NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5090 of Title 74, unless there 13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 14 This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Creating 15 Oklahoma's Modern Plan for Economic Transformation and Effectiveness 16 (COMPETE) Act". 17 SECTION 2. 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.2, is 18 AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 19 Section 5003.2. A. Recognizing the geographic diversity of 20 this state, Oklahoma needs one central, primary public-sector 21 economic development agency for the state in order to manage or 22 coordinate all public sector economic development activity. 23 24

4	governmental function for matters of public necessity for which
5	public monies may be spent and property acquired. EDGE shall have
6	duties pertaining to the economic development of the state
7	including, but not limited to:
8	1. Being empowered to strategically drive opportunities for
9	economic growth and diversification across the state;
10	2. Collaborating with local, regional, and state entities;
11	3. Coordinating the funding and investment activities of each
12	element of the state's economic development efforts and marketing
13	campaigns to achieve better results for the state's recruitment and
14	retention of businesses; and
15	4. Acting as the principal point of contact regarding
16	investment in this state for public officials, businesses, and the
17	public.
18	D. The Division on Community Outreach and Revitalization
19	Enterprise (CORE).
20	The purpose of CORE shall be to focus on the long-term
21	development of local communities to increase competitiveness and
22	enhance economic opportunities. CORE shall have duties pertaining
23	to local economic opportunities and community development including,
24	but not limited to:

1	1. Creating new and higher-quality jobs for the people of the
2	state through long-term development of local communities;
3	2. Maintaining communication of information between the
4	Department and communities through regional organization and
5	representation;
6	3. Carrying out policy development and research in support of
7	the long-term competitiveness of this state;
8	4. Providing technical assistance to local communities in
9	securing federal funding, incentive availability, and community
10	development;
11	5. Providing assistance and funding in development of potential
12	sites for economic development;
13	6. Coordinating with other state agencies deploying federal and
14	state funds for infrastructure development including, but not
15	limited to, the Department of Transportation, the Oklahoma Water
16	Resources Board, and the Oklahoma Broadband Office; and
17	7. Assisting in compliance with the laws and regulations of
18	economic incentives and economic development initiatives.
19	E. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce is hereby constituted an
20	agency of state government.
21	$\frac{C}{C}$ <u>F.</u> Whenever the terms "Department of Economic Development"
22	or "Department of Economic and Community Affairs" appear in the
23	Oklahoma Statutes they shall mean and refer to the Oklahoma
24	Department of Commerce.

3 Section 5003.4. As used in the Oklahoma Department of Commerce 4 Act:

5 1. "Department" means the Oklahoma Department of Commerce;
6 2. "Director" means the director of the Department of Commerce
7 "Chief Executive Officer" means the Chief Executive Officer of the
8 Oklahoma Department of Commerce;

9 3. "Enterprise" means a firm with its principal place of10 business in Oklahoma;

"Economic Information System" means a comprehensive 11 4. statewide data collection, analysis and distribution system which 12 13 makes available current and thorough information on Oklahoma economic trends and future Oklahoma economic opportunities to 14 communities, firms, farms and individuals in the state; firms and 15 individuals outside the state considering location in Oklahoma; and 16 17 Oklahoma Futures, the Governor, the Legislature and all other state agencies and institutions; and 18

19 5. "Economic Innovation System" means a decentralized statewide 20 system that responsively and innovatively coordinates technical 21 assistance, grant and loan programs with local, state, federal and 22 private sector activities into a single statewide Economic 23 Innovation System.

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 SECTION 4.
 AMENDATORY
 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.5, as

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 amended by Section 25, Chapter 243, O.S.L. 2022 (74 O.S. Supp. 2023,

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 Section 5003.5), is amended to read as follows:

Section 5003.5. A. The <del>Director</del> Chief Executive Officer of the 4 5 Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of the Senate. The Director Chief 6 Executive Officer shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor and 7 shall continue to serve until a successor is duly appointed and 8 9 qualified. The salary of the Director Chief Executive Officer shall 10 be set by law compensated in a manner that compares equally to 11 similar positions in the private sector.

