7 An Act relating to Service Oklahoma; amending 47 O.S.
8 2021, Section 2-147, which relates to the State
9 Public Safety Fund; modifying inclusions; amending
10 Sections 1, 3, and 6, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47
11 O.S. Supp. 2022, Sections 3-101, 3-103 and 3-106),
12 which relate to the creation of Service Oklahoma, the
13 Director of Service Oklahoma and the Service Oklahoma
14 Revolving Fund; modifying references; creating a
15 separate agency; providing responsibilities for
16 agency; requiring coordination; directing certain
17 compensation; creating the Licensed Operator
18 Performance Fund; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-
19 101, as last amended by Section 37, Chapter 282,
20 O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-101),
21 which relates to class requirements for driver
22 licenses; modifying certain fee retention by licensed
23 operators; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-105.3, as
24 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 65, O.S.L. 2022
(47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-105.3), which relates
to issuance of identification card; modifying certain
fee retention by licensed operators; amending 47 O.S.
2021, Section 6-114, as amended by Section 54,
Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section
6-114), which relates to replacement licenses;

amended by Section 57, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47
O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 6-117), which relates to
records kept by the Department; modifying certain fee
retention by licensed operators; amending 47 O.S.
2021, Section 1103, which relates to legislative
intent; authorizing certain fee retention; amending
47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104, as last amended by
Section 1, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
2022, Section 1104), which relates to apportionment

1 of fees; requiring certain monthly reporting;
2 directing certain apportionment; amending 47 O.S.
3 2021, Section 1135.5, as last amended by Section 23
4 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 782 of the 1st Session of
5 the 59th Oklahoma Legislature (47 O.S. Supp. 2022,
6 Section 1135.5), which relates to special license
7 plates; modifying certain fee retention by licensed
8 operators; amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1140, as
9 amended by Section 174, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47
10 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 1140), which relates to
11 qualifications for licensed operators; prescribing
12 certain method of payment for licensed operators;
13 amending 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1141.1, as last
14 amended by Section 177, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47
15 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 1141.1), which relates to
16 retention of taxes and fees; modifying certain fee
17 retention by licensed operators; repealing 47 O.S.
18 2021, Section 1132.5, which relates to additional
19 registration fees; providing an effective date; and
20 declaring an emergency.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 2-147, is amended to read as follows:

Section 2-147. A. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a fund to be designated as the "State Public Safety Fund". The fund shall be subject to legislative appropriation and shall consist of revenues deposited to such fund by Section 1113.2 of Title 47 of the Oklahoma Statutes and of such other revenues as may be provided by law.

B. The State Public Safety Fund shall be utilized by the Legislature through appropriations to support public safety ~~in~~ Oklahoma and the services offered by Service Oklahoma.

1 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY Section 1, Chapter 282, O.S.L.
2 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3-101), is amended to read as
3 follows:

4 Section 3-101. A. ~~Service Oklahoma, a division of the Office~~
5 ~~of Management and Enterprise Services,~~ is hereby created, which
6 shall consist of the Executive Director of Service Oklahoma and such
7 divisions, sections, committees, offices, boards, and positions as
8 may be established by the Executive Director of Service Oklahoma or
9 by law.

10 The applicable powers, duties, and responsibilities exercised by
11 the Driver License Services Division of the Department of Public
12 Safety shall be fully transferred to Service Oklahoma on November 1,
13 2022. All employees of the Department of Public Safety whose duties
14 are transferred under this act shall be transferred to Service
15 Oklahoma.

16 The applicable powers, duties, and responsibilities exercised by
17 the Motor Services Division of the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall be
18 fully transferred to Service Oklahoma on January 1, 2023. All
19 employees of the Oklahoma Tax Commission whose duties are
20 transferred under this act shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma.

21 B. 1. Beginning November 1, 2023, Service Oklahoma shall cease
22 to be part of or a division of the Office of Management and
23 Enterprise Services and shall be deemed to be a separate and
24 distinct agency, to be known as Service Oklahoma. Service Oklahoma

1 and the Director of Service Oklahoma shall continue to exercise
2 their statutory powers, duties, and contractual responsibilities.
3 All records, property, equipment, assets, monies, financial
4 interests, liabilities, matters pending, and funds of the division
5 shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma.

6 2. Service Oklahoma shall succeed to any contractual rights or
7 responsibilities incurred by the Office of Management and Enterprise
8 Services pertaining to licensed operators.

9 3. Rules promulgated by the Office of Management and Enterprise
10 Services pertaining to Service Oklahoma that are in effect on the
11 effective date of this act shall be immediately adopted and enforced
12 by the Executive Director of Service Oklahoma. The Executive
13 Director maintains the authority to further promulgate and enforce
14 rules.

15 4. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services and Service
16 Oklahoma may enter into an agreement for the transfer of personnel
17 from the Office of Management and Enterprise Services to Service
18 Oklahoma. No employee shall be transferred to Service Oklahoma
19 except on the freely given written consent of the employee. All
20 employees who are transferred to Service Oklahoma shall not be
21 required to accept a lesser grade or salary than presently received.
22 All employees shall retain leave, sick, and annual time earned, and
23 any retirement and longevity benefits which have accrued during
24 their tenure with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

1 The transfer of personnel between the state agencies shall be
2 coordinated with the Office of Management and Enterprise Services.

3 5. The expenses incurred by Service Oklahoma as a result of the
4 transfer required by this subsection shall be paid by Service
5 Oklahoma.

6 6. The division within the Department known as Service Oklahoma
7 shall be abolished by the Office of Management and Enterprise
8 Services after the transfer has been completed.

9 7. The Office of Management and Enterprise Services shall
10 coordinate the transfer of records, property, equipment, assets,
11 funds, allotments, purchase orders, liabilities, outstanding
12 financial obligations, or encumbrances provided for in this
13 subsection.

14 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY Section 3, Chapter 282, O.S.L.
15 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3-103), is amended to read as
16 follows:

17 Section 3-103. A. The Executive Director of Service Oklahoma
18 shall be appointed by the Governor with the advice and consent of
19 the Senate. The Executive Director shall serve at the pleasure of
20 the Governor and may be removed or replaced without cause.
21 Compensation for the Executive Director shall be determined pursuant
22 to Section 3601.2 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes. The
23 Executive Director may be removed from office by a two-thirds (2/3)

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1 vote of the members elected to and constituting each chamber of the
2 Oklahoma Legislature.

3 B. The Executive Director of Service Oklahoma shall be the
4 chief executive officer of Service Oklahoma and shall act for
5 Service Oklahoma in all matters except as may be otherwise provided
6 by law. The powers and duties of the Executive Director shall
7 include, but not be limited to:

8 1. Organize Service Oklahoma in a manner to efficiently achieve
9 the objectives of Service Oklahoma;

10 2. Supervise all activities of Service Oklahoma;

11 3. Administer programs and policies of Service Oklahoma;

12 4. Employ, discharge, appoint, contract, and fix duties and
13 compensation of employees at the discretion of the Executive
14 Director;

15 5. Appoint assistants, deputies, officers, investigators,
16 attorneys, and other employees as may be necessary to carry out
17 functions of Service Oklahoma;

18 6. Prescribe rules and regulations for the operation of Service
19 Oklahoma;

20 7. Provide input and recommendations to the Service Oklahoma
21 Operator Board on all matters including branding and physical
22 standardization requirements, customer service metrics, analysis,
23 and improvement processes for licensed operators, and processes for
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1 termination of licensed operators for failure to comply with the
2 customer service metrics;

3 8. Establish internal policies and procedures;

4 9. Prescribe and provide suitable forms deemed necessary to
5 carry out the functions of Service Oklahoma and any other laws the
6 enforcement and administration of which are vested in Service
7 Oklahoma;

8 10. Establish such divisions, sections, committees, advisory
9 committees, offices, and positions in Service Oklahoma as the
10 Executive Director deems necessary to carry out the functions of
11 Service Oklahoma;

12 11. Accept and disburse grants, allotments, gifts, devises,
13 bequests, funds, appropriations, and other property made or offered
14 to Service Oklahoma; and

15 12. Create the budget for Service Oklahoma to be submitted to
16 the Legislature each year.

17 C. The salary and other expenses for the Executive Director
18 shall be budgeted as a separate line item through ~~the Office of~~
19 ~~Management and Enterprise Services~~ Service Oklahoma. The operating
20 expenses of Service Oklahoma shall be set by the Executive Director
21 and shall be budgeted as a separate line item through ~~the Office of~~
22 ~~Management and Enterprise Services~~ Service Oklahoma.

23 D. 1. The Executive Director of Service Oklahoma shall direct
24 all purchases, hiring, procurement, and budget for Service Oklahoma

1 ~~of the Office of Management and Enterprise Services~~ and establish,
2 implement, and enforce policies and procedures related thereto,
3 consistent with the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Service
4 Oklahoma and the Executive Director shall be subject to the
5 requirements of the Public Competitive Bidding Act of 1974, the
6 Oklahoma Lighting Energy Conservation Act, and the Public ~~Building~~
7 ~~Construction and Planning~~ Facilities Act.

8 2. The Executive Director of Service Oklahoma, or any employee
9 or agent of the Executive Director of Service Oklahoma acting within
10 the scope of delegated authority, shall have the same power and
11 authority related to purchases, hiring, procurement, and budget for
12 Service Oklahoma as outlined in paragraph 1 of this subsection for
13 Service Oklahoma as the State Purchasing Director has for all
14 acquisitions used or consumed by state agencies as established in
15 the Oklahoma Central Purchasing Act. Such authority shall,
16 consistent with the authority granted to the State Purchasing
17 Director ~~pursuant to Section 85.10 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma~~
18 ~~Statutes~~, include the power to designate financial or proprietary
19 information submitted by a bidder confidential and reject all
20 requests to disclose the information so designated, if the Executive
21 Director of Service Oklahoma requires the bidder to submit the
22 financial or proprietary information with a bid, proposal, or
23 quotation.

