1 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4102, which relates to responsibilities of certain commission; extending sunset termination date; stating purpose of certain 2 commission; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4103, which relates to certain membership; modifying 3 membership; establishing meeting requirements; providing that certain State Capitol Preservation 4 Commission functions are additional functions of 5 certain members; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4104, which relates to powers and responsibilities of the State Capitol Preservation Commission; modifying and 6 adding certain powers and responsibilities; transferring certain oversight responsibilities; 7 amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4105, which relates to Capitol Architect and Curator duties; modifying 8 certain duties of the Capitol Architect and Curator; 9 providing duties of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, the Oklahoma Arts Council, the 10 Department of Public Safety, and the Department of Transportation with respect to the Oklahoma State 11 Capitol; directing the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to employ all necessary staff and 12 consultants; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4108, which relates to application of act; expanding 13 applicability of certain law; directing the Oklahoma Arts Council to be responsible for certain art; 14 authorizing certain events; providing procedures for receiving funds; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4109, 15 which relates to exemptions from the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974; adding certain 16 project exemptions; repealing 74 O.S. 2021, Sections 4106 and 4107, which relate to cooperation between 17 State Capitol Preservation Commission and branches of state government and compliance with certain 18 administrative requirements; making language gender neutral; providing for codification; and declaring an 19 emergency. 20 21 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 22 SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104.18, is 23 24 amended to read as follows:

Section 1104.18. A. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee
 authorized by Section 1135.5 of this title for the Oklahoma State
 Capitol Restoration License Plate shall be deposited in the Oklahoma
 Friends of the Capitol License Plate Revolving Fund created in
 subsection B of this section.

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving 6 Β. fund for the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to be 7 designated the "Oklahoma Friends of the Capitol License Plate 8 9 Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received 10 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services pursuant to the 11 provisions of subsection A of this section. All monies accruing to 12 13 the credit of the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be budgeted and expended by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for 14 restoration and modification of the Oklahoma State Capitol. Before 15 the Office makes any expenditure from the fund, the expenditure 16 17 shall be approved by the State Capitol Preservation Commission created pursuant to Section 4102 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma 18 Statutes. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants 19 issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by 20 law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 21 Services for approval and payment. 22

23 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 15.4, is 24 amended to read as follows:

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Section 15.4. A. There is hereby authorized the creation of a not-for-profit corporation to be known as "Friends of the Capitol" to raise funds and to assist in the preservation and enhancement of the Oklahoma <u>State</u> Capitol and surrounding areas grounds as defined in Section 1 of this title 7 of this act.

B. The board of directors of the corporation authorized insubsection A of this section shall choose its own chairperson.

C. After proper incorporation, the not-for-profit corporation
9 is authorized and directed to apply for tax-exempt status under
10 Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (26 U.S.C., Section
11 501(c)(3)).

D. In addition to funds received from the general public or other public and private sources, the not-for-profit corporation may receive funds from state agencies at such times and in such amounts as may be appropriated by the Legislature for the Oklahoma <u>State</u> Capitol or made available to the corporation from state agencies from their sources of revenue.

E. Costs to underwrite activities related to the preservation and enhancement of the Oklahoma <u>State</u> Capitol may be borne from revenues of the not-for-profit corporation.

F. Upon the incorporation, the not-for-profit corporation shall be authorized to hire staff and name advisory groups or steering committees as necessary to assist in the preservation and enhancement of the Oklahoma <u>State</u> Capitol.

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G. The corporation shall coordinate preservation and,
 <u>restoration</u>, enhancement, <u>maintenance</u>, and <u>modification</u> projects in
 conjunction with and the <u>consent approval</u> of the <u>State</u> Capitol
 Preservation Commission and the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services.

6 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 83.1, as 7 amended by Section 1, Chapter 91, O.S.L. 2022 (73 O.S. Supp. 2022, 8 Section 83.1), is amended to read as follows:

9 Section 83.1. A. There is hereby re-created to continue until
10 July 1, 2025 2026, in accordance with the Oklahoma Sunset Law, a
11 Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission to exercise
12 the functions and perform the duties hereinafter prescribed.