B. The Director Chief Executive Officer shall be qualified for
such position by character, personality, ability, education,
training and successful administrative experience in the public or
private sector. The Chief Executive Officer shall have experience
that includes, but is not limited to:

- 17 <u>1. Economic development program leadership;</u>
- 18 <u>2. Business development leadership;</u>
- 19 3. Senior-level board management and leadership;
- 20 4. Senior-level business and political engagement;
- 21 <u>5. Leading business development or business recruitment teams;</u>
- 22 <u>6. Creating and implementing sector development strategies;</u>
- 23 7. Branding and marketing leadership experience; and
- 24 8. Experience in recruiting companies to a state or community.

1 C. The Director Chief Executive Officer shall employ such persons as are necessary to implement the powers and duties of the 2 Department. Because many of the powers and duties of the Department 3 involve working closely with the private sector, certain employee 4 5 positions of the Department shall be employed and compensated in a manner that compares equally to similar positions in the private 6 sector and shall be exempt from the provisions of the Civil Service 7 and Human Capital Modernization Act. All other employees and 8 9 positions shall be subject to the provisions of the Civil Service and Human Capital Modernization Act. Provided, nothing in this 10 section shall be construed to limit the authority of the Legislature 11 to specify the status of positions otherwise by law. Neither shall 12 the Director Chief Executive Officer have the authority to 13 circumvent, disregard or otherwise disobey specific provisions of 14 law regarding positions in the Department. 15 The Director Chief Executive Officer shall serve on the 16 D. board of: 17 The Oklahoma Industrial Finance Authority; 18 1. 2. The Oklahoma Science and Technology Research and Development 19 Board; 20 3. The Oklahoma Development Finance Authority; 21

- 22 4. The Executive Bond Oversight Commission; and
- 23 5. 3. The Oklahoma Ordnance Works Authority.
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E. The Director Chief Executive Officer may serve as administrator of any interlocal agreement or compact to pursue economic development and to assign any employees of the Department or employee personnel to carry out duties or obligations pursuant to any interlocal agreement or compact for economic development.

F. The Director Chief Executive Officer, at his or her
discretion, may approve payment for affiliations or memberships of
the Department or, if necessary, associate memberships for
individual employees in international, national, or state economic
development councils, professional organizations, or governmental
associations.

12 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.7, is 13 amended to read as follows:

Section 5003.7. A. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall prepare, with the cooperation of the Oklahoma business community, agricultural community, financial community, universities, labor and, the state executive and legislative branches, <u>and the Oklahoma</u> <u>Workforce Commission</u>, a five-year economic development plan and annual updates for the State of Oklahoma this state.

The purpose of the plan shall be to identify significant
 economic, social, and demographic trends which may have both short term and long-term impacts on the state and local economy and to
 present strategies and recommendations that the state and local

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political subdivisions might adopt to improve or stabilize the
 economy.

2. The goals of the plan shall include the development of a
diversified state economy, increasing; the increase of employment;
the maximum use of federal, state and local funds to achieve the
goals or recommendations included in the plan; the maximum
investment of capital in the economy of the state; and the
improvement of the quality of life in the state.

9 3. The plan wherever possible shall make recommendations to
10 encourage intergovernmental cooperation and public and private
11 cooperation.

The plan shall include an economic development strategy for
 the state that addresses target industries, site development, and
 workforce needs to meet the state goals.

5. Copies of the plan and the annual updates shall be submitted 15 electronically to the Oklahoma Advisory Committee on 16 17 Intergovernmental Relations, the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the 18 chairmen of the standing committees on economic development of the 19 20 Senate and of the House of Representatives members of the Legislative Evaluation and Development Committee, as created in 21 Section 8 of this act, and be made available to the public on the 22 Department's website on the first day of each legislative session. 23

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5. <u>6.</u> The Department shall develop and manage a complete economic information system which will support the five-year planning process, and which will make available complete and timely information on the state economy. The economic information system shall be operated by public or private Oklahoma universities or an Oklahoma enterprise capable of providing such services in a costeffective manner.

B. <u>The Chief Executive Officer of the Oklahoma Department of</u>
<u>Commerce shall present the strategic plan to the Legislative</u>
<u>Evaluation and Development Committee, as created in Section 8 of</u>
this act, for approval.