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1 E. Service Oklahoma shall determine the compensation to be
2 retained by licensed operators.

3 1. Before the last day in September in every even-numbered
4 year, Service Oklahoma shall review the compensation paid to
5 licensed operators and, if necessary, change the compensation.

6 Service Oklahoma shall engage an independent third party to evaluate
7 the compensation paid to licensed operators who shall provide any
8 recommendations no later than November 1 in the even-numbered year.

9 Any recommended change in licensed operator compensation shall be
10 finalized by Service Oklahoma no later than the third Tuesday of
11 November in the even-numbered year. Notice of such recommendation
12 shall be provided to the Governor, the President Pro Tempore and the
13 Chair of the Appropriations Committee of the Senate, and the Speaker
14 and the Chair of the Appropriations and Budget Committee of the
15 House of Representatives.

16 2. Any change in licensed operator compensation, unless
17 rejected or amended as provided by this subsection, shall become
18 effective on July 1 of the following calendar year. Any amendment
19 passed by a majority vote of each house of the Legislature shall
20 become effective as provided by the amendment unless vetoed by the
21 Governor.

22 SECTION 4. AMENDATORY Section 6, Chapter 282, O.S.L.
23 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022, Section 3-106), is amended to read as
24 follows:

1 Section 3-106. A. There is hereby created in the State
2 Treasury a revolving fund for Service Oklahoma to be designated the
3 "Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a continuing
4 fund, not subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing
5 to the credit of ~~said~~ the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be
6 budgeted and expended by Service Oklahoma for the restricted
7 purposes of the monies as prescribed by law. Expenditures from ~~said~~
8 the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer
9 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the
10 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and
11 payment.

12 B. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
13 fund for Service Oklahoma to be designated the "Service Oklahoma
14 Reimbursement Fund". The fund shall be a continuing fund, not
15 subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing to the
16 credit of ~~said~~ the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be
17 budgeted and expended by Service Oklahoma for the restricted
18 purposes of the monies as prescribed by law. Expenditures from ~~said~~
19 the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer
20 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the
21 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and
22 payment.

23 C. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
24 fund for Service Oklahoma, to be designated the "Service Oklahoma

1 Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund". The fund shall be a
2 continuing fund not subject to fiscal year limitations. All monies
3 accruing to the credit of ~~said~~ the fund are hereby appropriated and
4 shall be budgeted and expended by Service Oklahoma for the purpose
5 of implementing, developing, administering, and maintaining the
6 computer imaging system of Service Oklahoma. Expenditures from ~~said~~
7 the fund shall be made upon warrants issued by the State Treasurer
8 against claims filed as prescribed by law with the Director of the
9 Office of Management and Enterprise Services for approval and
10 payment.

11 D. There is hereby created in the State Treasury a revolving
12 fund for Service Oklahoma to be designated the "Licensed Operator
13 Performance Fund". This fund shall be a continuing fund not subject
14 to fiscal year limitations. All monies accruing to the credit of
15 the fund are hereby appropriated and shall be budgeted and expended
16 by Service Oklahoma for the restricted purposes of the monies as
17 prescribed by law. Expenditures from the fund shall be made upon
18 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as
19 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and
20 Enterprise Services for approval and payment.

21 1. The Licensed Operator Performance Fund shall be distributed
22 to licensed operators in accordance with the applicable metrics
23 determined by Service Oklahoma.

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1 2. In the event that excess funds exist in the Licensed
2 Operator Performance Fund after distribution to licensed operators
3 pursuant to this subsection, the remaining funds are authorized to
4 be expended for the purpose of purchasing back a licensed operator
5 license from a licensed operator, pursuant to Section 1140 of this
6 title.

7 SECTION 5. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-101, as
8 last amended by Section 37, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
9 2022, Section 6-101), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 6-101. A. No person, except those hereinafter
11 expressly exempted in Sections 6-102 and 6-102.1 of this title,
12 shall operate any motor vehicle upon a highway in this state unless
13 the person has a valid Oklahoma driver license for the class of
14 vehicle being operated under the provisions of this title. No
15 person shall be permitted to possess more than one valid license at
16 any time, except as provided in paragraph 4 of subsection F of this
17 section.

18 B. 1. No person shall operate a Class A commercial motor
19 vehicle unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and
20 holds a valid Class A commercial license, except as provided in
21 paragraph 5 of this subsection and subsection F of this section.
22 Any person holding a valid Class A commercial license shall be
23 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes A, B, C and D, except
24 as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

1 2. No person shall operate a Class B commercial motor vehicle
2 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
3 valid Class B commercial license, except as provided in paragraph 5
4 of subsection F of this section. Any person holding a valid Class B
5 commercial license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in
6 Classes B, C and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this
7 subsection.

8 3. No person shall operate a Class C commercial motor vehicle
9 unless the person is eighteen (18) years of age or older and holds a
10 valid Class C commercial license, except as provided in subsection F
11 of this section. Any person holding a valid Class C commercial
12 license shall be permitted to operate motor vehicles in Classes C
13 and D, except as provided for in paragraph 4 of this subsection.

14 4. No person under twenty-one (21) years of age shall be
15 licensed to operate any motor vehicle which is required to be
16 placarded for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172,
17 subpart F, except as provided in subsection F of this section;
18 provided, a person eighteen (18) years of age or older may be
19 licensed to operate a farm vehicle which is required to be placarded
20 for hazardous materials pursuant to 49 C.F.R., Part 172, subpart F,
21 except as provided in subsection F of this section.

22 5. A person at least seventeen (17) years of age who
23 successfully completes all examinations required by law may be
24 issued by Service Oklahoma:

1 a. a restricted Class A commercial license which shall
2 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
3 A or Class B commercial motor vehicle for harvest
4 purposes or a Class D motor vehicle, or

5 b. a restricted Class B commercial license which shall
6 grant to the licensee the privilege to operate a Class
7 B commercial motor vehicle for harvest purposes or a
8 Class D motor vehicle.

9 6. No person shall operate a Class D motor vehicle unless the
10 person is sixteen (16) years of age or older and holds a valid Class
11 D license, except as provided for in Section 6-102 or 6-105 of this
12 title. Any person holding a valid Class D license shall be
13 permitted to operate motor vehicles in Class D only.

14 C. Any person issued a driver license pursuant to this section
15 may exercise the privilege thereby granted upon all streets and
16 highways in this state.

17 D. No person shall operate a motorcycle or motor-driven cycle
18 without having a valid Class A, B, C or D license with a motorcycle
19 endorsement. Except as otherwise provided by law, any new applicant
20 for an original driver license shall be required to successfully
21 complete a written examination, vision examination and driving
22 examination for a motorcycle as prescribed by the Department of
23 Public Safety, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, and a certified
24 state-approved motorcycle basic rider course approved by the

1 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma, if the applicant
2 is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to be eligible for a
3 motorcycle endorsement thereon. The written examination and driving
4 examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service Oklahoma
5 upon verification that the person has successfully completed a
6 certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course approved by the
7 Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

8 E. Except as otherwise provided by law, any person who lawfully
9 possesses a valid Oklahoma driver license which is eligible for
10 renewal shall be required to successfully complete a written
11 examination, vision examination and driving examination for a
12 motorcycle as prescribed by the Department, in conjunction with
13 Service Oklahoma, and a certified state-approved motorcycle basic
14 rider course approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service
15 Oklahoma, if the person is seventeen (17) years of age or younger to
16 be eligible for a motorcycle endorsement. The written examination
17 and driving examination for a motorcycle shall be waived by Service
18 Oklahoma upon verification that the person has successfully
19 completed a certified Motorcycle Safety Foundation rider course
20 approved by the Department, in conjunction with Service Oklahoma.

21 F. 1. Any person eighteen (18) years of age or older may apply
22 for a restricted Class A, B or C commercial learner permit. Service
23 Oklahoma, after the applicant has passed all parts of the
24 examination for a Class D license and has successfully passed all

1 parts of the examination for a Class A, B or C commercial license
2 other than the driving examination, may issue to the applicant a
3 commercial learner permit which shall entitle the person having
4 immediate lawful possession of the commercial learner permit and a
5 valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional driver license pursuant
6 to Section 6-212 of this title to operate a Class A, B or C
7 commercial motor vehicle upon the public highways solely for the
8 purpose of behind-the-wheel training in accordance with rules
9 promulgated by the Department.

10 2. This commercial learner permit shall be issued for a period
11 as provided in Section 6-115 of this title of one hundred eighty
12 (180) days, which may be renewed one time for an additional one
13 hundred eighty (180) days; provided, such commercial learner permit
14 may be suspended, revoked, canceled, denied or disqualified at the
15 discretion of the Department, with notice to Service Oklahoma, for
16 violation of the restrictions, for failing to give the required or
17 correct information on the application or for violation of any
18 traffic laws of this state pertaining to the operation of a motor
19 vehicle. Except as otherwise provided, the lawful possessor of a
20 commercial learner permit who has been issued a commercial learner
21 permit for a minimum of fourteen (14) days may have the restriction
22 requiring an accompanying driver removed by satisfactorily
23 completing a driver's examination; provided, the removal of a
24 restriction shall not authorize the operation of a Class A, B or C

1 commercial motor vehicle if such operation is otherwise prohibited
2 by law.

