7 An Act relating to state government; requiring the Department of Public Safety to create and submit security plan for certain locations on certain 8 schedule; requiring coordination with certain agency; 9 amending 73 O.S. 2021, Section 176, which relates to the permanent Capitol Liaison committee; creating the position of Capitol Liaison; transferring certain 10 duties from the legislative liaison committee to the Capitol Liaison; requiring certain proposals to be 11 submitted to the Capitol Liaison; providing that the Capitol Liaison is the primary liaison for Capitol 12 tenants; amending 73 O.S. 2021, Section 345, which relates to the State Capitol Repair Expenditure 13 Oversight Committee; terminating certain committee; deleting certain responsibility for reporting and 14 implementing certain plans; removing requirement for certain joint approval; deleting certain 15 construction; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4101, which relates to definitions; modifying and defining 16 terms; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4102, which relates to responsibilities of certain commission; 17 extending sunset termination date; requiring approval of certain art in certain areas; stating purpose of 18 certain commission; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4103, which relates to certain membership; modifying 19 membership; establishing meeting requirements; providing quorum requirements; providing that certain 20 State Capitol Preservation Commission functions are additional functions of certain members; amending 74 21 O.S. 2021, Section 4104, which relates to powers and responsibilities of the State Capitol Preservation 22 Commission; modifying and adding certain powers and responsibilities; transferring certain oversight 23 responsibilities; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4105, which relates to Capitol Architect and Curator 24

1 duties; modifying certain duties of the Capitol Architect and Curator; providing duties of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services, the Oklahoma 2 Tourism and Recreation Department, the Oklahoma Arts Council, the Department of Transportation, and the 3 Capitol Liaison, with respect to the Oklahoma State Capitol; directing the Office of Management and 4 Enterprise Services to employ all necessary staff and 5 consultants; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4108, which relates to application of act; expanding applicability of certain law; directing the Oklahoma 6 Arts Council to be responsible for certain art; authorizing certain events; providing procedures for 7 receiving funds; amending 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4109, which relates to exemptions from the Public 8 Competitive Bidding Act of 1974; adding certain 9 project exemptions; repealing 74 O.S. 2021, Sections 4106 and 4107, which relate to cooperation between State Capitol Preservation Commission and branches of 10 state government and compliance with certain administrative requirements; making language gender 11 neutral; deleting obsolete language; providing for 12 codification; and declaring an emergency. 13 14

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified

in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 93 of Title 73, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 The Department of Public Safety shall create a security plan for 20 the Oklahoma State Capitol and Oklahoma State Capitol grounds and 21 the Governor's Mansion. The plan shall be submitted to the State 22 Capitol Preservation Commission for review and approval. A new plan 23 shall be submitted every three (3) years.

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The Department shall coordinate with the Office of Management
 and Enterprise Services to implement and staff the approved security
 plan.

4 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 176, is 5 amended to read as follows:

Section 176. A. There shall be established created within the 6 Legislative Service Bureau the position of a permanent legislative 7 liaison committee, composed of three (3) members from each house, 8 9 appointed by the President Pro Tempore and Speaker, respectively 10 Capitol Liaison to the State Capitol Preservation Commission. The legislative liaison committee will Capitol Liaison shall keep the 11 12 Legislature properly advised as to the activities of the Oklahoma 13 Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management and Enterprise Services by making such reports as they deem the Capitol 14 Liaison deems necessary to the appropriate committees and leadership 15 of both houses. All legislative studies concerning the 16 17 responsibilities or activities of the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority or the Office of Management and Enterprise Services and 18 all studies of activities or projects relating to the Oklahoma State 19 Capitol Complex shall be considered by presented to the liaison 20 committee created Capitol Liaison authorized by this section. The 21 Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of Management 22 and Enterprise Services shall notify the membership of the 23 legislative liaison committee Capitol Liaison in advance of any 24

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1 meeting in which official or formal action is to be taken by 2 furnishing the proposed agenda in writing at least twenty-four (24) 3 hours in advance of such meeting.

B. The Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority and the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services shall provide such information,
records, testimony, or recommendations as the committee Capitol
Liaison may require.