B. The Commission shall be composed of eleven (11) members as follows:

The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services or his or her designee, who shall be ex officio chair of
 the Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning Commission;

The Director of the Transportation Commission or his or her
 designee;

The President of the University of Oklahoma or his or her
 designee;

4. Two members appointed by the President Pro Tempore of theSenate;

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5. Two members appointed by the Speaker of the House of
 Representatives;

3 6. The Chair of the Planning Commission of Oklahoma City or his4 or her designee;

5 7. The Chair of the Long-Range Capital Planning Commission
6 Capitol Liaison or his or her designee; and

8. Two members of the Commission appointed by the Governor,
with the advice and consent of the State Senate, for four-year
staggered terms with one term expiring on January 31 of each evennumbered year.

11 C. The Commission is authorized to appoint and hire a Director, 12 who shall serve as the chief administrative officer of the 13 Commission, and other necessary personnel. The Attorney General of 14 the State of Oklahoma this state shall be the legal advisor to the 15 Commission in the same capacity as he or she is to other boards and 16 commissions.

D. At least one of the members <u>One member</u> appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and <u>one member appointed by</u> the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be a resident within the boundaries of the Capitol-Medical Center Improvement and Zoning District as set forth in Section 83 of this title.

22 SECTION 4. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 93 of Title 73, unless there is 24 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

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The Department of Public Safety shall create a security plan for the Oklahoma State Capitol and Oklahoma State Capitol grounds and the Governor's Mansion. The plan shall be submitted to the State Capitol Preservation Commission for review and approval. A new plan shall be submitted every three (3) years.

The department shall coordinate with the Office of Management
and Enterprise Services to implement and staff the approved security
plan.

9 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 176, is 10 amended to read as follows:

Section 176. A. There shall be established created within the 11 12 Legislative Service Bureau the position of a permanent legislative liaison Capitol Liaison committee, composed of three (3) members 13 from each house, appointed by the President Pro Tempore and Speaker, 14 respectively to the State Capitol Preservation Commission. 15 The legislative liaison Capitol Liaison committee will shall keep the 16 17 Legislature properly advised as to the activities of the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management and 18 Enterprise Services by making such reports as they deem the Capitol 19 Liaison deems necessary to the appropriate committees and leadership 20 of both houses. All legislative studies concerning the 21 responsibilities or activities of the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement 22 Authority or the Office of Management and Enterprise Services and 23 all studies of activities or projects relating to the Oklahoma State 24

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1 Capitol Complex shall be considered by presented to the liaison 2 committee created Capitol Liaison authorized by this section. The Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management 3 and Enterprise Services shall notify the membership of the 4 5 legislative liaison Capitol Liaison committee in advance of any meeting in which official or formal action is to be taken by 6 furnishing the proposed agenda in writing at least twenty-four (24) 7 hours in advance of such meeting. 8

9 B. The Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of
10 Management and Enterprise Services shall provide such information,
11 records, testimony, or recommendations as the committee Capitol
12 Liaison may require.

<u>C. The Capitol Liaison responsibilities shall include serving</u>
 <u>as the primary contact for Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)</u>
 compliance for the Oklahoma State Capitol.

D. All proposals for enhancement, modification, preservation,
 or restoration of the Oklahoma State Capitol and Oklahoma State
 Capitol grounds, and the Governor's Mansion and grounds, shall be
 submitted to the Liaison. The Liaison shall submit all proposals to
 the State Capitol Preservation Commission for approval.
 E. All proposals for space allocation in the Oklahoma State

22 Capitol and parking allocation shall be submitted to the Liaison.

23 The Liaison shall submit all proposals to the State Capitol

24 Preservation Commission for approval.

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<u>F. All proposals for security modifications and enhancements by</u>
 <u>agencies, the Senate, or the House of Representatives shall be</u>
 <u>submitted to the Liaison. The Liaison shall submit all proposals to</u>
 <u>the State Capitol Preservation Commission for approval.</u>

5 <u>G. The Capitol Liaison shall be the primary liaison for all</u> 6 <u>tenants that occupy space in the Oklahoma State Capitol.</u>

7 SECTION 6. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 345, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 345. A. In addition to any other authorization 10 provided by law, the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority is authorized to issue obligations to acquire real property, together 11 with improvements located thereon, and personal property to 12 construct improvements to real property and to provide funding for 13 repairs, refurbishments and improvements to real and personal 14 property of the Oklahoma State Capitol Building in a total amount 15 not to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00). 16 The funds shall be used for the renovation, repair and remodeling of 17 the Oklahoma State Capitol Building. 18

B. The Authority may hold title to the property and improvements until such time as any obligations issued for this purpose are retired or defeased and may lease the property and improvements to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
Upon final redemption or defeasance of the obligations created pursuant to this section, title to the property and improvements