3 3. No person shall apply for and Service Oklahoma shall not
4 issue an original Class A, B or C driver license until the person
5 has been issued a commercial learner permit and held the permit for
6 at least fourteen (14) days. Any person who currently holds a Class
7 B or C license and who wishes to apply for another class of
8 commercial driver license shall be required to apply for a
9 commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at least
10 fourteen (14) days before applying for the Class A or B license, as
11 applicable. Any person who currently holds a Class A, B or C
12 license and who wishes to add an endorsement or remove a restriction
13 for which a skills examination is required shall be required to
14 apply for a commercial learner permit and to hold the permit for at
15 least fourteen (14) days before applying for the endorsement.

16 4. A commercial learner permit shall be issued by Service
17 Oklahoma as a separate and unique document which shall be valid only
18 in conjunction with a valid Oklahoma driver license or provisional
19 driver license pursuant to Section 6-212 of this title, both of
20 which shall be in the possession of the person to whom they have
21 been issued whenever that person is operating a commercial motor
22 vehicle as provided in this subsection.

23 5. After one renewal of a commercial learner permit, as
24 provided in paragraph 2 of this subsection, a commercial permit

1 shall not be renewed again. Any person who has held a commercial
2 learner permit for the initial issuance period and one renewal
3 period shall not be eligible for and Service Oklahoma shall not
4 issue another renewal of the permit; provided, the person may
5 reapply for a new commercial learner permit, as provided for in this
6 subsection.

7 G. 1. For purposes of this title:

8 a. "REAL ID Compliant Driver License" or "Identification
9 Card" means a driver license or identification card
10 issued by ~~the State of Oklahoma~~ this state that has
11 been certified by the United States Department of
12 Homeland Security (USDHS) as compliant with the
13 requirements of the REAL ID Act of 2005, Public Law
14 No. 109-13. A REAL ID Compliant Driver License or
15 Identification Card and the process through which it
16 is issued incorporate a variety of security measures
17 designed to protect the integrity and trustworthiness
18 of the license or card. A REAL ID Compliant Driver
19 License or Identification Card will be clearly marked
20 on the face indicating that it is a compliant
21 document, and

22 b. "REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License" or
23 "Identification Card" means a driver license or
24 identification card issued by ~~the State of Oklahoma~~

1 this state that has not been certified by the United
2 States Department of Homeland Security (USDHS) as
3 being compliant with the requirements of the REAL ID
4 Act of 2005. A REAL ID Noncompliant Driver License or
5 Identification Card will be clearly marked on the face
6 indicating that it is not compliant with the federal
7 REAL ID Act of 2005 and is not acceptable for official
8 federal purposes. The driver license or
9 identification card will have a unique design or color
10 indicator that clearly distinguishes it from a
11 compliant license or card.

12 2. Original Driver License and Identification Card Issuance:

- 13 a. Application for an original REAL ID Compliant or REAL
14 ID Noncompliant Driver License or Identification Card
15 shall be made to Service Oklahoma.
- 16 b. Service Oklahoma employees shall perform all document
17 recognition and other requirements needed for approval

9 privileges otherwise granted by the specific class of

13 and, after furnishing primary and secondary proofs of identity as
14 required in this section, shall be issued a replacement driver
15 license for a period which does not exceed the lesser of:

- 16 a. the expiration date of the license being replaced, or
- 17 b. the expiration date on the valid documentation
18 authorizing the presence of the person in the United
19 States, as required by paragraph 9 of subsection A of
20 Section 6-103 of this title.

21 2. The cost of a replacement license shall be Twenty-five
22 Dollars (\$25.00), of which:

- 23 a. Two Dollars (\$2.00) shall be apportioned as provided
24 in Section 1104 of this title,

1 b. Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be remitted to the State
2 Treasurer to be credited to the General Revenue Fund,

3 c. Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be credited to the
4 Department of Public Safety Computer Imaging System
5 Revolving Fund to be used solely for the purpose of
6 administering and maintaining the computer imaging
7 system of the Department through October 31, 2022.

8 Beginning November 1, 2022, Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall
9 be credited to the Service Oklahoma Computer Imaging
10 System Revolving Fund to be used solely for the
11 purpose of administering and maintaining the computer
12 imaging system of Service Oklahoma,

13 d. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be credited to the
14 Revolving Fund of the Department of Public Safety
15 through October 31, 2022. Beginning November 1, 2022,
16 the Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be credited to the
17 Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund,

18 e. Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be deposited to the State
19 Public Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this
20 title, and

21 f. (1) Two Dollars (\$2.00) of the fee authorized by this
22 paragraph related to the replacement of a driver
23 license by a licensed operator that does not
24 process approved applications or renewals for

1 REAL ID Compliant Driver Licenses or
2 Identification Cards shall be deposited, in
3 addition to the amount authorized by subparagraph
4 e of this paragraph, to the State Public Safety
5 Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title, or
6 (2) Two Dollars (\$2.00) of the fee authorized by this
7 paragraph related to the replacement of a driver
8 license by a licensed operator that does process
9 approved applications or renewals for REAL ID
10 Compliant Driver Licenses or Identification Cards
11 shall be retained by the licensed operator
12 through June 30, 2023. Beginning July 1, 2023,
13 these monies shall be retained by the licensed
14 operator pursuant to subsection E of Section
15 1141.1 of this title.

16 3. Service Oklahoma shall promulgate rules prescribing forms of
17 primary and secondary identification acceptable for replacement of
18 an Oklahoma driver license; provided, however, a valid and unexpired
19 U.S. passport shall be acceptable as both primary and secondary
20 identification.

21 B. Any person desiring to add or remove an endorsement or
22 endorsements or a restriction or restrictions to any existing driver
23 license, when authorized by Service Oklahoma, shall obtain a
24 replacement license with the endorsement or endorsements or the

1 restriction or restrictions change thereon and shall be charged the
2 fee for a replacement license as provided in subsection A of this
3 section.

4 SECTION 8. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-117, as
5 amended by Section 57, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp. 2022,
6 Section 6-117), is amended to read as follows:

7 Section 6-117. A. Service Oklahoma shall file every
8 application for a driver license or identification card received by
9 Service Oklahoma and shall maintain suitable indexes containing:

10 1. All applications denied and on each thereof note the reasons
11 for the denial;

12 2. All applications granted;

13 3. The name of every person whose driving privilege has been
14 suspended, revoked, canceled, or disqualified by Service Oklahoma
15 and after each such name note the reasons for the action. Any
16 notation of suspension of the driving privilege of a person for
17 reason of nonpayment of a fine shall be removed from the driving
18 record after the person has paid the fine and the driving privilege
19 of the person is reinstated as provided for by law;

20 4. The county of residence, the name, date of birth, and
21 mailing address of each person residing in that county who is
22 eighteen (18) years of age or older, and who is the holder of a
23 current driver license or a current identification card issued by
24 Service Oklahoma for the purpose of ascertaining names of all

1 persons qualified for jury service as required by Section 18 of
2 Title 38 of the Oklahoma Statutes; and

3 5. The name, driver license number, and mailing address of
4 every person for the purpose of giving notice, if necessary, as
5 required by Section 2-116 of this title.

6 B. Service Oklahoma shall file all collision reports and
7 abstracts of court records of convictions received by it pursuant to
8 the laws of this state and maintain convenient records of the
9 records and reports or make suitable notations in order that an
10 individual record of a person showing the convictions of the person
11 and the traffic collisions in which the person has been involved
12 shall be readily ascertainable and available for the consideration
13 of Service Oklahoma upon any application for a driver license or
14 renewal of a driver license and at other suitable times. Any
15 abstract, index or other entry relating to a driving record
16 according to the licensing authority in another state or a province
17 of Canada may be posted upon the driving record of any resident of
18 this state when notice thereof is received by documentation or by
19 electronic transmission. The individual record of a person shall
20 not include any collision reports and abstracts of court records
21 involving a collision in which the person was not issued a citation
22 or if a citation is issued and the person was not convicted.

23 C. 1. Service Oklahoma may designate and is hereby authorized
24 to prepare under the seal of Service Oklahoma and deliver upon

1 request a copy of any collision report on file with the Department,
2 charging a fee of:

3 a. beginning on July 1, 2011, through June 30, 2013,
4 Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00), of which Eight Dollars
5 (\$8.00) shall be deposited by the Commissioner to the
6 credit of the Department of Public Safety Revolving
7 Fund and, in addition to other purposes authorized by
8 law, the expenditures from that fund of monies derived
9 from the Eight Dollars (\$8.00) pursuant to this
10 subparagraph shall be used to fund any Oklahoma
11 Highway Patrol Trooper Academy provided by the
12 Department of Public Safety. Any remaining funds
13 shall be deposited in an account to be utilized
14 exclusively for future expenses directly related to
15 the operation of an Oklahoma Highway Patrol Academy,
16 and

17 b. beginning on July 1, 2013, and any year thereafter,
18 Seven Dollars (\$7.00).

19 However, Service Oklahoma shall not be required to furnish
20 personal information from the collision report which is contrary to
21 the provisions of the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 United
22 States Code, Sections 2721 through 2725.

23 2. Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph 1 of this
24 subsection, Service Oklahoma is authorized to enter into contracts

1 to supply information regarding vehicles reported to be involved in
2 collisions. For each vehicle, the information shall be limited to
3 that which only describes the vehicle and the collision. Service
4 Oklahoma shall not be required to provide any information regarding
5 the owner or operator of the vehicle or any information which would
6 conflict with Section 2-110 or Section 1109 of this title.

