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17	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:			
18	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified			
19	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 840-2.20D of Title 74, unless			
20	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:			
21	A. Any full-time employee of this state who has been employed			
22	for at least two years prior to the request shall be granted a paid			
23	maternity leave for six (6) weeks for the birth or adoption of the			

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employee's child.

An employee who is granted maternity leave pursuant to the В. provisions of this section shall receive the employee's annual salary without interruption during the maternity leave. purposes of determining seniority, pay or pay advancement, and performance awards, and for the receipt of any benefit that may be affected by maternity leave, the service of the employee shall be considered uninterrupted by the maternity leave. C. Nonappropriated state agencies may offer more than six (6) weeks of maternity leave to qualified state employees. SECTION 2.
