NEW LAW in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1908.2 of Title 63, unless 11 12 there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 13 For the purpose of modernizing and improving the licensure and regulatory system for intermediate care facilities for individuals 14 with intellectual disabilities (ICFs/IID), on or before the 15 effective date of this act, the State Commissioner of Health shall 16 update rules governing ICFs/IID including, but not limited to, rules 17 pertaining to direct care staffing ratios and direct care staff 18 training and gualifications. Such rules shall consider the 19 20 standards provided by federal regulation, shall take into account the unique setting of ICFs/IID and the needs of residents served, 21 and may alter requirements or standards based on factors determined 22 by the Commissioner including, but not limited to, size of a 23 facility or acuity of the residents. In promulgating such rules, 24
