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L 4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
L 5	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
L 6	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6301 of Title 74, unless there
L7	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
L 8	As used in this act:
L 9	1. "Extremely low-income household" means a household income
20	not in excess of thirty percent (30%) of the area median income,
21	adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United
22	States Department of Housing and Urban Development;
23	2. "Very low-income household" means a household income of more
24	than thirty percent (30%) of the area median income but no more than

- fifty percent (50%) of the area median income, adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development;
 - 3. "Low-income household" means a household income of more than fifty percent (50%) of the area median income but no more than eighty percent (80%) of the area median income, adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development;

- 4. "Moderate-income household" means a household income of more than eighty percent (80%) of the area median income but no more than one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the area median income, adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development; and
- 5. "Middle-income household" means a household that has an income of more than one hundred twenty percent (120%) of the area median income but no more than one hundred sixty percent (160%) of the area median income, adjusted for the size of the household, as determined by the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development.
- SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 6302 of Title 74, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
- A. There is hereby created until December 30, 2034, the Oklahoma Affordable Housing Commission. The Commission shall be

composed of fifteen (15) members. The members shall serve as follows:

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- 1. Five members shall be appointed by the Governor:
 - a. one shall be a person living in an urban area with a population more than one hundred thousand (100,000) persons according to the latest Federal Decennial Census,
 - b. one shall be a person living in a rural community residing in a county with a population less than seventy-five thousand (75,000) persons according to the latest Federal Decennial Census,
 - c. one shall be an official serving in a city, town, or political subdivision in a county with a population less than seventy-five thousand (75,000) persons according to the latest Federal Decennial Census,
 - d. one shall represent an organization that assists special populations, including but not limited to the elderly, disabled, veterans, and children transitioning out of foster care, in obtaining affordable housing, and
 - e. one shall represent an Oklahoma rural housing authority;
- 2. Five members shall be appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate:

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one shall be a Senator from the majority party who shall serve as co-chair of the Commission,

- one shall be a Senator from the minority party who shall serve as co-vice chair of the Commission,
- one shall represent a low-income and moderate-to-lowincome population-serving financial institution or a community development financial institution, as
- one shall be an official serving in a municipality with a population more than one hundred thousand (100,000) persons according to the latest Federal
- one shall represent an urban housing authority;
- Five members shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House
 - one shall be a House member from the majority party who shall serve as co-chair of the Commission,
 - one shall be a House member from the minority party who shall serve as co-vice chair of the Commission.
 - one shall represent a federally recognized tribe in Oklahoma that provides affordable housing in rural areas,
 - one shall be a representative from a community housing d. development organization, as determined by the United

States Department of Housing and Urban Development,
and

- e. one shall represent a not-for-profit organization that serves low-income Oklahomans experiencing difficulty in obtaining affordable housing; and
- 4. The following shall be ex officio members:

- a. one shall be from the Oklahoma Department of Commerce Community Development Division, or his or her designee,
- b. one shall be an Oklahoma representative of the United States Department of Agriculture, and
- c. the Executive Director of the Oklahoma Housing Finance Agency, or designee.
- B. For the initial appointments of members to the Commission, each appointment shall be for a two-year term. Thereafter, the terms of the Commission shall be for three (3) years.
- C. No member of the Commission shall receive a salary or reimbursement for duties performed as a member of the Commission; however, members may be eligible to receive travel reimbursement as provided in the State Travel Reimbursement Act.
- D. The meetings of the Commission shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act.
- E. The Commission shall utilize the resources available to it in order to address the needs of extremely low-income households,