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shall be transferred from the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority
 to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

C. For the purposes of paying the costs for construction of the 3 real property and improvements, and providing funding for the 4 5 project authorized in subsection A of this section, and for the purpose authorized in subsection D of this section, the Authority is 6 hereby authorized to borrow monies on the credit of the income and 7 revenues to be derived from the leasing of such property and 8 9 improvements and, in anticipation of the collection of such income 10 and revenues, to issue negotiable obligations in a total amount not to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) 11 12 whether issued in one or more series. The Authority is authorized 13 to capitalize interest on the obligations issued pursuant to this section for a period of not to exceed one (1) year from the date of 14 issuance. For subsequent fiscal years, it is the intent of the 15 Legislature to appropriate to the Office of Management and 16 17 Enterprise Services sufficient monies to make rental payments for the purpose of retiring the obligations created pursuant to this 18 section. To the extent funds are available from the proceeds of the 19 borrowing authorized by this subsection, the Oklahoma Capitol 20 Improvement Authority shall provide for the payment of professional 21 fees and associated costs related to the project authorized in 22 subsection A of this section. 23

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1 D. The Authority may issue obligations in one or more series and in conjunction with other issues of the Authority. 2 The Authority is authorized to hire bond counsel, financial consultants, 3 and such other professionals as it may deem necessary to provide for 4 5 the efficient sale of the obligations and may utilize a portion of the proceeds of any borrowing to create such reserves as may be 6 deemed necessary and to pay costs associated with the issuance and 7 administration of such obligations. 8

9 Ε. The obligations authorized under this section may be sold at either competitive or negotiated sale, as determined by the 10 Authority, and in such form and at such prices as may be authorized 11 by the Authority. The Authority may enter into agreements with such 12 credit enhancers and liquidity providers as may be determined 13 necessary to efficiently market the obligations. The obligations 14 may mature and have such provisions for redemption as shall be 15 determined by the Authority, but in no event shall the final 16 maturity of such obligations occur later than ten (10) years from 17 the first principal maturity date. 18

F. Any interest earnings on funds or accounts created for the purposes of this section may be utilized as partial payment of the annual debt service or for the purposes directed by the Authority.

G. The obligations issued under this section, the transfer
thereof and the interest earned on such obligations, including any
profit derived from the sale thereof, shall not be subject to

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1 taxation of any kind by the State of Oklahoma this state, or by any 2 county, municipality or political subdivision therein.

H. The Authority may direct the investment of all monies in any funds or accounts created in connection with the offering of the obligations authorized under this section. Such investments shall be made in a manner consistent with the investment guidelines of the State Treasurer. The Authority may place additional restrictions on the investment of such monies if necessary to enhance the marketability of the obligations.

10 I. There is hereby created a State Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee. The proceeds from the sale of obligations 11 12 issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and Section 1 of 13 Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the 55th Oklahoma Legislature that are needed for repairs to the interior and exterior 14 of the State Capitol shall be subject to the approval of the State 15 Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee; provided, however, 16 17 the expenditure of those proceeds shall be subject to a request for proposal process. 18

19 The Committee shall be composed of nine (9) members as follows: 20 1. Three persons to be appointed by the Governor, one of whom 21 shall serve as chair of the Committee;

22 2. Three legislators to be appointed by the Speaker of the
 23 House of Representatives, two of whom shall be members of the

AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4101, is 7 amended to read as follows: 8 9 Section 4101. As used in Sections 4101 through 4108 4110.1 of this title: 10 1. "Public areas" means those areas in the Oklahoma State 11 Capitol open to the general public for general visitation; and 12 2. "Art" means fine art of museum quality representing the 13 highest quality of art objects available to include paintings, 14 murals, graphic arts, art photography and sculpture, aesthetically 15 aligned with recognized values, created by the conscious use of 16 17 skill and creative imagination -; 3. "Design standards" means a document that is produced for the 18 purpose of guiding review of proposed alterations to the Oklahoma 19 State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and respective grounds. 20 Design standards set the acceptable level of finishes for the 21 historic fabric, features, and materials in use in the Oklahoma 22 State Capitol. 23 24

22	9. "Restoration" means the act or process of accurately				
23	depicting the form, features, and character of the Oklahoma State				
24	Capitol as the building appeared in 1917, and dome in 2002, by means				

of the removal of features from later periods in its history and
 reconstruction of missing features from the restoration period.
 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4102, is
 amended to read as follows:

