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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 447 of Title 21, unless there is
18	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
19	A. Any person who:
20	1. Upon reasonable suspicion, is detained by law enforcement;
21	or
22	2. Is apprehended and arrested for violating a criminal law of
23	this state,
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- and after determining the citizenship status of the person is found to be unlawfully present in the United States, shall be guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the custody of the Department of Corrections for a term of not less than five (5) years.
  - B. A person arrested for a violation of this section may be allowed to post a cash bail in an amount of not less than One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00).
  - C. In lieu of the sentence of imprisonment, the court shall have the authority to dismiss the criminal prosecution and issue a written order discharging the person and requiring said individual to return to his or her country of origin if:
    - 1. The person agrees to the written order;
  - 2. The person has not previously been convicted of a violent crime, as provided for in Section 571 of Title 57 of the Oklahoma Statutes, in this state or another state; and
  - 3. The person is not charged with another felony offense.

    Upon issuance of the written order, the court shall direct the law enforcement agency having custody of the person to remand the person to the custody of the Department of Corrections with instructions to return the person to his or her country of origin.
  - D. Once the Department receives custody of the person, the Department shall notify the United States Customs and Border Protection of the Department of Homeland Security to arrange

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transportation for the repatriation of said person back to his or her country of origin. SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval. 02/28/24 59-2-10583 GRS
