NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 14 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1908.2 of Title 63, unless 15 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 16 For the purpose of modernizing and improving the licensure and 17 regulatory system for intermediate care facilities for individuals 18 with intellectual disabilities (ICFs/IID), on or before the 19 effective date of this act, the State Commissioner of Health shall 20 update rules governing ICFs/IID including, but not limited to, rules 21 pertaining to direct care staffing ratios and direct care staff 22 training and qualifications. Such rules shall consider the 23

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standards provided by federal regulation, shall take into account

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    the unique setting of ICFs/IID and the needs of residents served,
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    and may alter requirements or standards based on factors determined
    by the Commissioner including, but not limited to, size of a
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    facility or acuity of the residents. In promulgating such rules,
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    the Commissioner shall consider input from stakeholders including,
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    but not limited to, associations representing long-term care
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    facilities, staff, or residents.
        SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
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