12 C. The Department, in conjunction with the Oklahoma Development Finance Authority, is authorized to develop an infrastructure 13 program which will enable political subdivisions of this state to 14 finance public works projects in order to modify or improve existing 15 public facilities for purposes of bringing said such facilities, and 16 the operation thereof, into compliance with and maintaining 17 compliance with federal, state and local laws and regulations 18 pertaining to the protection of the public health and the 19 environment. 20

21 C. D. The Director Chief Executive Officer shall develop an 22 annual business plan for the Department. The business plan shall 23 include the need and mission of each division of the Department 24 created by law or the Director Chief Executive Officer and an

1 analysis of past costs and benefits and future projected costs and 2 benefits to the state of the programs of each division of the Department. The business plan shall be consistent with the goals of 3 the recurring five-year plan specified in this section. 4 The 5 Director Chief Executive Officer shall distribute copies of the business plan by such means that will make it widely available to 6 communities, firms and local economic development managers 7 throughout this state. 8

9 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.10, is 10 amended to read as follows:

Section 5003.10. The Oklahoma Department of Commerce shall have the authority to:

Disseminate information concerning the industrial,
 commercial, governmental, educational, cultural, agricultural,
 business and other advantages and attractions of the state;

Assist public and private agencies in the preparation of
 informational and publicity programs designed to attract or retain
 business and industry for the state;

Obligate and expend funds for services performed by local
 political subdivisions of the state, state agencies, including
 universities and colleges within and without the state, and federal
 agencies for research and training in conformity with the general
 state laws governing such activity; and apply for, accept,

administer and expend grants from the federal government and any
 other public or private sources for research and training purposes;

4. Conduct, publish and disseminate or encourage research
designed to further new and more extensive uses of the natural and
other resources of the state and designed to develop and
commercialize new products and commercial processes;

5. Study trends and developments in the industries of the state
and analyze the reasons underlying such trends; study costs within
the state; and make recommendations regarding circumstances
promoting or hampering business and industrial development;

6. Generally gather, compile and make available economic 11 12 analyses and statistical information relating to business, trade, commerce, industry, transportation, communication, natural 13 resources, population and other like subjects in this state, with 14 authority to call upon other agencies, universities and colleges of 15 the state for statistical data and results obtained by them, and to 16 arrange and compile such economic analyses and statistical 17 information in such a manner as it deems advisable; 18

19 7. Study such other scientific, industrial, financial and 20 economic issues as, in the judgment of the Department, shall be 21 deemed of value to the people of the state;

8. Support and assist the efforts of state, regional and local
development organizations, industrial committees, chambers of
commerce, agricultural organizations, labor organizations and other

similar public and private agencies to obtain new and to foster expansion of existing service, industrial and manufacturing facilities, businesses and enterprises; and to foster community improvements in leadership, expertise, human development, infrastructure, public facilities and quality of life; and to expand data availability and utilization opportunities;

9. Maintain a continuing evaluation of the sources available
for the financing of the development or expansion of industrial,
agricultural and commercial facilities in this state through both
public and private agencies;

11 10. Assist in obtaining financing for the development and 12 expansion of industrial, agricultural and commercial facilities in 13 the state;

Serve as the state's official liaison agency between 11. 14 persons interested in locating new economic enterprises in Oklahoma 15 and state and local groups seeking new enterprises. 16 In this respect, the Department shall aid communities in organizing for and 17 obtaining new businesses and expanding existing businesses and shall 18 process requests which reflect interest in locating economic 19 enterprises in the state; 20

21 12. Promote the sale and facilitate the marketing of Oklahoma 22 products including agricultural and value-added products in the 23 international market;

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1 13. Encourage the location of foreign manufacturing plants and
 2 other industries in Oklahoma;

3 14. Coordinate the international efforts of the various state 4 agencies without violating the individual authority given those 5 agencies by statute;

6 15. Coordinate and serve as liaison to the private sector as 7 needed;

