8 An Act relating to long-term care; directing the  
9 State Commissioner of Health to update certain rules;  
10 stipulating certain criteria for rules; requiring the  
11 Commissioner to consider certain input; providing for  
12 codification; and providing an effective date.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

14 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
15 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1908.2 of Title 63, unless  
16 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

17 For the purpose of modernizing and improving the licensure and  
18 regulatory system for intermediate care facilities for individuals  
19 with intellectual disabilities (ICFs/IID), on or before the  
20 effective date of this act, the State Commissioner of Health shall  
21 update rules governing ICFs/IID including, but not limited to, rules  
22 pertaining to direct care staffing ratios and direct care staff  
23 training and qualifications. Such rules shall consider the  
24 standards provided by federal regulation, shall take into account

1 the unique setting of ICFs/IID and the needs of residents served,  
2 and may alter requirements or standards based on factors determined  
3 by the Commissioner including, but not limited to, size of a  
4 facility or acuity of the residents. In promulgating such rules,  
5 the Commissioner shall consider input from stakeholders including,  
6 but not limited to, associations representing long-term care  
7 facilities, staff, or residents.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.

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