7 D. Service Oklahoma or any licensed operator upon request shall
8 prepare and furnish to any authorized person a Motor Vehicle Report
9 of any person subject to the provisions of the motor vehicle laws of
10 this state. However, Service Oklahoma shall not be required to
11 furnish personal information from a driving record contrary to the
12 provisions of the Driver's Privacy Protection Act, 18 United States
13 Code, Sections 2721 through 2725. The Motor Vehicle Report shall be
14 a summary of the driving record of the person and shall include the
15 enumeration of any motor vehicle collisions, reference to
16 convictions for violations of motor vehicle laws, and any action
17 taken against the privilege of the person to operate a motor
18 vehicle, as shown by the files of Service Oklahoma for the three (3)
19 years preceding the date of the request. The Motor Vehicle Report,
20 to include any record or information associated with the Motor
21 Vehicle Report, shall not be deemed a "public civil record" as
22 defined in Section 18 of Title 22 of the Oklahoma Statutes, and
23 shall not be subject to expungement. Service Oklahoma shall not be
24 required to release to any person, in whole or in part and in any

1 format, a driving index, as described in subsection A of this
2 section, except as otherwise provided for by law. For each Motor
3 Vehicle Report furnished by Service Oklahoma, Service Oklahoma shall
4 collect the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), Twenty Dollars
5 (\$20.00) of which shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund and
6 Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the Department of Public
7 Safety Revolving Fund through October 31, 2022. Beginning November
8 1, 2022, the Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the Service
9 Oklahoma Revolving Fund. For each Motor Vehicle Report furnished by
10 a licensed operator, the licensed operator shall collect the sum of
11 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) of which
12 shall be paid to the Oklahoma Tax Commission for deposit in the
13 General Revenue Fund in the State Treasury, Five Dollars (\$5.00)
14 shall be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund
15 and Two Dollars (\$2.00) of which shall be retained by the licensed
16 operator through October 31, 2022. Beginning November 1, 2022, for
17 each Motor Vehicle Report furnished by a licensed operator, the
18 licensed operator shall collect the sum of Twenty-five Dollars
19 (\$25.00), Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) of which shall be paid to the
20 Oklahoma Tax Commission for deposit in the General Revenue Fund in
21 the State Treasury, Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the
22 Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund, and Two Dollars (\$2.00) shall be
23 retained by the licensed operator through June 30, 2025. Beginning
24 July 1, 2025, Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) of the fee shall be paid to

1 the Oklahoma Tax Commission for deposit in the General Revenue Fund
2 in the State Treasury, Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in
3 the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund, and Two Dollars (\$2.00) shall
4 be retained by the licensed operator pursuant to subsection E of
5 Section 1141.1 of this title. Persons sixty-five (65) years of age
6 or older shall not be required to pay a fee for their own Motor
7 Vehicle Report furnished by Service Oklahoma or a licensed operator.
8 For purposes of this subsection, a Motor Vehicle Report shall
9 include a report which indicates that no driving record is on file
10 with Service Oklahoma for the information received by Service
11 Oklahoma in the request for the Motor Vehicle Report.

12 E. Service Oklahoma may develop procedures whereby an acting
13 agent of an employer or an employer of a person:

14 1. Who has a Class A, B, C or D driver license; and

15 2. Who operates a commercial, company-owned or personal motor
16 vehicle during the course of business in the course of his or her
17 employment with the employer, may automatically be notified,
18 pursuant to a fee schedule established by Service Oklahoma, should
19 the driving record of a person reflect a traffic conviction in any
20 court or an administrative action by Service Oklahoma which alters
21 the status of the commercial driving privileges of the person, or
22 any other change to the driving status. The notification system
23 shall include electronic delivery of a Motor Vehicle Report at least
24 annually for any employee who is a commercial driver licensee or who

1 operates a commercial motor vehicle, as required by 49 C.F.R.,
2 Section 391.25, or who operates a company-owned or personal motor
3 vehicle during the course of business. All monies received by the
4 Commissioner of Public Safety and the officers and employees of the
5 Department pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited in the
6 Department of Public Safety Restricted Revolving Fund through
7 October 31, 2022. Beginning November 1, 2022, all monies received
8 by the Director of Service Oklahoma and the officers and employees
9 of Service Oklahoma pursuant to this subsection shall be deposited
10 in the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund. For each Motor Vehicle
11 Report furnished by Service Oklahoma, through the electronic
12 notification system, Service Oklahoma shall collect the sum of
13 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00), Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) of which
14 shall be deposited in the General Revenue Fund in the State
15 Treasury. Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be deposited in the Department
16 of Public Safety Revolving Fund through October 31, 2022. Beginning
17 November 1, 2022, for each Motor Vehicle Report furnished by Service
18 Oklahoma, through the electronic notification system, Service
19 Oklahoma shall collect the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00),
20 Eighteen Dollars (\$18.00) of which shall be deposited in the General
21 Revenue Fund in the State Treasury, Five Dollars (\$5.00) shall be
22 deposited in the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund. Two Dollars
23 (\$2.00) shall be retained by Service Oklahoma or its authorized
24

1 agent for the purpose of development and maintenance of the
2 electronic notification system.

3 F. Service Oklahoma is authorized to establish a procedure for
4 reviewing the driving records of state residents who are existing
5 policyholders of any insurance company licensed to operate in this
6 state during specified periods of time and producing a report which
7 identifies the policyholders which have had violation and/or status
8 changes to their driving records during such time period. Service
9 Oklahoma may sell such report to the insurance company or its agent
10 at a fee to be set by Service Oklahoma. Any such report sold by
11 Service Oklahoma shall only consist of information otherwise
12 lawfully obtainable by the insurance company or its agent. The fee
13 shall be sufficient to recover all costs incurred by Service
14 Oklahoma and ensure that there will be no net revenue loss to the
15 state. Such fee shall be deposited in the Department of Public
16 Safety Revolving Fund through October 31, 2022. Beginning November
17 1, 2022, such fee shall be deposited in the Service Oklahoma
18 Revolving Fund.

19 G. All monies received by the Commissioner of Public Safety or
20 Service Oklahoma and the officers and employees of the Department
21 shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the
22 General Revenue Fund in the State Treasury except as otherwise
23 provided for by law.

24

1 SECTION 9. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1103, is
2 amended to read as follows:

3 Section 1103. A. It is the intent of the Legislature that the
4 owner or owners of every vehicle in this state shall possess a
5 certificate of title as proof of ownership and that every vehicle
6 shall be registered in the name of the owner or owners thereof. All
7 registration and license fees and mileage taxes imposed by ~~this act~~
8 the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration Act shall be for the
9 purpose of providing funds for the general governmental functions of
10 the state, counties, municipalities and schools and for the
11 maintenance and upkeep of the avenues of public access of this
12 state. Such registration and license fees shall apply to every
13 vehicle operated upon, over, along or across any avenue of public
14 access within this state and when paid in full, shall be in lieu of
15 all other taxes, general and local, unless otherwise specifically
16 provided.

17 B. Unless otherwise provided, all fees to be retained by the
18 licensed operator pursuant to the Oklahoma Vehicle License and
19 Registration Act, shall be retained by the licensed operator
20 pursuant to subsection E of Section 1141.1 of this title.

21 1. This section shall apply to subsection H of Section 1105,
22 Section 1115, 1132, 1132.1, 1132.4, 1135.1, 1135.2, 1135.3,
23 subsection H of Section 1140, and Section 1151 of this title, and
24

1 Section 2103 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes, beginning July 1,
2 2023.

3 2. This section shall apply to subsections G, L, M, N, and R of
4 Section 1105, Sections 1107.4, 1110, 1116, 1126, 1135.4, 1135.7,
5 1135.9, and 1143 of this title, and Section 4021 of Title 63 of the
6 Oklahoma Statutes, beginning July 1, 2025.

7 SECTION 10. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1104, as
8 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 363, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
9 2022, Section 1104), is amended to read as follows:

10 Section 1104. A. Unless otherwise provided by law, all fees,
11 taxes and penalties collected or received pursuant to the Oklahoma
12 Vehicle License and Registration Act or Section 1-101 et seq. of
13 this title shall be apportioned and distributed monthly by the
14 Oklahoma Tax Commission in accordance with this section. Service
15 Oklahoma shall provide to the Oklahoma Tax Commission monthly
16 reports of motor vehicle collection information, including, but not
17 limited to, motor vehicle monthly apportionment information,
18 refunds, canceled vouchers, waste tire collections, organ donor
19 program amounts, driver license records, prorate amounts, and sales
20 tax amounts. The reports shall be delivered electronically pursuant
21 to the current calendar year apportionment disbursement schedule
22 provided to Service Oklahoma by the Oklahoma Tax Commission on or
23 before December 1st annually.

1 One percent (1%) of fees collected shall be apportioned to the
2 Licensed Operator Performance Fund created in Section 3-106 of this
3 title, in accordance with the applicable metrics determined by
4 Service Oklahoma.

5 B. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
6 subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various
7 school districts in accordance with paragraph 2 of this subsection:

- 8 a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, thirty-five
9 and forty-six one-hundredths percent (35.46%),
- 10 b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
11 30, 2002, thirty-five and ninety-one one-hundredths
12 percent (35.91%),
- 13 c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year
14 ending on June 30, 2015, thirty-six and twenty one-
15 hundredths percent (36.20%),
- 16 d. for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year
17 ending on June 30, 2019, thirty-six and twenty one-
18 hundredths percent (36.20%), but in no event shall the
19 amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this
20 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for
21 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts
22 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the
23 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and

1 e. for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all
2 subsequent years, thirty-six and twenty one-hundredths
3 percent (36.20%), but in no event shall the amount
4 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this
5 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for
6 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts
7 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the
8 credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver
9 Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the
10 Oklahoma Statutes.