8 <u>C. All proposals for enhancement, modification, preservation,</u> 9 <u>or restoration of the Oklahoma State Capitol and Oklahoma State</u> 10 <u>Capitol grounds, and the Governor's Mansion and grounds, shall be</u> 11 <u>submitted to the Liaison. The Liaison shall submit all proposals to</u> 12 <u>the State Capitol Preservation Commission for approval.</u>

13D. All proposals for new space allocation in the Oklahoma State14Capitol and parking allocation shall be submitted to the Liaison.

15 The Liaison shall submit all proposals to the State Capitol

16 Preservation Commission for approval, as defined by Sections 15.1

17 and 15.3 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

18 <u>E. The Capitol Liaison shall be the primary liaison for all</u> 19 tenants that occupy space in the Oklahoma State Capitol.

20 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 73 O.S. 2021, Section 345, is 21 amended to read as follows:

22 Section 345. A. In addition to any other authorization 23 provided by law, the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority is 24 authorized to issue obligations to acquire real property, together

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with improvements located thereon, and personal property to construct improvements to real property and to provide funding for repairs, refurbishments and improvements to real and personal property of the <u>Oklahoma</u> State Capitol Building in a total amount not to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00).
The funds shall be used for the renovation, repair and remodeling of the <u>Oklahoma</u> State Capitol Building.

The Authority may hold title to the property and 8 Β. 9 improvements until such time as any obligations issued for this 10 purpose are retired or defeased and may lease the property and improvements to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. 11 Upon final redemption or defeasance of the obligations created 12 pursuant to this section, title to the property and improvements 13 shall be transferred from the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority 14 to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. 15

C. For the purposes of paying the costs for construction of the 16 real property and improvements, and providing funding for the 17 project authorized in subsection A of this section, and for the 18 purpose authorized in subsection D of this section, the Authority is 19 hereby authorized to borrow monies on the credit of the income and 20 revenues to be derived from the leasing of such property and 21 improvements and, in anticipation of the collection of such income 22 and revenues, to issue negotiable obligations in a total amount not 23 to exceed One Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) 24

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1 whether issued in one or more series. The Authority is authorized 2 to capitalize interest on the obligations issued pursuant to this section for a period of not to exceed one (1) year from the date of 3 issuance. For subsequent fiscal years, it is the intent of the 4 5 Legislature to appropriate to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services sufficient monies to make rental payments for 6 the purpose of retiring the obligations created pursuant to this 7 To the extent funds are available from the proceeds of the 8 section. 9 borrowing authorized by this subsection, the Oklahoma Capitol Improvement Authority shall provide for the payment of professional 10 fees and associated costs related to the project authorized in 11 12 subsection A of this section.

The Authority may issue obligations in one or more series 13 D. and in conjunction with other issues of the Authority. 14 The Authority is authorized to hire bond counsel, financial consultants, 15 and such other professionals as it may deem necessary to provide for 16 the efficient sale of the obligations and may utilize a portion of 17 the proceeds of any borrowing to create such reserves as may be 18 deemed necessary and to pay costs associated with the issuance and 19 administration of such obligations. 20

E. The obligations authorized under this section may be sold at either competitive or negotiated sale, as determined by the Authority, and in such form and at such prices as may be authorized by the Authority. The Authority may enter into agreements with such

1 credit enhancers and liquidity providers as may be determined
2 necessary to efficiently market the obligations. The obligations
3 may mature and have such provisions for redemption as shall be
4 determined by the Authority, but in no event shall the final
5 maturity of such obligations occur later than ten (10) years from
6 the first principal maturity date.

F. Any interest earnings on funds or accounts created for the
purposes of this section may be utilized as partial payment of the
annual debt service or for the purposes directed by the Authority.

10 G. The obligations issued under this section, the transfer 11 thereof and the interest earned on such obligations, including any 12 profit derived from the sale thereof, shall not be subject to 13 taxation of any kind by the State of Oklahoma this state, or by any 14 county, municipality or political subdivision therein.

H. The Authority may direct the investment of all monies in any funds or accounts created in connection with the offering of the obligations authorized under this section. Such investments shall be made in a manner consistent with the investment guidelines of the State Treasurer. The Authority may place additional restrictions on the investment of such monies if necessary to enhance the marketability of the obligations.

