Supp. 2023, Sections 802.2 and 802.3), which relate to the duties of the Initiative 8 and the Oklahoma Low Carbon Energy Initiative Board 9 membership; modifying duties and membership of the Board; requiring electronic reporting; updating statutory reference; and providing an effective date. 10 11 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA: 13 SECTION 1. 17 O.S. 2021, Section 802.2, as AMENDATORY 14 amended by Section 1, Chapter 27, O.S.L. 2022 (17 O.S. Supp. 2023, 15 Section 802.2), is amended to read as follows: 16 Section 802.2. A. There is hereby created the Oklahoma Low 17 Carbon Energy Initiative, referred to in Section 802.1 et seq. of 18 this title as the Initiative, which shall serve as a strategic 19 program designed to create, advance, and promote new and existing 20 energy research and development, use, supply chain activity, and 21 infrastructure related to Oklahoma's core energy competencies by: 22 1. Promoting research and development in the areas of 23 conventional and unconventional oil and natural gas development and 24

production, hydrogen production, storage, and distribution, CO<sub>2</sub> enhanced oil recovery, wind forecasting, advanced biofuels, energy storage, water management, <u>nuclear energy</u>, energy policy and economic analysis, energy system optimization, renewable energy integration into the electrical grid, and similar energy technologies;

7 2. Fostering communication and collaboration between state and
8 federal governmental agencies, institutions of higher education, and
9 private entities located throughout Oklahoma;

Advancing research and development programs and growing
 production, supply chain activity, and infrastructure that provide
 benefits to all industries and regions of the state;

4. Streamlining research and development efforts between
 private and public industry to create synergistic relationships that
 coordinate, not duplicate, efforts;

16 5. Establishing Oklahoma as a regional resource and 17 clearinghouse for transformative energy technologies in the areas of 18 traditional energy, hydrogen production, storage, and distribution, 19 and renewable resource research and development;

Attracting best-in-class researchers to Oklahoma in
 competency areas aligned with Oklahoma's natural resource base;

7. Coordinating with the Oklahoma Department of Commerce to enhance venture capital investment in energy-related research and business opportunities; and

8. Promoting seed funding that can be leveraged against state,
 federal, and private-source funding to establish sufficient startup
 resources.

B. The Initiative may receive assistance from any state agency
or public entity to implement the provisions of the Oklahoma Energy
Initiative Act including, but not limited to, administrative
assistance, staffing or legal counsel and provision of office space
or equipment as necessary. Assistance agreements may be made by
memorandums of understanding or as otherwise provided by law.

10SECTION 2.AMENDATORY17 O.S. 2021, Section 802.3, as11amended by Section 2, Chapter 27, O.S.L. 2022 (17 O.S. Supp. 2023,12Section 802.3), is amended to read as follows:

Section 802.3. A. The Oklahoma Low Carbon Energy Initiative 13 shall be administered and governed by the Oklahoma Low Carbon Energy 14 Initiative Board, made up of representatives of the contributing 15 institutions and entities of the Initiative which shall include but 16 not be limited to the University of Oklahoma, Oklahoma State 17 University, and the University of Tulsa. Additional contributing 18 members may be added at the discretion of the Board, if they 19 contribute to the purpose, objectives, and research coordinated by 20 the Initiative. 21

B. The Board shall consist of eleven (11) thirteen (13) members as follows:

One member, who shall serve as the chair of the Board, shall
 be the Secretary of Energy and Environment or a member otherwise
 appointed by the Governor;

2. One member shall be the Vice President for Research from the
University of Oklahoma or a member otherwise appointed by the
President of the University of Oklahoma;

3. One member shall be the Vice President for Research from
Oklahoma State University or a member otherwise appointed by the
President of Oklahoma State University;

One member shall be the Vice President for Research and
 <u>Economic Development</u> from the University of Tulsa or a member
 otherwise appointed by the President of the University of Tulsa;
 One member who shall represent the Oklahoma Department of
 Commerce, appointed by the Director of the Department of Commerce;
 One member who shall represent the Department of Labor,

16 appointed by the Commissioner of Labor;

17 7. One member who shall represent the Department of
18 Environmental Quality, appointed by the Executive Director of the
19 Department of Environmental Quality;

20 8. One member who shall represent the Corporation Commission,21 appointed by the Chair of the Commission;

9. One member who shall represent the Department of
Transportation, appointed by the Director of the Department of
Transportation;

10. One member who shall represent the Oklahoma Water Resources
 Board, appointed by the Executive Director of the <u>Oklahoma</u> Water
 Resources Board; and

4 11. One member who shall represent the Oklahoma Center for the
5 Advancement of Science and Technology, appointed by the Executive
6 Director of the Center for the Advancement of Science and
7 Technology;

8 <u>12. One member, who shall represent an electric utility or</u> 9 <u>cooperative regulated by the Corporation Commission, appointed by</u> 10 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate; and

11 <u>13. One member, who shall represent the nuclear energy</u>
 12 <u>industry, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives</u>.
 13 C. 1. The Board shall establish an Energy Industry Advisory
 14 Council, appointed by the chair, for the purposes of providing
 15 industry expertise and knowledge, assisting the Board with annual
 16 report requirements, providing general recommendations, and other

17 support as needed to advance the efforts of the Board.

Members appointed to the Council shall serve at the pleasure
 of the chair of the Board.

D. Board members shall serve for a term of four (4) years, which shall begin on January 1 of the first year of the appointment and end on December 31 of the fourth year. There shall be no limit to the number of consecutive terms served. If a vacancy should occur during a member's term, the appointing authority for the

vacant position shall appoint a new member to fill the remainder of
 the unexpired term. Board members shall serve without compensation
 but may be eligible for necessary travel expenses pursuant to the
 State Travel Reimbursement Act.

5 E. The Board shall be responsible for establishing procedures 6 for the Initiative and operations of the Board and the Advisory 7 Council. The rules may provide for protection from public 8 disclosure of trade secrets and proprietary information of any kind 9 including, but not limited to, data, processes and technology, as 10 the Board determines necessary.

F. The Board shall undertake activities and commission programs, through the contributing institutions and entities, to achieve the purpose and satisfy the objectives of the Initiative as provided in the Oklahoma Energy Initiative Act. The Board shall have authority to distribute funding for such activities and programs. The Board may employ staff as it deems necessary.

G. The Board, in consultation with the Advisory Council and any 17 other party deemed necessary, shall prepare submit and publish 18 electronically an annual, written report to summarize the annual 19 progress of the Initiative including summaries of its programs and 20 their progress and outcomes. The report shall be made available to 21 the public and shall be distributed electronically to the Governor, 22 the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the 23 House of Representatives. 24

H. The provisions of the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act shall
 not apply to any project, activity or contract of the Initiative or
 the Board.

I. No Board member or any person acting on behalf of the Board, 4 5 Advisory Council, or Initiative executing any contracts, commitments or agreements issued by or on behalf of the Oklahoma Low Carbon 6 Energy Initiative shall be personally liable for the contracts, 7 commitments, or agreements or be subject to any personal liability 8 9 or accountability by reason thereof. No director or any person acting on behalf of the Board or Initiative shall be personally 10 liable for damage or injury resulting from the performance of duties 11 12 hereunder. 13 SECTION 3.