11 2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e
12 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned to the
13 various school districts so that each district shall receive an
14 amount based upon the proportion that each district's average daily
15 attendance bears to the total average daily attendance of those
16 districts entitled to receive funds pursuant to this section as
17 certified by the State Department of Education.

18 Each district's allocation of funds shall be remitted to the
19 county treasurer of the county wherein the administrative
20 headquarters of the district are located.

21 No district shall be eligible for the funds herein provided
22 unless the district makes an ad valorem tax levy of fifteen (15)
23 mills and maintains nine (9) years of instruction and pursuant to
24

1 the rules of the State Board of Education, is authorized to maintain
2 ten (10) years of instruction.

3 C. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
4 subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State
5 Treasurer to be credited to the General Revenue Fund of the State
6 Treasury:

7 1. From October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, forty-five and
8 ninety-seven one-hundredths percent (45.97%);

9 2. For the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June 30,
10 2002, forty-five and twenty-nine one-hundredths percent (45.29%);

11 3. For the year beginning July 1, 2002, and for the subsequent
12 fiscal years ending June 30, 2007, forty-four and eighty-four one-
13 hundredths percent (44.84%);

14 4. For the year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30,
15 2008, thirty-nine and eighty-four one-hundredths percent (39.84%);

16 5. For the year beginning July 1, 2008, and ending June 30,
17 2009, thirty-four and eighty-four one-hundredths percent (34.84%);

18 6. For the period beginning July 1, 2009, and ending December
19 31, 2012, twenty-nine and eighty-four one-hundredths percent
20 (29.84%);

21 7. For the period beginning January 1, 2013, and ending June
22 30, 2013, twenty-nine and thirty-four one-hundredths percent
23 (29.34%);

1 8. For the year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30,
2 2014, twenty-six and eighty-four one-hundredths percent (26.84%);
3 and

4 9. For the year beginning July 1, 2014, through the year ending
5 June 30, 2019, twenty-four and eighty-four one-hundredths percent
6 (24.84%).

7 D. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
8 subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State
9 Treasurer to be credited to the State Transportation Fund:

10 1. From October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, thirty one-
11 hundredths percent (0.30%);

12 2. For the year beginning July 1, 2001, through the year ending
13 on June 30, 2015, thirty-one one-hundredths percent (0.31%);

14 3. For the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year ending
15 on June 30, 2019, thirty-one one-hundredths percent (0.31%), but in
16 no event shall the amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to
17 this paragraph exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal
18 year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such
19 limitation shall be placed to the credit of the General Revenue
20 Fund; and

21 4. For the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all subsequent
22 years, thirty-one one-hundredths percent (0.31%), but in no event
23 shall the amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this
24 paragraph exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal year

1 ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess of such limitation
2 shall be placed to the credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and
3 Driver Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the
4 Oklahoma Statutes.

5 E. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
6 subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various
7 counties as set forth in paragraph 2 of this subsection:

8 a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, seven and
9 nine one-hundredths percent (7.09%),

10 b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
11 30, 2002, seven and eighteen one-hundredths percent
12 (7.18%),

13 c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year
14 ending on June 30, 2015, seven and twenty-four one-
15 hundredths percent (7.24%),

16 d. for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year
17 ending on June 30, 2019, seven and twenty-four one-
18 hundredths percent (7.24%), but in no event shall the
19 amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this
20 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for
21 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts
22 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the
23 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and
24

1 e. for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all
2 subsequent years, seven and twenty-four one-hundredths
3 percent (7.24%), but in no event shall the amount
4 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this
5 subparagraph exceed the total amount apportioned for
6 the fiscal year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts
7 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the
8 credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver
9 Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the
10 Oklahoma Statutes.

11 2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e
12 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned as follows:
13 forty percent (40%) of such sum shall be distributed to the various
14 counties in that proportion which the county road mileage of each
15 county bears to the entire state road mileage as certified by the
16 Transportation Commission and the remaining sixty percent (60%) of
17 such sum shall be distributed to the various counties on the basis
18 which the population and area of each county bears to the total
19 population and area of the state. The population shall be as shown
20 by the last Federal Decennial Census or the most recent annual
21 estimate provided by the United States Bureau of the Census. The
22 funds shall be used for the purpose of constructing and maintaining
23 county highways; provided, however, the county treasurer may deposit
24 so much of the funds in the sinking fund as may be necessary for the

1 retirement of interest and annual accrual of indebtedness created by
2 the issuance of county or township bonds for road purposes. Such
3 deposits to the sinking fund shall not exceed forty percent (40%) of
4 the funds allocated to a county pursuant to this paragraph.

5 F. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in

7 treasurers of the respective counties and by them deposited in a
8 separate special revenue fund to be used by the county commissioners
9 in accordance with paragraph 2 of this subsection:

- 10 a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, two and
11 fifty-three one-hundredths percent (2.53%),
- 12 b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
13 30, 2002, two and fifty-six one-hundredths percent
14 (2.56%),
- 15 c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year
16 ending on June 30, 2015, two and fifty-nine one-
17 hundredths percent (2.59%),
- 18 d. for the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year

9 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the
10 credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver
11 Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the
12 Oklahoma Statutes.

13 2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e
14 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be used for the primary
15 purpose of matching federal funds for the construction of federal
16 aid projects on county roads, or constructing and maintaining county
17 or township highways and permanent bridges of such counties. The
18 distribution of monies apportioned by this paragraph shall be made
19 upon the basis of the current formula based upon road mileage, area
20 and population as related to county road improvement and maintenance
21 costs. Provided, however, the Department of Transportation may
22 update the formula factors from time to time as necessary to account
23 for changing conditions.

1 G. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
2 subsection A of this section shall be transmitted by the Tax
3 Commission to the various counties as set forth in paragraph 2 of
4 this subsection:

5 a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, three and
6 fifty-five one-hundredths percent (3.55%),

7 b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
8 30, 2002, three and fifty-nine one-hundredths percent
9 (3.59%),

10 c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year

12 in excess of such limitation shall be placed to the
13 credit of the General Revenue Fund, and
14 e. for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and all

16 (0.83%), but in no event shall the amount apportioned
17 in any fiscal year pursuant to this subparagraph
18 exceed the total amount apportioned for the fiscal
19 year ending on June 30, 2015. Any amounts in excess
20 of such limitation shall be placed to the credit of
21 the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and Driver Safety Fund
22 created in Section 1521 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma

1 2. The monies apportioned pursuant to subparagraphs a through e
2 of paragraph 1 of this subsection shall be apportioned to the
3 various counties based upon the proportion that each county's
4 population bears to the total state population.

5 Each county's allocation of funds shall be remitted to the
6 various county treasurers to be deposited in the general fund of the
7 county and used for the support of county government.

8 I. 1. The following percentages of the monies referred to in
9 subsection A of this section shall be apportioned to the various
10 cities and incorporated towns as set forth in paragraph 2 of this
11 subsection:

12 a. from October 1, 2000, until June 30, 2001, three and
13 four one-hundredths percent (3.04%),

14 b. for the year beginning July 1, 2001, and ending June
15 30, 2002, three and eight one-hundredths percent
16 (3.08%),

17 c. for the year beginning July 1, 2002, through the year
18 ending on June 30, 2015, three and ten one-hundredths

19 funds shall be remitted to the various county treasurers for

24 the county excise board, transfer any surplus funds to the general

13 K. Three one-hundredths of one percent (3/100 of 1%) of the
14 monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted
15 to the State Treasurer to be credited to the Wildlife Conservation
16 Fund. Seventy-five percent (75%) of the funds shall be used for
17 fish habitat restoration and twenty-five percent (25%) of the funds
18 shall be used in the fish hatchery system for fish production.

19 L. 1. For the year beginning July 1, 2007, and ending June 30,
20 2008, five percent (5%) of monies referred to in subsection A of
21 this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited
22 to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as created in

14 to the State Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for
15 Roads and Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the

17 5. For the year beginning July 1, 2013, and ending June 30,
18 2014, eighteen percent (18%) of monies referred to in subsection A
19 of this section shall be remitted to the State Treasurer to be
20 credited to the County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as

22 6. For the year beginning July 1, 2014, twenty percent (20%) of
23 monies referred to in subsection A of this section shall be remitted
24 to the State Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for

1 Roads and Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the
2 Oklahoma Statutes.

3 7. For the year beginning July 1, 2015, through the year ending
4 on June 30, 2019, twenty percent (20%) of monies referred to in
5 subsection A of this section shall be remitted to the State
6 Treasurer to be credited to the County Improvements for Roads and
7 Bridges Fund as created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma
8 Statutes, but in no event shall the total amount apportioned in any
9 fiscal year pursuant to this paragraph exceed One Hundred Twenty
10 Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00). Any amounts in excess of One
11 Hundred Twenty Million Dollars (\$120,000,000.00) shall be placed to
12 the credit of the General Revenue Fund.