5 Section 4102. There is hereby re-created, to continue until July 1, 2024 July 1, 2028, in accordance with the provisions of the 6 Oklahoma Sunset Law, the State Capitol Preservation Commission which 7 shall be responsible for planning and supervising the preservation 8 9 and restoration of the interior and exterior of the State Capitol 10 Building, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, and the Governor's 11 Mansion. The Commission shall control approve the display of art 12 objects in public areas of the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion. The State Capitol Preservation Commission shall provide the highest 13 quality maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and 14 modification of and long-term planning for the interior and exterior 15 of the Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds for 16 the perpetual use by the state government and the enjoyment of all 17 18 persons.

19 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4103, is 20 amended to read as follows:

Section 4103. A. The State Capitol Preservation Commission shall be composed of fifteen (15) fourteen (14) members as follows: 1. Three members shall be appointed by the The Governor, or designee;

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1	2. Three members shall be appointed by the The President Pro		
2	Tempore of the Senate, or designee;		
3	3. Three members shall be appointed by the <u>The</u> Speaker of the		
4	House of Representatives, or designee;		
5	4. One member shall be appointed by the <u>The</u> Chief Justice of		
6	the Oklahoma Supreme Court, or designee; and		
7	5. One member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro		
8	Tempore of the Senate;		
9	6. One former senator appointed by the President Pro Tempore of		
10	the Senate;		
11	7. One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the		
12	Speaker of the House of Representatives;		
13	8. One former member of the House of Representatives appointed		
14	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;		
15	9. The Secretary of State; and		
16	10. The following shall be ex officio nonvoting members:		
17	a. Chairman <u>Executive Director</u> of the Oklahoma Arts		
18	Council <u>, or designee</u> ,		
19	b. President Executive Director of the Oklahoma		
20	Historical Society <u>, or designee</u> ,		
21	c. Capitol Architect and Curator,		
22	d. Superintendent of the Capitol Capitol Liaison, and		
23	e. Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise		
24	Services or a designee.		

B. The initial term of office of the appointed members shall be as follows:

3	1. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
4	Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
5	Representatives, and the member appointed by the Chief Justice of
6	the Oklahoma Supreme Court shall serve a one-year term;
7	2. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
8	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
9	Representatives shall serve a three-year term; and
10	3. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
11	Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of
12	Representatives shall serve a five-year term.
13	The term of office for each successor shall be for five (5)
14	years. Any member of the Legislature who is appointed to the
15	Commission shall serve only as long as the member is a member of the
16	respective house from which the member was appointed. All appointed
17	voting and ex officio non-voting members of the State Capitol
18	Preservation Commission shall serve at the pleasure of their
19	appointing authority.
20	C. The Commission shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from its
21	membership to serve for a period of two (2) years. The first chair
22	of the Commission shall be the Governor, or designee, who shall
23	serve a term of two (2) years. Thereafter, the chair of the
24	Commission shall rotate between the President Pro Tempore of the

1 Senate, or designee, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, or designee, and the Governor, or designee, for two-year increments in 2 perpetuity. Members of the Commission shall not be compensated 3 except for reimbursement as provided in the State Travel 4 5 Reimbursement Act.

The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall make 6 D. the necessary arrangements for support services for the State 7 Capitol Preservation Commission. The State Capitol Preservation 8 9 Commission shall meet at least once per quarter and at the call of 10 the chair as needed. A quorum of the voting members shall be 11 present for any action taken. A quorum is the majority of the 12 appointed voting members. The Commission shall be subject to the 13 Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.

E. The Commission functions performed by the Governor, 14 President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of 15 Representatives, Secretary of State, and appointed senators and 16 17 representatives are additional functions of their other public 18 offices and duties.

SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4104, is 19 amended to read as follows: 20

Section 4104. A. The State Capitol Preservation Commission 21 shall provide oversight to the Capitol Liaison and the Office of 22 Management and Enterprise Services on duties for management and 23 maintenance of the Oklahoma State Capitol and shall:

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Research, plan, and have control of modifications and decor
 of the interior and exterior of the Capitol and the Governor's
 Mansion Approve the restoration, preservation, enhancement, or
 modification of the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and
 the respective grounds;

Establish standards for the acquisition and display of works
of art for public display in the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion
and select such works. Such works of art shall be directly related
to the history and culture of the State of Oklahoma <u>Review and</u>
approve the annual budget and the long-range master plan submitted
by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for the Oklahoma
State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds;

3. Establish procedures by which private contributions of
suitable art can be accepted for the <u>Oklahoma State</u> Capitol and the
Governor's Mansion. The Commission is authorized to accept <u>approve</u>
and make proper disposition of works of art as may be donated to the
Commission and this state;

Have authority to approve and submit to the Long-Range
 Capital Planning Commission any proposed modification, alteration,
 renovation, repair, or construction on any part of the Capitol and
 the Covernor's Mansion Review and approve all requests for
 preservation, restoration, enhancement, and modification to the
 Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective
 grounds submitted by the Capitol Liaison. This review and approval

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1	process shall not apply to actions deemed by the Capitol			
2	Superintendent to be maintenance necessary for the upkeep and			
3	function of the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the			
4	respective grounds;			
5	5. Review and approve a security plan submitted by the			
6	Department of Public Safety for the Oklahoma State Capitol,

8	5. <u>6.</u> Have final approval authority for any plans or programs			
9	for the restoration, preservation, or display of fine art programs			
10	in and surrounding the <u>Oklahoma State</u> Capitol and the Governor's			
11	Mansion. Review and approve administrative rules submitted by the			
12	Office of Management and Enterprise Services or the Capitol Liaison			
13	concerning the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, the			
14	respective contents, and the respective concerns;			
15	7. Review and approve preservation zones and design standards			
16	for the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the			
17	respective grounds;			
18	8. Review and approve standards for the selection and			
19	acquisition of works of art and monuments for permanent and			
20	temporary public display in the Oklahoma State Capitol, the			
21	Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds. Such works of art			
22	shall be directly related to the history and culture of this state;			
23	9. Consult the Oklahoma Arts Council to determine the location			
24	of all works of art and monuments to be displayed;			

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1	10. Provide for the allocation of physical space in the			
2	Oklahoma State Capitol to tenants within the limits of Section 15.1			
3	of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Each tenant shall be			
4	responsible for assigning its membership and personnel to locations			
5	within its allotted space;			
6	11. Approve rooms and areas of the building available for use			
7	and reservation by the public;			
8	12. Provide oversight and accountability inspections of			
9	maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and			
10	modification projects to ensure all projects conform to design			
11	standards;			
12	13. Provide for designation of parking space blocks to be			
13	allotted to the tenants in the Oklahoma State Capitol. Tenants			
14	shall be responsible for assignment of individual parking spaces;			
15	and			
16	14. Ensure the Oklahoma State Capitol, grounds, and tenants			
17	comply with Americans with Disabilities Act standards.			
18	B. The Long-Range Capital Planning Commission shall submit any			
19	capital construction or renovation project with respect to the State			
20	Capitol or the Governor's Mansion to the State Capitol Preservation			
21	Commission for its advisory opinion prior to consideration by the			
22	Long-Range Capital Planning Commission As of the effective date of			
23	this act, the State Capitol Preservation Commission shall assume			
24	oversight responsibility of the Capitol Restoration Project from the			

1 State Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee created in 2 Section 345 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes. SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4105, is 3 amended to read as follows: 4 5 Section 4105. There is hereby established the position of the Capitol Architect and Curator who shall: 6 Develop the technical plans and programs for consideration 7 1. by the State Capitol Preservation Commission and the Long-Range 8 9 Capital Planning Commission with regard to restoration, renovation, and preservation of the Oklahoma State Capitol and the Governor's 10 Mansion; 11 12 2. Develop and enforce standards adopted for acquisition and display of works of art in and surrounding the Capitol and the 13 Governor's Mansion Advise the State Capitol Preservation Commission 14 regarding the space demands of the various agencies in the Oklahoma 15 State Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; 16 3. Coordinate space demands of the various agencies in the 17 Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; 18 4. 3. 5 The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services 6 may contract for the services of a Capitol Architect and Curator or 7 employ such an individual on either a full- or part-time basis. 8 Compensation for the position will be in accord with similar 9 professional positions in state government.

