid by the offender shall not cease with the termination of
21 active supervision and such obligations shall continue until fully
22 paid and may be collected in the same manner as court costs.

23 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 22 O.S. 2021, Section 991c, is
24 amended to read as follows:

1 Section 991c. A. Upon a verdict or plea of guilty or upon a
2 plea of nolo contendere, but before a judgment of guilt, the court
3 may, without entering a judgment of guilt and with the consent of
4 the defendant, defer further proceedings upon the specific
5 conditions prescribed by the court not to exceed a seven-year
6 period, except as authorized under subsection B of this section.
7 The court shall first consider restitution among the various
8 conditions it may prescribe. The court may also consider ordering
9 the defendant to:

10 1. Pay court costs;

11 2. Pay an assessment in lieu of any fine authorized by law for
12 the offense;

13 3. Pay any other assessment or cost authorized by law;

14 4. Engage in a term of community service without compensation,
15 according to a schedule consistent with the employment and family
16 responsibilities of the defendant;

17 5. County jail confinement for a period not to exceed ninety
18 (90) days or the maximum amount of jail time provided for the
19 offense, if it is less than ninety (90) days;

20 6. Pay an amount as reimbursement for reasonable attorney fees,
21 to be paid into the court fund, if a court-appointed attorney has
22 been provided to the defendant;

23 7. Be supervised in the community for a period not to exceed
24 eighteen (18) months, unless a petition alleging violation of any

1 condition of deferred judgment is filed during the period of
2 supervision. ~~As a condition of any supervision, the defendant shall~~
3 ~~be required to pay a supervision fee of Forty Dollars (\$40.00) per~~
4 ~~month. The supervision fee shall be waived in whole or part by the~~
5 ~~supervisory agency when the accused is indigent. Any fees collected~~
6 ~~by the district attorney pursuant to this paragraph shall be~~
7 ~~deposited in the General Revenue Fund of the State Treasury. No~~
8 ~~person shall be denied supervision based solely on the inability of~~
9 ~~the person to pay a fee;~~

10 8. ~~Pay into the court fund a monthly amount not exceeding Forty~~
11 ~~Dollars (\$40.00) per month during any period during which the~~
12 ~~proceedings are deferred when the defendant is not to be supervised~~
13 ~~in the community. The total amount to be paid into the court fund~~
14 ~~shall be established by the court and shall not exceed the amount of~~
15 ~~the maximum fine authorized by law for the offense;~~

16 9. ~~Make other reparations to the community or victim as~~
17 ~~required and deemed appropriate by the court;~~

18 ~~10.~~ 9. Order any conditions which can be imposed for a
19 suspended sentence pursuant to paragraph 1 of subsection A of
20 Section 991a of this title; or

21 ~~11.~~ 10. Any combination of the above provisions.

22 ~~However, unless under the supervision of the district attorney,~~
23 ~~the offender shall be required to pay Forty Dollars (\$40.00) per~~
24 ~~month to the district attorney during the first two (2) years of~~

1 ~~probation to compensate the district attorney for the costs incurred~~
2 ~~during the prosecution of the offender and for the additional work~~
3 ~~of verifying the compliance of the offender with the rules and~~
4 ~~conditions of his or her probation. The district attorney may waive~~
5 ~~any part of this requirement in the best interests of justice. The~~
6 ~~court shall not waive, suspend, defer or dismiss the costs of~~
7 ~~prosecution in its entirety. However, if the court determines that~~
8 ~~a reduction in the fine, costs and costs of prosecution is~~
9 ~~warranted, the court shall equally apply the same percentage~~
10 ~~reduction to the fine, costs and costs of prosecution owed by the~~
11 ~~offender. Any fees collected by the district attorney pursuant to~~
12 ~~this paragraph shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund of the~~
13 ~~State Treasury.~~

14 B. When the court has ordered restitution as a condition of
15 supervision as provided for in subsection A of this section and that
16 condition has not been satisfied, the court may, at any time prior
17 to the termination or expiration of the supervision period, order an
18 extension of supervision for a period not to exceed three (3) years.