I. There is hereby created a State Capitol Repair Expenditure
Oversight Committee. The proceeds from the sale of obligations
issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and Section 1 of

Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the 55th Oklahoma 1 2 Legislature that are needed for repairs to the interior and exterior of the State Capitol shall be subject to the approval of the State 3 Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee; provided, however, 4 5 the expenditure of those proceeds shall be subject to a request for 6 proposal process. 7 The Committee shall be composed of nine (9) members as follows: 1. Three persons to be appointed by the Governor, one of whom 8 9 shall serve as chair of the Committee; 10 2. Three legislators to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives, two of whom shall be members of the 11 12 majority political party and one of whom shall be a member of the minority political party; and 13 3. Three legislators to be appointed by the President Pro 14 Tempore of the Senate, two of whom shall be members of the majority 15 political party and one of whom shall be a member of the minority 16 political party. Five members of the Committee shall constitute a 17 quorum and the vote of five members shall be necessary for any 18 action taken by the Committee. The Committee shall be staffed by 19 employees of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services. The 20 Committee shall be subject to the Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. 21 J. The Committee shall deliver a preliminary plan for the 22 renovation, repair and remodeling of the State Capitol to the 23 Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no 24

1 later than December 31, 2014. The preliminary plan shall include 2 the following components:

1. Establishment of the Office of Management and Enterprise 3 Services' goal and criteria for use by the vendor; and 4 5 2. Selection criteria for the design-build team vendor to be selected through a Request For Proposal process. 6 K. Following receipt of the preliminary plan as approved by the 7 Committee, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall 8 9 solicit Requests For Proposals to select the vendor for the project. 10 L. The Committee shall deliver a final plan to the Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services no later than June 11 12 30, 2015. The final plan shall include the following components: 1. Approval of the final scope of work developed by the vendor; 13 and 14 2. Approval of the project phasing developed by the vendor. 15 M. Following delivery of the final plan, the Committee shall 16 continue to oversee the expenditure of proceeds from the sale of 17 obligations issued pursuant to the provisions of this section and 18 Section 1 of Enrolled House Bill No. 3168 of the 2nd Session of the 19 55th Legislature, until completion of the renovation, repair and 20 remodeling of the State Capitol. The Committee may also propose and 21 approve amendments to the plan as it deems appropriate. 22 N. The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise 23 Services shall have responsibility to substantially implement the 24

1 plan as presented by the Committee; provided, the President Pro 2 Tempore of the Senate or the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall approve all proposed designs related to renovation, repair and 3 remodeling of space within the State Capitol Building under the 4 5 management and control of the Legislature and allocated to that officer's house of the Legislature pursuant to the provisions of 6 Section 15.1 of this title, and any subsequent changes to such 7 plans. Joint approval of the President Pro Tempore of the Senate 8 9 and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be required 10 for such plans for space under the management and control of the Legislature and not allocated to a specific house of the 11 12 Legislature. Such approval shall be in writing. O. Insofar as they are not in conflict with the provisions of 13 this section, the provisions of Section 151 et seq. of this title 14 shall apply to this section. 15 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4101, is 16 amended to read as follows: 17 Section 4101. As used in Sections 4101 through 4108 4110.1 of 18 this title: 19 1. "Public areas" means those areas in the Oklahoma State 20 Capitol open to the general public for general visitation; and 21 2. "Art" means fine art of museum quality representing the 22 highest quality of art objects available to include paintings, 23 murals, graphic arts, art photography and sculpture, aesthetically 24

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1 aligned with recognized values, created by the conscious use of 2 skill and creative imagination;

3	3. "Design standards" means a document that is produced for the
4	purpose of guiding review of proposed alterations to the Oklahoma
5	State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and respective grounds.
6	Design standards set the acceptable level of finishes for the
7	historic fabric, features, and materials in use in the Oklahoma
8	State Capitol.
9	This document establishes specifications for alterations which,
10	if followed, will provide compatible design;
11	4. "Enhancement" means an increase or improvement upon the
12	quality, value, or extent of the original design intent of the
13	Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, or the respective
14	grounds;
15	5. "Grounds" means all land surrounding the Oklahoma State
16	Capitol and bordered by Lincoln Boulevard, and the land contained
17	within the fence line surrounding the Governor's Mansion;
18	6. "Maintenance" means keeping spaces, structures, and
19	infrastructure in proper operating condition in a routine,
20	scheduled, or anticipated fashion to prevent failure or degradation;
21	7. "Modification" means any change to an existing physical
22	attribute of the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, or the
23	respective grounds;
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<u>8. "Preservation" means the act or process of applying measures</u>
 <u>necessary to sustain the existing form, integrity, and materials of</u>
 <u>a historic property including preliminary measures to protect and</u>
 <u>stabilize the property, and focusing upon the ongoing maintenance</u>
 <u>and repair of historic materials and features, rather than extensive</u>
 replacement and new construction; and