13 8. a. Except as provided in subparagraph b of this
14 paragraph, for the year beginning July 1, 2019, and
15 all subsequent years, twenty percent (20%) of monies
16 referred to in subsection A of this section shall be
17 remitted to the State Treasurer to be credited to the
18 County Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund as
19 created in Section 507 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma
20 Statutes, but in no event shall the total amount
21 apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to this
22 paragraph exceed the fiscal year limitations provided
23 in subparagraph c of this paragraph. Any amounts in
24 excess of the fiscal year limitations provided in

1 subparagraph c of this paragraph shall be placed to
2 the credit of the Rebuilding Oklahoma Access and
3 Driver Safety Fund created in Section 1521 of Title 69
4 of the Oklahoma Statutes,

5 b. (1) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021,
6 through the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, the
7 Oklahoma Tax Commission shall remit twenty-five
8 percent (25%) of the monthly allocation,
9 otherwise scheduled to be credited to the County
10 Improvements for Roads and Bridges Fund, to the
11 various counties of the state. The Commission
12 shall distribute such funds monthly to each
13 county treasurer as follows:

14 (a) one-third (1/3) of such funds shall be
15 distributed to the various counties in the
16 proportion which the area of each county
17 bears to the total area of the state,

18 (b) one-third (1/3) of such funds shall be

15 shall distribute such funds monthly to each

11 Each county treasurer shall deposit such funds to the
12 county's county highway fund and such funds shall be used
13 for maintenance and operations. In no event shall the
14 total amount apportioned in any fiscal year pursuant to the
15 provisions of subparagraphs a and b of this paragraph
16 exceed the fiscal year limitations provided in subparagraph
17 c of this paragraph, and

18 c. the total amount apportioned each fiscal year pursuant
19 to this paragraph shall be limited as follows:

11 N. Monies allocated to counties by this section may be
12 estimated by the county excise board in the budget for the county as

14 previous year's income from such source; provided, not more than
15 fifteen percent (15%) can be encumbered during any month.

16 O. Notwithstanding any other provisions of this section, for
17 the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, the first One Hundred
18 Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) of the monies collected or received
19 by the Tax Commission pursuant to the registration of motorcycles
20 and mopeds in this state shall be placed to the credit of the
21 Oklahoma Tax Commission Revolving Fund.

22 SECTION 11. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1135.5, as
23 last amended by Section 23 of Enrolled Senate Bill No. 782 of the

1 1st Session of the 59th Oklahoma Legislature (47 O.S. Supp. 2022,
2 Section 1135.5), is amended to read as follows:

3 Section 1135.5. A. Service Oklahoma is hereby authorized to
4 design and issue appropriate official special license plates to
5 persons wishing to demonstrate support and provide financial
6 assistance as provided by this section.

7 Special license plates shall not be transferred to any other
8 person but shall be removed from the vehicle upon transfer of
9 ownership and retained. The special license plate may then be used
10 on another vehicle but only after such other vehicle has been
11 registered for the current year with a licensed operator.

12 Special license plates shall be renewed each year by Service
13 Oklahoma or a licensed operator, unless authorized by Service
14 Oklahoma to be renewed for a period greater than one (1) year.
15 Service Oklahoma shall notify by mail all persons issued special
16 license plates. The notice shall contain all necessary information
17 and shall contain instructions for the renewal procedure upon
18 presentation to a licensed operator or Service Oklahoma. The
19 license plates shall be issued on a staggered system.

20 Service Oklahoma is hereby directed to develop and implement a
21 system whereby licensed operators are permitted to accept
22 applications for special license plates authorized under this
23 section. The licensed operator shall confirm the applicant's
24 eligibility, if applicable, collect and deposit any amount

1 specifically authorized by law, accept and process the necessary
2 information directly into such system and generate a receipt
3 accordingly. For performance of these duties, licensed operators
4 shall retain the fee provided in Section 1141.1 of this title for
5 registration of a motor vehicle through June 30, 2025. ~~The licensed~~
6 ~~operator fees for acceptance of applications and renewals shall be~~
7 ~~paid out of the Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund. Beginning~~
8 ~~January 1, 2023, Through June 30, 2025,~~ the licensed operator fees
9 for acceptance of applications and renewals shall be paid out of the
10 Service Oklahoma Reimbursement Fund. Beginning July 1, 2023, fees
11 shall be retained by the licensed operator pursuant to subsection E
12 of Section 1141.1 of this title.

13 If fewer than one hundred of any type of special license plates
14 authorized prior to January 1, 2004, are issued prior to January 1,
15 2006, Service Oklahoma shall discontinue issuance and renewal of
16 that type of special license plate. Any such authorized special
17 license plate registrant shall be allowed to display the license
18 plate upon the designated vehicle until the registration expiration
19 date. After such time the expired special license plate shall be
20 removed from the vehicle.

21 For special license plates authorized on or after July 1, 2004,
22 no special license plates shall be developed or issued by Service
23 Oklahoma until Service Oklahoma receives one hundred prepaid
24 applications therefor. The prepaid applications must be received by

1 Service Oklahoma within one hundred eighty (180) days of the
2 effective date of the authorization or the authority to issue shall
3 be null and void. In the event one hundred prepaid applications are
4 not received by Service Oklahoma within such prescribed time period
5 any payment so received shall be refunded accordingly.

6 B. The special license plates provided by this section are as
7 follows:

8 1. University or College Supporter License Plate - such plates
9 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
10 support to any state-supported or private university or college. As
11 provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be
12 apportioned as provided in Section 1104.1 of this title;

13 2. Environmental Awareness License Plate - such plates shall be
14 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to Service
15 Oklahoma by the Department of Environmental Quality in consultation
16 with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any person wishing to
17 demonstrate support to implement the statewide general public
18 Environmental Education Program created pursuant to the provisions
19 of the Oklahoma Environmental Quality Code. Such plates shall be
20 designed and issued to any person in any combination of numbers and
21 letters from one to a maximum of seven, as for personalized license
22 plates. A dealer's license plate issued pursuant to Section 1116.1
23 or 1128 of this title may be designated an Environmental Awareness
24 License Plate upon payment of the fee imposed by this section and

1 any other registration fees required by the Oklahoma Vehicle License
2 and Registration Act. As provided in this section, an amount of the
3 fee collected shall be apportioned pursuant to Section 1104.2 of
4 this title;

5 3. Firefighter License Plate - such plates shall be designed
6 for any career or retired firefighter, volunteer or paid.

7 Firefighters may apply for firefighter plates for up to four
8 vehicles with a rated capacity of one (1) ton or less or for a
9 motorcycle upon proof of a fire department membership by either an
10 identification card or letter from the chief of the fire department.
11 Retirees who are eligible for such plates shall provide proof of
12 eligibility upon initial application, but shall not be required to
13 provide proof of eligibility annually. The surviving spouse of any
14 deceased firefighter, if the spouse has not since remarried, may
15 apply for a firefighter license plate for one vehicle with a rated
16 carrying capacity of one (1) ton or less or for a motorcycle upon
17 proof that the deceased firefighter was a member of a fire
18 department by either an identification card or letter from the chief
19 of the fire department. The license plate shall be designed in
20 consultation with the Oklahoma State Firefighters Association.

21 As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected
22 shall be deposited to the Oklahoma State Firemen's Museum Building &
23 Memorial Fund for support of the Oklahoma State Firefighters Museum
24 and the Oklahoma Fallen and Living Firefighters Memorial;

1 4. Wildlife Conservation License Plate - such plates shall be
2 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to Service
3 Oklahoma by the Department of Wildlife Conservation in consultation
4 with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any person wishing to
5 demonstrate support for wildlife conservation in this state through
6 the Wildlife Diversity Fund, provided for in Section 3-310 of Title
7 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Such plates may be designed and issued
8 to any person as for personalized license plates.

9 As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected
10 shall be apportioned pursuant to subsection D of Section 3-310 of
11 Title 29 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

12 5. Child Abuse Prevention License Plate - such plates shall be
13 designed, subject to the criteria to be presented to Service
14 Oklahoma by the Office of Child Abuse Prevention in the State
15 Department of Health and the Child Abuse Prevention Action
16 Committee, and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support
17 for the prevention of child abuse.

18 As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected
19 shall be deposited in the Child Abuse Prevention Fund;

20 6. United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee Supporter
21 License Plate - such plates shall be designed and issued to any
22 person wishing to demonstrate support for the United States Olympic
23 and Paralympic Committee. The plates shall be issued to any person
24 in any combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of

1 seven, as for personalized license plates. The plate shall contain
2 the official United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee logo.
3 Service Oklahoma shall be authorized, if necessary, to enter into a
4 licensing agreement with the United States Olympic and Paralympic
5 Committee for any licensing fees which may be required in order to
6 use the United States Olympic and Paralympic Committee logo or
7 design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment of not
8 more than Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for each license plate
9 issued;

10 7. Oklahoma History License Plate - such plates shall be
11 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate interest in
12 Oklahoma history. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee
13 collected shall be deposited to the Oklahoma Historical Society
14 Revolving Fund to be used for educational purposes;

15 8. Historic Route 66 License Plate - such:

16 a. vehicle plates shall be designed to honor historic
17 Route 66, also known as the "Mother Road". As
18 provided in this section, an amount of the fee
19 collected for each vehicle license plate shall be
20 apportioned to the Oklahoma Historical Society
21 Revolving Fund to be distributed to the Oklahoma Route
22 66 Museum located in Clinton, Oklahoma, and
23 b. motorcycle plates shall be designed in consultation
24 with the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, Inc. Service

1 Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a licensing
2 agreement with the Oklahoma Route 66 Association,
3 Inc., for any licensing fees which may be required in
4 order to use the Oklahoma Route 66 Association, Inc.,
5 logo or design. The licensing agreement shall provide
6 for a payment to the Oklahoma Route 66 Association,
7 Inc., of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for
8 each motorcycle license plate issued;