19 C. In addition to any conditions of supervision provided for in
20 subsection A of this section, the court shall, in the case of a
21 person before the court for the offense of operating or being in
22 control of a motor vehicle while the person was under the influence
23 of alcohol, other intoxicating substance, or a combination of
24 alcohol and another intoxicating substance, or who is before the

1 court for the offense of operating a motor vehicle while the ability
2 of the person to operate such vehicle was impaired due to the
3 consumption of alcohol, require the person to participate in an
4 alcohol and drug substance abuse evaluation program offered by a
5 facility or qualified practitioner certified by the Department of
6 Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services for the purpose of
7 evaluating the receptivity to treatment and prognosis of the person.
8 The court shall order the person to reimburse the facility or
9 qualified practitioner for the evaluation. The Department of Mental
10 Health and Substance Abuse Services shall establish a fee schedule,
11 based upon the ability of a person to pay, provided the fee for an
12 evaluation shall not exceed Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00). The
13 evaluation shall be conducted at a certified facility, the office of
14 a qualified practitioner or at another location as ordered by the
15 court. The facility or qualified practitioner shall, within
16 seventy-two (72) hours from the time the person is assessed, submit
17 a written report to the court for the purpose of assisting the court
18 in its determination of conditions for deferred sentence. No
19 person, agency or facility operating an alcohol and drug substance
20 abuse evaluation program certified by the Department of Mental
21 Health and Substance Abuse Services shall solicit or refer any
22 person evaluated pursuant to this subsection for any treatment
23 program or alcohol and drug substance abuse service in which the
24 person, agency or facility has a vested interest; however, this

1 provision shall not be construed to prohibit the court from ordering
2 participation in or any person from voluntarily utilizing a
3 treatment program or alcohol and drug substance abuse service
4 offered by such person, agency or facility. Any evaluation report
5 submitted to the court pursuant to this subsection shall be handled
6 in a manner which will keep the report confidential from review by
7 the general public. Nothing contained in this subsection shall be
8 construed to prohibit the court from ordering judgment and sentence
9 in the event the defendant fails or refuses to comply with an order
10 of the court to obtain the evaluation required by this subsection.
11 As used in this subsection, "qualified practitioner" means a person
12 with at least a bachelor's degree in substance abuse treatment,
13 mental health or a related health care field and at least two (2)
14 years of experience in providing alcohol abuse treatment, other drug
15 abuse treatment, or both alcohol and other drug abuse treatment who
16 is certified each year by the Department of Mental Health and
17 Substance Abuse Services to provide these assessments. However, any
18 person who does not meet the requirements for a qualified
19 practitioner as defined herein, but who has been previously
20 certified by the Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse
21 Services to provide alcohol or drug treatment or assessments, shall
22 be considered a qualified practitioner provided all education,
23 experience and certification requirements stated herein are met by

24

1 September 1, 1995. The court may also require the person to
2 participate in one or both of the following:

3 1. An alcohol and drug substance abuse course, pursuant to
4 Sections 3-452 and 3-453 of Title 43A of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

5 2. A victims impact panel program, as defined in subsection H
6 of Section 991a of this title, if such a program is offered in the
7 county where the judgment is rendered. The defendant shall be
8 required to pay a fee of Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) as set by the
9 governing authority of the program and approved by the court to the
10 victims impact panel program to offset the cost of participation by
11 the defendant, if in the opinion of the court the defendant has the
12 ability to pay such fee.

13 D. Upon completion of the conditions of the deferred judgment,
14 and upon a finding by the court that the conditions have been met
15 and all fines, fees, and monetary assessments have been paid as
16 ordered, the defendant shall be discharged without a court judgment
17 of guilt, and the court shall order the verdict or plea of guilty or
18 plea of nolo contendere to be expunged from the record and the
19 charge shall be dismissed with prejudice to any further action. The
20 procedure to expunge the record of the defendant shall be as
21 follows:

22 1. All references to the name of the defendant shall be deleted
23 from the docket sheet;

24

1 2. The public index of the filing of the charge shall be
2 expunged by deletion, mark-out or obliteration;

3 3. Upon expungement, the court clerk shall keep a separate
4 confidential index of case numbers and names of defendants which
5 have been obliterated pursuant to the provisions of this section;

6 4. No information concerning the confidential file shall be
7 revealed or released, except upon written order of a judge of the
8 district court or upon written request by the named defendant to the
9 court clerk for the purpose of updating the criminal history record
10 of the defendant with the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation;
11 and

12 5. Defendants qualifying under Section 18 of this title may
13 petition the court to have the filing of the indictment and the
14 dismissal expunged from the public index and docket sheet. This
15 section shall not be mutually exclusive of Section 18 of this title.