10 SECTION 12. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 11 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4105.1 of Title 74, unless there 12 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma State Capitol duties of the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services are as follows:

OMES shall have the responsibility for maintenance,
 restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modification of the
 Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and respective grounds
 including facilities planning, facilities construction, and
 facilities administration;

2. OMES shall be responsible for all maintenance duties
 necessary to properly preserve and maintain the Oklahoma State
 Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds;

3. OMES shall be responsible for devising and developing
processes for tenants in the Oklahoma State Capitol and Governor's

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Mansion to submit requests for maintenance, restoration,
 preservation, enhancement, and modification and evaluating such
 requests;

4 4. OMES shall manage each project, except in Oklahoma State
5 Capitol spaces allotted to the Senate and the House of
6 Representatives as defined in Section 15.1 of Title 73 of the
7 Oklahoma Statutes to ensure execution of the highest quality work
8 product, time-cost schedules, and efficient contract performance;

9 5. OMES shall be responsible for producing an annual budget and
10 submitting it to the State Capitol Preservation Commission;

OMES shall be responsible for creating a long-range master
 plan for the maintenance and upkeep of the Oklahoma State Capitol,
 Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds which shall be
 submitted to the State Capitol Preservation Commission every three
 (3) years;

16 7. The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department in 17 collaboration with the Oklahoma Arts Council shall be responsible 18 for operation or coordinating operation of the visitor center, 19 visitor relations activities, and tours in the Oklahoma State 20 Capitol;

8. OMES shall be responsible for operation of all dining and
 vending services in the Oklahoma State Capitol and shall approve
 food trucks and other mobile food preparation vehicles on the
 grounds unless approved by the Legislature;

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9. OMES shall be responsible for taking and approving
 reservations in all meeting rooms and areas of the Oklahoma State
 Capitol and grounds not allocated to the Legislature by Section 15.1
 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

5 10. OMES shall be responsible for approving all events and 6 gatherings in the Oklahoma State Capitol and on the respective 7 grounds except for space designated in Section 15.1 of Title 73 of 8 the Oklahoma Statutes;

9 11. OMES shall coordinate with the Oklahoma Arts Council for 10 curation of and care for all exhibits, art, monuments, and memorials 11 in public areas at the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, 12 and the respective grounds;

12. The Department of Public Safety shall ensure the safety of 14 all visitors, employees, and elected officials who are in the 15 Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, or on the respective 16 grounds. The Department of Public Safety shall develop a security 17 plan to be submitted to the State Capitol Preservation Commission 18 every three (3) years for approval;

19 13. The Department of Transportation shall be responsible for
20 all maintenance, upkeep, and access to all parking lots on the
21 grounds of the Oklahoma State Capitol and Governor's Mansion;

14. OMES shall be responsible for submitting proposed administrative rules to the State Capitol Preservation Commission to govern the execution of the duties of the Office;

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1 15. OMES may collect rent from third-party vendors in the
 2 Oklahoma State Capitol and proceeds from the sale of merchandise or
 3 services rendered; and

4 16. OMES shall have the authority to respond promptly to5 emergency maintenance needs as they arise.

B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
employ all staff and consultants necessary to perform the duties of
the Office including, but not limited to, a licensed architect.
SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4108, is

10 amended to read as follows:

Section 4108. The provisions of Sections 4101 through 4107 <u>4110.1</u> of this title shall apply to all modifications in the structure or decor of the <u>Oklahoma State</u> Capitol and the, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds except for those immediate emergency repairs needed to prevent loss or damage to property or to protect the <u>health and safety of the</u> public during use of the building and any art displayed on the grounds.

18 SECTION 14. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 19 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4108.1 of Title 74, unless there 20 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Oklahoma Arts Council shall be given the responsibility to acquire, maintain, preserve, or restore any state-owned art that is in storage or on display in the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds. The council is authorized to

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hold exhibitions and commissions to display art to the general
 public. The Oklahoma Arts Council may request direct appropriations
 or submit requests to the Office of Management and Enterprise
 Services.

5 SECTION 15. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4109, is 6 amended to read as follows:

Section 4109. By the order of the Director of the Office of 7 Management and Enterprise Services, restoration and preservation 8 9 Maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modification projects of the Oklahoma State Capitol Building or of 10 the, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds may be exempted 11 from the provisions of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, 12 13 Section 101 et seq. of Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes. For exempted Oklahoma State Capitol Building or Governor's Mansion 14 construction projects, the Office of Management and Enterprise 15 Services shall select among contractors qualified by past experience 16 to conduct historical preservation projects. 17

18 SECTION 16. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2021, Sections 4106 and 19 4107, are hereby repealed.

20 SECTION 17. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 21 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 22 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 23

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