9. "Restoration" means the act or process of accurately 7 depicting the form, features, and character of the Oklahoma State 8 9 Capitol as the building appeared in 1917, and the dome in 2002, by means of the removal of features from later periods in its history 10 and reconstruction of missing features from the restoration period. 11 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4102, is 12 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY amended to read as follows: 13

Section 4102. There is hereby re-created, to continue until 14 July 1, 2024 July 1, 2028, in accordance with the provisions of the 15 Oklahoma Sunset Law, the State Capitol Preservation Commission which 16 17 shall be responsible for planning and supervising the preservation and restoration of the interior and exterior of the Oklahoma State 18 Capitol Building, hereinafter referred to as the Capitol, and the 19 Governor's Mansion. The Commission shall control approve the 20 display of art objects in public joint House- and Senate-controlled 21 and executive branch-controlled areas of the Capitol and the 22 Governor's Mansion. The State Capitol Preservation Commission shall 23 provide the highest-quality maintenance, restoration, preservation, 24

17	5. One member of the Senate appointed by the President Pro
18	Tempore of the Senate;
19	6. One former Senator appointed by the President Pro Tempore of

21	7. One member of the House of Representatives appointed by the
22	Speaker of the House of Representatives;
23	8. One former member of the House of Representatives appointed
24	by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

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1	9. The Secretary of State; and
2	<u>10.</u> The following shall be ex officio <u>nonvoting</u> members:
3	a. Chairman <u>Executive Director</u> of the Oklahoma Arts
4	Council <u>, or designee</u> ,
5	b. President Executive Director of the Oklahoma
6	Historical Society <u>, or designee</u> ,
7	c. Capitol Architect and Curator,
8	d. Superintendent of the Capitol Capitol Liaison, and
9	e. Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise
10	Services or a designee.
11	B. The initial term of office of the appointed members shall be
12	as follows:
13	1. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President
14	Pro Tempore of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of
15	Representatives, and the member appointed by the Chief Justice of
16	the Oklahoma Supreme Court shall serve a one-year term;
17	2. One of the members appointed by the Governor, the President

The Commission shall elect a chair and a vice-chair from its 6 membership to serve for a period of two (2) years. The first chair 7 of the Commission shall be the Governor, or designee, who shall 8 9 serve a term of two (2) years. Thereafter, the chair of the Commission shall rotate between the President Pro Tempore of the 10 11 Senate, or designee, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, or 12 designee, and the Governor, or designee, for two-year increments in 13 perpetuity. Members of the Commission shall not be compensated except for reimbursement as provided in the State Travel 14 Reimbursement Act. 15 The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall make 16 D. the necessary arrangements for support services for the State 17 Capitol Preservation Commission. The State Capitol Preservation 18 Commission shall meet at least once per quarter and at the call of 19 20 the chair as needed. A quorum of the voting members shall be present for any action taken. A quorum is the majority of the 21 appointed voting members. The Commission shall be subject to the 22 Oklahoma Open Meeting Act. 23

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1 E. The Commission functions performed by the Governor, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Speaker of the House of 2 Representatives, Secretary of State, and appointed Senators and 3 4 Representatives are additional functions of their other public 5 offices and duties. SECTION 7. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4104, is 6 amended to read as follows: 7 Section 4104. A. The State Capitol Preservation Commission 8 9 shall provide oversight to the Capitol Liaison and the Office of Management and Enterprise Services on duties for management and 10 maintenance of the Oklahoma State Capitol and shall: 11 12 1. Research, plan, and have control of modifications and decor of the interior and exterior of the Capitol and the Governor's 13 Mansion Approve the restoration, preservation, enhancement, or 14 modification of the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and 15 the respective grounds; 16 2. Establish standards for the acquisition and display of works 17 of art for public display in the Capitol and the Governor's Mansion 18 and select such works. Such works of art shall be directly related 19 to the history and culture of the State of Oklahoma Review and 20 approve the annual budget and the long-range master plan submitted 21 by the Office of Management and Enterprise Services for the Oklahoma 22 State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds; 23