16 Records expunged pursuant to this subsection shall be sealed to
17 the public but not to law enforcement agencies for law enforcement
18 purposes. Records expunged pursuant to this subsection shall be
19 admissible in any subsequent criminal prosecution to prove the
20 existence of a prior conviction or prior deferred judgment without
21 the necessity of a court order requesting the unsealing of such
22 records.

23 E. The provisions of subsection D of this section shall be
24 retroactive.

1 F. Whenever a judgment has been deferred by the court according
2 to the provisions of this section, deferred judgment may not be
3 accelerated for any technical violation unless a petition setting
4 forth the grounds for such acceleration is filed by the district
5 attorney with the clerk of the sentencing court and competent
6 evidence justifying the acceleration of the judgment is presented to
7 the court at a hearing to be held for that purpose. The hearing
8 shall be held not more than twenty (20) days after the entry of the
9 plea of not guilty to the petition, unless waived by both the state
10 and the defendant. Any acceleration of a deferred sentence based on
11 a technical violation shall not exceed ninety (90) days for a first
12 acceleration or five (5) years for a second or subsequent
13 acceleration.

14 G. Upon any violation of the deferred judgment, other than a

16 punishable by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Twenty-five
17 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) and not more than Fifty
18 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00), or

19 b. twenty-eight (28) grams or more of a mixture or
20 substance containing a detectable amount of heroin
21 shall be deemed aggravated trafficking punishable by a
22 fine ~~of~~ not less than Fifty Thousand Dollars
23 (\$50,000.00) and not more than Five Hundred Thousand
24 Dollars (\$500,000.00);

1 4. Amphetamine or methamphetamine:

2 a. twenty (20) grams or more of a mixture or substance
3 containing a detectable amount of amphetamine or
4 methamphetamine shall be punishable by a fine ~~of~~ not
5 less than Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00)
6 and not more than Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
7 (\$200,000.00),

8 b. two hundred (200) grams or more of a mixture or
9 substance containing a detectable amount of
10 amphetamine or methamphetamine shall be punishable by
11 a fine ~~of~~ not less than Fifty Thousand Dollars
12 (\$50,000.00) and not more than Five Hundred Thousand
13 Dollars (\$500,000.00), or

14 c. four hundred fifty (450) grams or more of a mixture or
15 substance containing a detectable amount of
16 amphetamine or methamphetamine shall be deemed
17 aggravated trafficking punishable by a fine ~~of~~ not
18 less than Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) and not
19 more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00);

20 5. Lysergic acid diethylamide (LSD):

21 a. one (1) gram or more of a mixture or substance
22 containing a detectable amount of lysergic acid
23 diethylamide (LSD) shall be trafficking punishable by
24 a term of imprisonment in the custody of the

1 Department of Corrections not to exceed twenty (20)
2 years and by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Fifty Thousand
3 Dollars (\$50,000.00) and not more than One Hundred
4 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), or

- 5 b. ten (10) grams or more of a mixture or substance
6 containing a detectable amount of lysergic acid
7 diethylamide (LSD) shall be aggravated trafficking
8 punishable by a term of imprisonment in the custody of
9 the Department of Corrections ~~of~~ not less than two (2)
10 years nor more than life and by a fine ~~of~~ not less
11 than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) and
12 not more than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars
13 (\$250,000.00);

14 6. Phencyclidine (PCP):

- 15 a. twenty (20) grams or more of a substance containing a
16 mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of
17 phencyclidine (PCP) shall be trafficking punishable by
18 a term of imprisonment in the custody of the
19 Department of Corrections not to exceed twenty (20)
20 years and by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Twenty Thousand
21 Dollars (\$20,000.00) and not more than Fifty Thousand
22 Dollars (\$50,000.00), or
23 b. one hundred fifty (150) grams or more of a substance
24 containing a mixture or substance containing a

1 detectable amount of phencyclidine (PCP) shall be
2 aggravated trafficking punishable by a term of
3 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
4 Corrections ~~of~~ not less than two (2) years nor more
5 than life and by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Fifty
6 Thousand Dollars (\$50,000.00) and not more than Two
7 Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00);

8 7. Methylenedioxy methamphetamine:

