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LO	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L1	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L2	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-126 of Title 70, unless there
L3	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
L 4	A. The State Board of Education shall establish a two-year

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3. Provide school district employees with stipends to help cover a portion of child care-related expenses for children of school district employees.

- B. The State Board of Education shall establish criteria for awarding grants which shall include but not be limited to the following factors:
- 7 1. The availability of licensed child care facilities in the 8 school district; and
 - 2. The need for child care resources among school district employees.
 - C. A public school district seeking to participate in the pilot program shall apply to the State Board of Education for a grant in the manner and on a form prescribed by the Board.
- D. The State Board of Education shall ensure that pilot program grants are given to a representative sample of Oklahoma school districts, which shall include:
 - 1. A school district with an average daily membership (ADM) of more than two thousand five hundred (2,500) students;
 - 2. A school district with an ADM of two thousand five hundred (2,500) students or less;
 - 3. A school district with an ADM of one thousand (1,000) students or less; and
- 4. A technology center school site.

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E. Two (2) years after implementation of the pilot program, school districts that receive pilot program grants pursuant to this section shall provide a report to the State Board of Education that includes an itemized accounting of how grant funds were spent, an evaluation of the program by school district employees who were provided child care through the grant program, data on whether the program had an impact on recruitment and retention of teachers and support personnel, and recommendations, if any, for future program operations.

SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.

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