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1 3. Establish procedures by which private contributions of suitable art can be accepted for the Capitol and the Governor's 2 Mansion. The Commission is authorized to accept and make proper 3 disposition of works of art as may be donated to the Commission and 4 5 this state; 4. Have authority to approve and submit to the Long-Range 6 Capital Planning Commission any proposed modification, alteration, 7 renovation, repair, or construction on any part of the Capitol and 8 9 the Governor's Mansion Review and approve all requests for preservation, restoration, enhancement, and modification to the 10 Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective 11 12 grounds submitted by the Capitol Liaison. This review and approval 13 process shall not apply to actions deemed by the Capitol Superintendent to be maintenance necessary for the upkeep and 14 function of the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the 15 respective grounds; 16 4. Review and approve a security plan submitted by the 17 Department of Public Safety for the Oklahoma State Capitol, 18 Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds; and 19 5. Have final approval authority for any plans or programs for 20 the restoration, preservation, or display of fine art programs in 21 and surrounding the Oklahoma State Capitol and the Governor's 22 Mansion; 23

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1	6. Review and approve administrative rules submitted by the
2	Office of Management and Enterprise Services or the Capitol Liaison
3	concerning the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, the
4	respective contents, and the respective concerns;
5	7. Review and approve preservation zones and design standards
6	for the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the
7	respective grounds;
8	8. Review and approve standards for the selection and
9	acquisition of works of art and monuments for permanent and
10	temporary public display in the public spaces controlled by the
11	executive branch or controlled jointly by the House and Senate in
12	the Oklahoma State Capitol or the Governor's Mansion. Such works of
13	art shall be directly related to the history and culture of this
14	state; and
15	9. Provide oversight and accountability inspections of
16	maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and
17	modification projects to ensure all projects conform to design
18	standards.
19	B. The Long-Range Capital Planning Commission shall submit any
20	capital construction or renovation project with respect to the State
21	Capitol or the Governor's Mansion to the State Capitol Preservation
22	Commission for its advisory opinion prior to consideration by the
23	Long-Range Capital Planning Commission As of the effective date of
24	this act, the State Capitol Preservation Commission shall assume

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1 oversight responsibility of the Oklahoma State Capitol restoration 2 project from the State Capitol Repair Expenditure Oversight Committee created in Section 345 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma 3 4 Statutes. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4105, is 5 SECTION 8. amended to read as follows: 6 Section 4105. There is hereby established the position of the 7 Capitol Architect and Curator who shall: 8 9 1. Develop the technical plans and programs for consideration by the State Capitol Preservation Commission and the Long-Range 10 Capital Planning Commission with regard to restoration, renovation, 11 and preservation of the Oklahoma State Capitol and the Governor's 12 13 Mansion; 2. Develop and enforce standards adopted for acquisition and 14 display of works of art in and surrounding the Capitol and the 15 Governor's Mansion Advise the State Capitol Preservation Commission 16 regarding the space demands of the various agencies in the Oklahoma 17 State Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; 18 3. Coordinate space demands of the various agencies in the 19 Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; 20 4. Maintain a record of all structural and decor changes made 21 in the Oklahoma State Capitol and the Governor's Mansion; and 22 5. 4. Make recommendations to the State Capitol Preservation 23 Commission for design standards and of necessary action on proposed 24

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1 restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modifications in decor
2 or design to ensure preservation and maintenance of the cultural and
3 historic integrity of the <u>Oklahoma State</u> Capitol and the Governor's
4 Mansion; and

5 <u>5. Make recommendations to the State Capitol Preservation</u>
6 Commission for preservation zones and design standards.

7 The Director of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services 8 may contract for the services of a Capitol Architect and Curator or 9 employ such an individual on either a full- or part-time basis. 10 Compensation for the position will be in accord with similar 11 professional positions in state government.