16. Establish, subject to an annual appropriation or private 8 9 gifts, offices outside the state boundaries. The offices may be 10 operated by the state or may be operated pursuant to contract which shall not be subject to the competitive bid laws of the State of 11 12 Oklahoma. The Department shall prepare an annual report concerning 13 the activities of the offices and submit it to the Governor and the Legislature. The Director Chief Executive Officer of the Oklahoma 14 Department of Commerce shall notify in writing the Governor, the 15 President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of 16 17 Representatives that the Department intends to establish a new office pursuant to this paragraph at least thirty (30) days prior to 18 the establishment of the new office or execution of a contract; 19

20 17. Establish a system of not less than six geographic regions 21 for promoting new or existing businesses, assisting in the expansion 22 of small and medium sized manufacturers through a modernization 23 program, creating new jobs, and assisting local businesses,

1 political subdivisions or other entities to better utilize the 2 services of the Department;

Solicit, accept and expend donations and contributions from 3 18. any source, whether public or private, in order to advertise, 4 5 promote or disseminate information which may assist in the recruitment of companies, firms or jobs to Oklahoma, including but 6 not limited to the Oklahoma Quality Jobs Program Act, and any other 7 acts which the Department administers or which may assist the 8 9 Department in the performance of its mission. The Department shall 10 deposit any funds collected pursuant to this paragraph in the "Oklahoma Department of Commerce Revolving Fund" created by Section 11 5012 of this title; and 12

Enter into contracts at fair market value for the rental of 14 office space in any facility under its control to entities engaged 15 in activities related to the export of goods produced in Oklahoma. 16 The Department shall deposit any funds collected pursuant to this 17 paragraph in the "Oklahoma Department of Commerce Revolving Fund" 18 created by Section 5012 of this title.

19SECTION 7.AMENDATORY74 O.S. 2021, Section 5003.10a, is20amended to read as follows:

21 Section 5003.10a. An office established by the Oklahoma 22 Department of Commerce outside the State of Oklahoma pursuant to 23 paragraph 16 of Section 5003.10 of this title shall not be 24 terminated until the <del>Director</del> Chief Executive Officer of the

1 Oklahoma Department of Commerce provides a written report to the Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and the 2 President Pro Tempore of the Senate of the intent of the Director 3 Chief Executive Officer to terminate the office. Termination of the 4 5 office pursuant to this section shall not occur earlier than sixty (60) days following the date the report is filed as provided in this 6 section. For purposes of this section, "termination" means a 7 reduction in funding for an office or a change in representation. 8 9 SECTION 8. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

10 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 5090.1 of Title 74, unless there 11 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

12 Α. There is hereby created within the Legislature the Legislative Evaluation and Development Committee. The Legislative 13 Evaluation and Development Committee shall review financing for 14 individual incentive packages including, but not limited to, 15 packages offering tax incentives, funds for economic development, 16 17 and, when the annual investment exceeds Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00), excluding funding from existing incentives for any 18 business, new or existing currently in this state, or when one or 19 more of the incentives in the incentive package is not authorized 20 under current law or an amendment by the Legislature is being sought 21 to one or more currently existing incentives included in the 22 incentive package. In addition to the required review of certain 23 incentive packages as prescribed by this section, the Committee may, 24

in its discretion, also review potential economic development
 projects presented by private sector businesses or state or other
 political subdivision authorities which would be financed by public
 funds.

B. The Legislative Evaluation and Development Committee shall
evaluate and propose economic projects provided by the Division on
Economic Development, Growth, and Expansion within the Oklahoma
Department of Commerce. The Committee shall consist of:

9 1. Four members of the Senate to be appointed by the President
10 Pro Tempore of the Senate, one of whom shall be from the minority
11 party; and

12 2. Four members of the House of the Representatives to be 13 appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, one of 14 whom shall be from the minority party.

The President Pro Tempore of the Senate, or his or her designee, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives, or his or her designee, shall serve as co-chairs for the Committee.

C. The quorum of the Committee shall consist of at least five members. Meetings of the Committee shall be governed by joint rules of the Legislature. Members of the Committee may receive reimbursement from the Legislative Service Bureau for actual and necessary expenses incurred in connection with their duties as members of the Committee in accordance with other provisions of law relating to travel reimbursement for members of the Legislature.

2	agreements and adhere to the confidentiality of the material

5	SECTION 9. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
7	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