9 9. Heart of the Heartland License Plate - such plates shall be
10 designed and issued to any person wishing to honor the victims of
11 the terrorist bombing attack on the Alfred P. Murrah Federal
12 Building in downtown Oklahoma City on April 19, 1995. As provided
13 in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be deposited
14 in the Heart of the Heartland Scholarship Fund, as established in
15 Section 2282 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

16 10. Emergency Medical Technician License Plate - such plates
17 shall be designed and issued to any person who is an emergency
18 medical technician. Such persons may apply for an emergency medical
19 technician license plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying
20 capacity of one (1) ton or less upon proof of an emergency medical
21 technician's license. The license plate shall be designed in

23 Association. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee
24 collected shall be apportioned to the Emergency Medical Personnel

1 Death Benefit Revolving Fund created in Section 1-2505.2 of Title 63
2 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

3 11. Fight Breast Cancer License Plate - such plates shall be
4 designed to demonstrate support for the prevention and treatment of
5 breast cancer in this state;

6 12. Crime Victims Awareness License Plate - such plates shall
7 be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
8 awareness of and support for victims of crimes. The license plates
9 shall be designed in consultation with the Crime Victims
10 Compensation Program. As provided in this section, an amount of the
11 fee collected shall be apportioned to the Attorney General's
12 Revolving Fund for the Office of the Attorney General, which is
13 hereby directed to use such funds to contract with a statewide
14 nonprofit organization to provide services to crime victims;

15 13. Safe Kids Oklahoma License Plate - such plates shall be
16 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support and
17 awareness of the Safe Kids Oklahoma. The license plate shall be
18 designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Safe Kids Association.
19 As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be
20 deposited in the Children's Hospital - Oklahoma Safe Kids
21 Association Revolving Fund to be distributed to the Safe Kids
22 Oklahoma program;

23 14. Oklahoma Four-H Club License Plate - such plates shall be
24 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to Service Oklahoma by

1 the Four-H Foundation, and issued to any person wishing to
2 demonstrate support of the Oklahoma Four-H Club. Such plates may be
3 designed and issued to any person as for personalized license
4 plates. As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected
5 shall be apportioned to the OSU Extension Service License Plate
6 Revolving Fund created in Section 1104.4 of this title;

7 15. Agricultural Awareness License Plate - such plates shall be
8 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to Service Oklahoma,
9 by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food, and Forestry in
10 consultation with the Oklahoma Arts Council, and issued to any
11 person wishing to demonstrate support of the Department's Ag in the
12 Classroom Education Program. As provided in this section, an amount
13 of the fee collected shall be apportioned as provided in Section
14 1104.3 of this title;

15 16. Oklahoma Statehood Centennial License Plate - such plates
16 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to commemorate
17 the centennial of Oklahoma's admission to statehood in 1907. The
18 license plates shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma
19 Capitol Complex and Centennial Commemoration Commission. As
20 provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be
21 deposited in the Oklahoma Department of Commerce Revolving Fund
22 created in Section 5012 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

23 17. Support Education License Plate - such plates shall be
24 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to Service Oklahoma by

1 the State Department of Education in consultation with the Oklahoma
2 Arts Council, and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
3 support for education in this state. All licensed operators shall
4 display a sample of the Support Education License plate in the area
5 of the business accessed by the public. Twenty-three Dollars
6 (\$23.00) of the fee collected shall be apportioned as follows:

- 7 a. five percent (5%) shall be deposited to the Education
8 Reform Revolving Fund,
- 9 b. five percent (5%) shall be deposited to the Oklahoma
10 State Regents for Higher Education Revolving Fund,

20 shall contain the official Boy Scouts of America logo. Service
21 Oklahoma shall be authorized, if necessary, to enter into a
22 licensing agreement with the Boy Scouts of America for any licensing
23 fees which may be required in order to use the Boy Scouts of America
24 logo or design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment

1 to the Boy Scouts of America of not more than Twenty Dollars
2 (\$20.00) for each license plate issued;

3 20. Urban Forestry and Beautification License Plate - such
4 plates shall be designed, subject to criteria to be presented to
5 Service Oklahoma, by the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food,
6 and Forestry in consultation with nonprofit organizations in this
7 state that develop and operate programs to encourage urban forestry
8 and beautification, and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
9 support of such programs. As provided in this section, an amount of
10 the fee collected shall be apportioned as provided in Section 1104.5
11 of this title;

12 21. Oklahoma State Parks Supporter License Plate - such plates
13 shall be designed, subject to criteria to be presented to Serve
14 Oklahoma by the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation Department, and
15 issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for the Oklahoma
16 state parks system. Twenty-three Dollars (\$23.00) of the fee
17 collected shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Tourism and Recreation
18 Department Revolving Fund. Such money shall be designated for and
19 may only be expended for the support of Oklahoma state parks;

20 22. Adoption Creates Families License Plate - such plates shall
21 be issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support of pregnant
22 women who are committed to placing their children for adoption and
23 wishing to provide assistance to guardians, adoptive parents and
24 other created families to assist in the adoption and placement of

1 children in permanent, safe homes. The license plates shall be
2 designed and final terminology delivered in consultation with the
3 Oklahoma Adoption Coalition and the Department of Human Services.
4 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) of the fee collected shall be deposited
5 in a revolving fund established in the State Treasury for and to be
6 used by the Department of Human Services for the implementation of
7 the Investing in Stronger Oklahoma Families Act specifically for
8 created families;

9 23. Choose Life License Plate - such plates shall be designed,
10 subject to criteria presented to Service Oklahoma, by Choose Life
11 America, Inc., and issued to any person who wishes to demonstrate
12 support of organizations that encourage adoption as a positive
13 choice for women with unplanned pregnancies. As provided in this
14 section, an amount of the fee collected shall be deposited in the
15 Choose Life Assistance Program Revolving Fund established in Section
16 1104.6 of this title;

17 24. Future Farmers of America License Plate - such plates shall
18 be designed and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support for
19 the Oklahoma FFA Association (formerly known as Future Farmers of
20 America). The license plates shall be designed in consultation with
21 the Oklahoma FFA Association Board of Directors. As provided in
22 this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be apportioned as
23 provided in Section 1104.7 of this title;

24

1 25. Lions Club License Plate - such plates shall be designed
2 and issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support for the Lions
3 Clubs of Oklahoma. The plates shall be issued to any person in any
4 combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of seven,
5 as for personalized license plates. The license plates shall be
6 designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Lions Service Foundation
7 and shall contain the official logo of the International Association
8 of Lions Clubs. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into
9 a licensing agreement with the Oklahoma Lions Service Foundation.
10 The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to the Oklahoma
11 Lions Service Foundation of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for
12 each license plate issued;

13 26. Color Oklahoma License Plate - such plates shall be
14 designed, subject to criteria to be presented to Service Oklahoma by
15 the Oklahoma Native Plant Society, and issued to any person wishing
16 to demonstrate support for preserving and planting wildflowers and
17 native plants in this state and to promote Oklahoma's wildflower
18 heritage through education. As provided in this section, an amount
19 of the fee collected shall be apportioned as provided in Section
20 1104.8 of this title;

21 27. Girl Scouts of the United States of America Supporter
22 License Plate - such plates shall be designed and issued to any
23 person wishing to demonstrate support for the Girl Scouts of the
24 United States of America. The plates shall be issued to any person

1 in any combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of
2 seven, as for personalized license plates. The plate shall contain
3 the official Girl Scouts of the United States of America logo.
4 Service Oklahoma shall be authorized, if necessary, to enter into a
5 licensing agreement with the Girl Scouts of the United States of
6 America for any licensing fees which may be required in order to use
7 the Girl Scouts of the United States of America logo or design. The
8 licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to the Magic Empire
9 Council of Girl Scouts, acting on behalf of all Oklahoma Girl Scout
10 councils, of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license
11 plate issued;

12 28. Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon License Plate - such plates
13 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
14 support for the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon. The plate shall be
15 designed in consultation with the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon.
16 Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a licensing
17 agreement with the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon for any licensing
18 fees which may be required in order to use the Oklahoma City
19 Memorial Marathon logo or design. The licensing agreement shall
20 provide for a payment to the Oklahoma City Memorial Marathon of not
21 more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license plate issued;

22 29. Oklahoma Scenic Rivers License Plate - such plates shall be

15 consultation with the Veterinary Medical Association. Twenty
16 Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee collected shall be designated by the
17 purchaser of the plate to be deposited in the Oklahoma Pet
18 Overpopulation Fund created in Section 2368.13 of Title 68 of the
19 Oklahoma Statutes or the Animal Friendly Revolving Fund created in
20 Section 1104.10 of this title;

21 32. Patriot License Plate - such plates shall be designed in
22 consultation with the Military Department of the State of Oklahoma

1 deployed on active duty. The plates shall be issued to any person
2 in any combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of
3 seven, as for personalized license plates. As provided in this
4 section, a portion of the fee collected shall be deposited in the
5 Patriot License Plate Revolving Fund created in Section 1104.11 of
6 this title;

7 33. Global War on Terrorism License Plate - such plate shall be
8 designed in consultation with the Military Department of the State
9 of Oklahoma and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support
10 for Oklahoma residents who are members of the Armed Forces of the
11 United States or Oklahoma National Guard that have served in the
12 Global War on Terrorism. The plate shall be issued to any person in
13 any combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of six.
14 As provided in this section, a portion of the fee collected shall be
15 deposited in the Oklahoma National Guard Museum Fund created in
16 Section 235.1 of Title 44 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

