| 8 | An Act relating to state government; providing enforcement for occupying a reserved space or failing |
| 9 | to pay entrance fees; setting administrative penalties; providing that monies collected shall be |
| 10 | deposited in a revolving fund; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 2220, which relates to the Oklahoma Tourism, |
| 11 | Parks and Recreation Enhancement Act; modifying language; establishing annual state park parking |
| 12 | passes; setting annual park parking pass fees for residents and nonresidents; authorizing annual multi- |
| 13 | park parking passes; providing for codification; providing effective dates; and declaring an |
| 14 | emergency. |
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| 17 | BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: |
| 18 | SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified |
| 19 | in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2217.2 of Title 74, unless there |
| 20 | is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: |
| 21 | A. No person shall: |
| 22 | 1. Physically occupy a campsite identified as "Reserved" by the |
| 23 | Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department staff or by the park |
| 24 | reservation system, or fail to vacate a campsite within a reasonable |

1 time after being notified of the campsite's reserved status by
2 Department staff; or

2. Enter an area of a state park that is identified as an area 4 requiring payment of an entry fee without having first paid the 5 entry fee or being a valid park entry passholder for the date of 6 entry.

7 B. Any violation of the provisions of this section may be
8 punishable by an administrative fine not exceeding:

9 1. Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for a first offense;
10 2. One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for a second offense; and
11 3. Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) for any third or
12 subsequent offense.

C. All monies collected pursuant to this section shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department Revolving Fund.

16 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 2220, is
17 amended to read as follows:

Section 2220. A. The <u>Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation</u>
Commission may prescribe and collect reasonable rates and fees
pursuant to the provisions of this section for the services,
facilities and commodities rendered by all property of the
Commission.

23 1. The Commission may establish maximum rates for rooms at the 24 state lodges and cabins, for recreational activities, for

1 recreational vehicles and camping sites, and for community facilities under control of the Commission. The method whereby the 2 rates are determined shall be promulgated pursuant to Article I of 3 4 the Administrative Procedures Act. At least twenty (20) days prior 5 to the adoption or approval of any rate changes by the Commission, the Department shall submit a copy of the proposed rates, for 6 7 informational purposes, to the Governor, Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma 8 9 State Senate. Any change in the rates during the year when the Legislature is not in session shall be reported in writing to the 10 11 Governor, Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and 12 President Pro Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate within five (5) 13 business days of such Commission action.

14 The Commission may establish maximum charges for all 2. 15 activities at state-owned golf courses. The charges may vary among 16 the different golf courses according to the practices of the golf 17 industry. The method whereby the maximum charges are determined 18 shall be in accordance with rules promulgated pursuant to Article I 19 of the Administrative Procedures Act. At least twenty (20) days 20 prior to the adoption or approval of any rate changes by the 21 Commission, the Department shall submit a copy of such proposed 22 charges, for informational purposes, to the Governor, Speaker of the 23 Oklahoma House of Representatives and President Pro Tempore of the 24 Oklahoma State Senate.

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1 3. The Commission may establish entrance or day-use charges for 2 the state park system. All monies collected from entrance or dayuse charges shall be used at the state parks where the charges were 3 4 collected. The Commission may establish an annual pass, or other 5 varied various parking passes as appropriate to that park_{τ} for 6 visitors. The method whereby the maximum charges are determined, 7 sold, and collected shall be in accordance with rules promulgated pursuant to Article I of the Administrative Procedures Act. At 8 9 least twenty (20) days prior to the adoption or approval of any rate 10 changes by the Commission, the Department shall submit a copy of 11 such proposed charges, for informational purposes, to the Governor, Speaker of the Oklahoma House of Representatives and President Pro 12 13 Tempore of the Oklahoma State Senate.

4. Fees Except as provided in this section, fees shall be
promulgated pursuant to Article I of the Administrative Procedures
Act.

17 5. Fees Except as provided in this section, fees may reflect 18 the seasonal usage of the parks and facilities and for promotional 19 purposes and goals.

<u>6. The Commission shall establish an annual single park parking</u>
 <u>pass for residents of this state in an amount not to exceed Twenty</u>
 <u>Dollars (\$20.00); provided, however, residents of this state sixty-</u>
 <u>two (62) years of age and over shall be exempt as provided in</u>
 subsection B of this section. A nonresident annual single park

parking pass shall be established in an amount not less than
Seventy-five Dollars (\$75.00) and there shall be no exemption for
nonresidents sixty-two (62) years of age and over. The Commission
may establish annual multi-park parking passes in such amounts for
residents of this state and nonresidents as determined by the
Commission.

B. All fees, licenses and other charges shall be posted in a
convenient place in each park. Every person using any of the
facilities in a park shall be charged the same fees, licenses and
every other charge except:

11 1. Residents of this state sixty-two (62) years of age and over 12 and their spouses shall not be charged any admission fees for entrance into any state-owned and operated state-operated park. 13 The 14 Commission may promulgate rules establishing different fees for 15 residents and nonresidents sixty-two (62) years of age and over. 16 Identification may For purposes of fee exemptions, identification 17 shall be established by presentation of proof of age_{τ} and residency 18 by a state driver license, a state license for identification only, 19 birth certificate or any other form of identification authorized by 20 the Commission;

21 2. Individuals who have been certified as totally disabled 22 under state or federal law and their spouses shall be entitled to a 23 fifty percent (50%) reduction of fees which apply to recreational-24 use facilities;

3. Children's groups, volunteer groups as specified by the
 Commission, or governmental entities that provide beneficial
 services at the facility for which the fee may be have fees reduced
 or waived as determined by the Commission; and
 4. Special discount rates as authorized in this section may be
 waived for individuals who are members of a group being provided a
 special group rate as allowed by law.

8 C. The <u>willful</u> failure to collect such fees, licenses and other 9 charges shall subject an <u>the responsible</u> employee of the Commission 10 to a <u>an administrative</u> fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each 11 and every violation.

SECTION 3. Section 1 of this act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

SECTION 4. Section 2 of this act shall become effective July 1, 2024.

16 SECTION 5. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 17 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 18 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 19 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