12 SECTION 9. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4105.1 of Title 74, unless there 14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. The Oklahoma State Capitol duties of the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services (OMES) are as follows:

OMES shall have the responsibility for maintenance,
 restoration, preservation, enhancement, and modification of the
 Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and respective grounds
 including facilities planning, facilities construction, and
 facilities administration;

22 2. OMES shall be responsible for all maintenance duties
23 necessary to properly preserve and maintain the Oklahoma State
24 Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds;

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3. OMES shall be responsible for devising and developing
 processes for tenants in the Oklahoma State Capitol and Governor's
 Mansion to submit requests for maintenance, restoration,
 preservation, enhancement, and modification and evaluating such
 requests;

6 4. OMES shall manage each project, except in Oklahoma State
7 Capitol areas allotted to the Senate and the House of
8 Representatives as defined in Section 15.1 of Title 73 of the
9 Oklahoma Statutes to ensure execution of the highest quality work
10 product, time-cost schedules, and efficient contract performance;

5. OMES shall be responsible for producing an annual budget and
submitting it to the State Capitol Preservation Commission;

6. OMES shall be responsible for creating a long-range master
plan for the maintenance and upkeep of the Oklahoma State Capitol,
Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds which shall be
submitted to the State Capitol Preservation Commission every three
(3) years;

18 7. The Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department in 19 collaboration with the Oklahoma Arts Council shall be responsible 20 for operation or coordinating operation of the visitor center, 21 visitor relations activities, and tours in the Oklahoma State 22 Capitol;

8. OMES shall be responsible for operation of all dining and
vending services in the Oklahoma State Capitol and shall approve

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1 food trucks and other mobile food preparation vehicles on the 2 grounds unless approved by the Legislature;

9. OMES shall be responsible for taking and approving
reservations in all meeting rooms and areas of the Oklahoma State
Capitol and grounds and shall seek approval from the Senate, House
of Representatives, or jointly for space allocated to the
Legislature by Section 15.1 of Title 73 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

8 10. OMES shall coordinate with the Oklahoma Arts Council for 9 curation of and care for artwork in the State Art Collection, 10 Capitol Art Collection, and monuments, memorials, and all temporary 11 exhibits in public areas at the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's 12 Mansion, and the respective grounds;

13 11. The Department of Transportation shall be responsible for
14 all maintenance, upkeep, and access to all parking lots on the
15 grounds of the Oklahoma State Capitol and Governor's Mansion;

16 12. OMES shall be responsible for submitting proposed 17 administrative rules to the State Capitol Preservation Commission to 18 govern the execution of these duties;

19 13. OMES may collect rent from third-party vendors in the 20 Oklahoma State Capitol and proceeds from the sale of merchandise or 21 services rendered;

22 14. OMES shall have the authority to respond promptly to 23 emergency maintenance needs as they arise; and

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15. OMES shall serve as the primary contact for Americans with
 2 Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA) compliance for the Oklahoma State
 3 Capitol.

B. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
employ all staff and consultants necessary to perform the duties of
the Office including, but not limited to, a licensed architect.

7 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4108, is
8 amended to read as follows:

9 Section 4108. The provisions of Sections 4101 through 4107
10 <u>4110.1</u> of this title shall apply to all modifications in the
11 structure or decor of the <u>Oklahoma State</u> Capitol and the, Governor's
12 Mansion, and the respective grounds except for those immediate
13 emergency repairs needed to prevent loss or damage to property or to
14 protect the <u>health and safety of the</u> public during use of the
15 building and any art displayed on the grounds.

16 SECTION 11. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 4108.1 of Title 74, unless there 18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

The Oklahoma Arts Council shall be given the responsibility to acquire, maintain, preserve, or restore any state-owned art in the State Art Collection or Capitol Art Collection that is in storage or on display in the Oklahoma State Capitol, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds. The council is authorized to hold exhibitions and commissions to display art to the general public.

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The Oklahoma Arts Council may request direct appropriations or
 submit requests to the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.
 SECTION 12. AMENDATORY 74 O.S. 2021, Section 4109, is
 amended to read as follows:

Section 4109. By the order of the Director of the Office of
Management and Enterprise Services, restoration and preservation
Maintenance, restoration, preservation, enhancement, and

modification projects of the Oklahoma State Capitol Building or of 8 9 the, Governor's Mansion, and the respective grounds may be exempted from the provisions of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, 10 Section 101 et seq. of Title 61 of the Oklahoma Statutes. For 11 12 exempted Oklahoma State Capitol Building or Governor's Mansion 13 construction projects, the Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall select among contractors qualified by past experience 14 to conduct historical preservation projects. 15

16 SECTION 13. REPEALER 74 O.S. 2021, Sections 4106 and 17 4107, are hereby repealed.

18 SECTION 14. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 19 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 20 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 21 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