- 9 a. thirty (30) tablets or ten (10) grams of a mixture or
10 substance containing a detectable amount of 3,4-
11 Methylenedioxy methamphetamine shall be trafficking
12 punishable by a term of imprisonment in the custody of
13 the Department of Corrections not to exceed twenty
14 (20) years and by a fine ~~of~~ not less than Twenty-five
15 Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) and not more than One
16 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00), or
17 b. one hundred (100) tablets or thirty (30) grams of a
18 mixture or substance containing a detectable amount of
19 3,4-Methylenedioxy methamphetamine shall be deemed
20 aggravated trafficking punishable by a term of
21 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
22 Corrections ~~of~~ not less than two (2) years nor more
23 than life by a fine ~~of~~ not less than One Hundred

3 8. Morphine: One thousand (1,000) grams or more of a mixture

6 Department of Corrections not to exceed twenty (20) years and by a
7 fine ~~of~~ not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) and
8 not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00);

9 9. Oxycodone: Four hundred (400) grams or more of a mixture
10 containing a detectable amount of oxycodone shall be trafficking
11 punishable by a term of imprisonment in the custody of the
12 Department of Corrections not to exceed twenty (20) years and by a
13 fine ~~of~~ not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) and
14 not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00);

15 10. Hydrocodone: Three thousand seven hundred fifty (3,750)
16 grams or more of a mixture containing a detectable amount of
17 hydrocodone shall be trafficking punishable by a term of
18 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections not to
19 exceed twenty (20) years and by a fine ~~of~~ not less than One Hundred
20 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) and not more than Five Hundred
21 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00);

22 11. Benzodiazepine: Five hundred (500) grams or more of a
23 mixture containing a detectable amount of benzodiazepine shall be
24 trafficking punishable by a term of imprisonment not to exceed

1 twenty (20) years and by a fine ~~of~~ not less than One Hundred
2 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) and not more than Five Hundred
3 Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00); and

4 12. Fentanyl and its analogs and derivatives:

5 a. one (1) gram or more of a mixture containing fentanyl
6 or carfentanil, or any fentanyl analogs or derivatives
7 shall be trafficking punishable by a term of
8 imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
9 Corrections not to exceed twenty (20) years and by a
10 fine ~~of~~ not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars
11 (\$100,000.00) and not more than Two Hundred Fifty
12 Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00), or

13 b. five (5) grams or more of a mixture containing
14 fentanyl or carfentanil, or any fentanyl analogs or
15 derivatives shall be aggravated trafficking punishable
16 by a term of imprisonment in the custody of the
17 Department of Corrections ~~of~~ not less than two (2)
18 years nor more than life and by a fine ~~of~~ not less
19 than Two Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$250,000.00)
20 and not more than Five Hundred Thousand Dollars
21 (\$500,000.00).

22 D. Any person who violates the provisions of this section with
23 respect to marijuana, cocaine, coca leaves, cocaine base, heroin,
24 amphetamine or methamphetamine in a quantity specified in paragraphs

1 1, 2, 3 and 4 of subsection C of this section shall, in addition to
2 any fines specified by this section, be punishable by a term of
3 imprisonment as follows:

4 1. For trafficking, a first violation of this section, a term
5 of imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections not
6 to exceed twenty (20) years;

7 2. For trafficking, a second violation of this section, a term
8 of imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections ~~of~~
9 not less than four (4) years nor more than life, for which the
10 person shall serve fifty percent (50%) of the sentence before being
11 eligible for parole consideration;

12 3. For trafficking, a third or subsequent violation of this
13 section, a term of imprisonment in the custody of the Department of
14 Corrections ~~of~~ not less than twenty (20) years nor more than life,
15 of which the person shall serve fifty percent (50%) of the sentence
16 before being eligible for parole consideration.

17 Persons convicted of trafficking shall not be eligible for
18 earned credits or any other type of credits which have the effect of
19 reducing the length of sentence to less than fifty percent (50%) of
20 the sentence imposed; ~~and~~ .

21 If the person is convicted of aggravated trafficking, the person
22 shall serve eighty-five percent (85%) of such sentence before being
23 eligible for parole consideration.

1 E. The penalties specified in subsections C and D of this
2 section are subject to the enhancements enumerated in subsections E
3 and F of Section 2-401 of this title.

4 ~~F. Any person convicted of any offense described in this~~
5 ~~section shall, in addition to any fine imposed, pay a special~~
6 ~~assessment trauma care fee of One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) to be~~
7 ~~deposited into the Trauma Care Assistance Revolving Fund created in~~
