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19	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
20	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
21	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 501 of Title 3, unless there is
22	created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
23	This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Oklahoma
24	Aircraft Engine Testing Development Grant Program".

SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 502 of Title 3, unless there is
 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created within the Oklahoma Aeronautics 4 Α. 5 Commission, the Oklahoma Aircraft Engine Testing Development Grant Program to offer financial assistance by grant to private or public 6 entities for the purpose of augmenting the aircraft engine testing 7 capabilities of this state and developing aircraft engine testing 8 9 infrastructure. Grant funding shall be administered based on merit and the potential for a specific project to enhance the aviation and 10 aerospace industry of this state. A grant under this program shall 11 12 be a one-time award.

B. Public, private, and nonprofit entities within Oklahoma that
have sufficient financial and management capacity to complete the
requested project are eligible for funding under this program.
Applicants shall provide the following information:

Airline or industry support as evidenced by a letter or
 other communication directly from the entity stating its support for
 the project;

20 2. The ability to provide a minimum of forty percent (40%)
 21 matching funds for the project; and

3. A proposal summary that shall include any backgroundinformation or history with aircraft engine testing and development,

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project description, timeline for completion of project, and
 estimated budget for the entire project.

C. A grant agreement shall be required between the awardee and the Commission to provide for conditions of disbursement of grant funds including obligation to repay funds if the terms of the agreement are not met as well as providing ongoing quarterly reports detailing activity related to the project.

8 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 9 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 503 of Title 3, unless there is 10 created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving fund 11 12 for the Oklahoma Aeronautics Commission to be designated the "Oklahoma Aircraft Engine Testing Development Grant Program 13 Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not subject 14 to fiscal year limitations, and shall consist of all monies received 15 by any public or private donations, contributions and gifts received 16 for the benefit of the fund, and any amounts appropriated by the 17 Legislature. All monies accruing to the credit of the fund are 18 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the Oklahoma 19 Aeronautics Commission for the purpose of funding grants as provided 20 in this act. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon warrants 21 issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as prescribed by 22 law with the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 23 Services for approval and payment. 24

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1	SECTION 4. There is hereby appropriated to the Oklahoma
2	Aircraft Engine Testing Development Grant Program Revolving Fund the
3	sum of Twenty Million Dollars (\$20,000,000.00) or so much thereof as
4	may be necessary to carry out the purpose of the fund.
5	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
6	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
7	of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
8	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
9	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
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