17 34. Boys and Girls Clubs of America Supporter License Plate -
18 such plates shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to
19 demonstrate support for the Boys and Girls Clubs of America. The
20 plates shall be issued to any person in any combination of numbers
21 and letters from one to a maximum of seven, as for personalized
22 license plates. The plate shall contain the official Boys and Girls
23 Clubs of America logo. Service Oklahoma, if necessary, may enter
24 into a licensing agreement with the Boys and Girls Clubs of America

1 for any licensing fees which may be required in order to use the
2 Boys and Girls Clubs of America logo or design. The licensing
3 agreement shall provide for a payment to the Boys and Girls Clubs of
4 America of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license
5 plate issued;

6 35. Oklahoma Quarter Horse License Plate - such plates shall be
7 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for
8 the American Quarter Horse in this state. The plate shall be
9 designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Quarter Horse
10 Association. As provided in this section, a portion of the fee
11 collected shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Quarter Horse Revolving
12 Fund created in Section 1104.12 of this title;

13 36. Oklahoma Association for the Deaf License Plate - such
14 plates shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma
15 Association for the Deaf and issued to any person wishing to
16 demonstrate support for Oklahoma residents who are deaf. The plates
17 shall be issued to any person in any combination of numbers and
18 letters from one to a maximum of seven, as for personalized license
19 plates. As provided in this section, a portion of the fee collected
20 shall be deposited in the Oklahoma Association for the Deaf License
21 Plate Revolving Fund created in Section 1104.15 of this title;

22 37. Oklahoma City Zoo License Plate - such plates shall be
23 issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for the Oklahoma
24 City Zoo. The license plates shall be designed in consultation with

1 the Oklahoma Zoological Society, Inc. As provided in this section,
2 an amount of the fee collected shall be deposited in the Oklahoma
3 Zoological Society Revolving Fund created in Section 1104.13 of this
4 title;

5 38. March of Dimes License Plate - such plates shall be issued
6 to persons wishing to demonstrate support for the March of Dimes
7 mission to improve the health of babies by preventing birth defects,
8 premature birth and infant mortality. The license plates shall be
9 designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Chapter March of Dimes.
10 As provided in this section, an amount of the fee collected shall be
11 deposited in the Oklahoma Prevent Birth Defects, Premature Birth and
12 Infant Mortality Fund established in Section 1104.14 of this title;

13 39. Support Our Troops Supporter License Plate - such plates
14 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
15 support for Support Our Troops Incorporated. The plates shall be
16 issued to any person in any combination of numbers and letters from
17 one to a maximum of six. The plate shall contain the official
18 Support Our Troops Incorporated logo which includes the mark
19 "Support Our Troops" across the bottom of the plate. Service
20 Oklahoma, if necessary, may enter into a licensing agreement with
21 Support Our Troops Incorporated for any licensing fees which may be
22 required in order to use the Support Our Troops Incorporated logo or
23 design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to
24

1 Support Our Troops Incorporated of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for
2 each license plate issued;

3 40. Folds of Honor Supporter License Plate - such plates shall
4 be authorized to be designed and issued to any person wishing to
5 demonstrate support for the Oklahoma City Chapter of Folds of Honor
6 Incorporated, a nonprofit charitable organization exempt from
7 taxation pursuant to the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code, 26
8 U.S.C., Section 501(c)(3), providing educational scholarships to
9 spouses and children of America's fallen and disabled military
10 service members. The plates shall be issued to any person in any
11 combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of six.
12 Such person may apply for a Folds of Honor Supporter license plate
13 for a motorcycle; provided, the license plate for motorcycles may be

18 plates shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Women
19 Veterans Organization. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to
20 enter into a licensing agreement with the Oklahoma Women Veterans
21 Organization for any licensing fees which may be required in order
22 to use the organization's logo or design. The licensing agreement
23 shall provide for a payment to the Oklahoma Women Veterans

24

1 Organization of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each
2 license plate issued;

3 95. FIRST (For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and
4 Technology) in Oklahoma License Plate - such plates shall be issued
5 to any person wishing to demonstrate support for FIRST in Oklahoma
6 Robotics programs. The license plates shall be designed in
7 consultation with the administration of FIRST in Oklahoma. Service
8 Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a licensing agreement
9 with FIRST in Oklahoma for any licensing fees which may be required
10 in order to use the FIRST in Oklahoma logo or design. The licensing
11 agreement shall provide for a payment to FIRST in Oklahoma of not
12 more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license plate issued;

13 96. Pittsburg State University License Plate - such plates
14 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate
15 support for the Pittsburg State University. The license plates
16 shall be designed in consultation with Pittsburg State University.
17 Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a licensing
18 agreement with Pittsburg State University for any licensing fees
19 which may be required in order to use the school foundation's logo
20 or design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to
21 the Pittsburg State University of not more than Twenty Dollars
22 (\$20.00) for each license plate issued;

23 97. Greenwood Historical District License Plate - such plates
24 shall be issued to persons wishing to demonstrate support for the

1 Tulsa Juneteenth Festival held in the Greenwood Historical District
2 in Tulsa, Oklahoma. The plates shall be issued to any person in any
3 combination of numbers and letters from one to a maximum of seven,
4 as for personalized license plates. The license plates shall be
5 designed in consultation with the Black Wall Street Chamber of
6 Commerce. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a
7 licensing agreement with the Tulsa Juneteenth Festival for any
8 licensing fees which may be required in order to use the Festival's
9 logo or design. For each license plate issued, the licensing
10 agreement shall provide for a payment of Twenty-five Dollars
11 (\$25.00) of the fee collected to the Tulsa Juneteenth Festival and
12 an additional Two Dollars (\$2.00) of the fee collected shall be
13 deposited in the Public School Classroom Support Revolving Fund, for
14 expenditure as provided in Section 1-123 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma
15 Statutes;

16 98. Oklahoma Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary Chapters
17 License Plate - such plates shall be designed to honor the Oklahoma
18 Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary Chapters and issued to any
19 resident of this state upon proof of membership in the Oklahoma
20 Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary organization in this state. The
21 license plates shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma
22 Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary organization. Service Oklahoma
23 shall be authorized to enter into a licensing agreement with the
24 Oklahoma Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary organization for any

1 licensing fees which may be required in order to use the
2 organization's logo or design. The licensing agreement shall
3 provide for a payment to the Oklahoma Veterans of Foreign Wars
4 Auxiliary organization of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for
5 each license plate issued;

6 99. Transportation to Transportation License Plate - such
7 plates shall be designed and issued to persons wishing to support
8 county roads and bridges. The license plates shall be designed in
9 consultation with the Association of County Commissioners of
10 Oklahoma. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fee collected shall be
11 paid to the county treasurer for the county in which the license
12 plate was purchased to be credited to the county highway fund
13 created pursuant to Section 1503 of Title 69 of the Oklahoma
14 Statutes;

15 100. Blue Star Mothers License Plate - such plates shall be
16 designed and issued to any person showing proof of membership in an
17 Oklahoma Chapter of Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc. The license
18 plates shall be designed in consultation with Blue Star Mothers of
19 America, Inc., Oklahoma Chapter One. Service Oklahoma shall be
20 authorized to enter into a licensing agreement with Blue Star
21 Mothers of America, Inc., Oklahoma Chapter One for any licensing
22 fees which may be required in order to use the Blue Star Mothers of
23 America logo or design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a
24 payment to Blue Star Mothers of America, Inc., Oklahoma Chapter One

1 of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license plate
2 issued;

3 101. Oklahoma Golf License Plate - such plates shall be
4 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for
5 the sport of golf in this state. The license plates shall be
6 designed in consultation with the South Central Section of the
7 Professional Golfers' Association of America and issued to any
8 person wishing to demonstrate support for the sport of golf in this
9 state. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a
10 licensing agreement with the South Central Section of the
11 Professional Golfers' Association of America for any licensing fees
12 which may be required in order to use the organization's logo or
13 design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to the
14 South Central Section of the Professional Golfers' Association of
15 America of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license
16 plate issued;

17 102. Paramedic License Plate - such plates shall be designed
18 and issued to any person who is a paramedic. Such persons may apply
19 for a paramedic license plate for each vehicle with a rated carrying
20 capacity of one (1) ton or less or a motorcycle upon proof of a
21 paramedic license. The license plates shall be designed in
22 consultation with the Oklahoma State University-Oklahoma City
23 Paramedicine program and the Oklahoma Emergency Medical Technicians
24 Association. The letters "PM" shall be placed on the plate followed

1 by four random numbers, or such numbers as requested by such persons
2 applying for the plate. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) of the fees
3 collected shall be deposited in the Emergency Medical Personnel
4 Death Benefit Revolving Fund created in Section 1-2505.2 of Title 63
5 of the Oklahoma Statutes. Subject to the provisions of subsection A
6 of this section, the Paramedic License Plate is hereby reauthorized
7 effective November 1, 2022;

8 103. National Defense Service Medal License Plate - such plates
9 shall be designed and issued to those persons who have received the
10 National Defense Service Medal and wish to demonstrate support for
11 the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs. The license plates
12 shall be designed in consultation with the Oklahoma Department of
13 Veterans Affairs. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter
14 into a licensing agreement with the Oklahoma Department of Veterans
15 Affairs for any licensing fees which may be required in order to use
16 the Department's logo or design. The licensing agreement shall
17 provide for a payment to the Oklahoma Department of Veterans Affairs
18 of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license plate
19 issued;

20 104. University of Oklahoma RUF/NEKS License Plate - such
21 plates shall be designed and issued to any past or present member of
22 the University of Oklahoma RUF/NEKS upon providing proof of
23 membership in the organization as may be required by Service
24 Oklahoma. The license plates shall be designed in consultation with

1 the University of Oklahoma RUF/NEKS. Service Oklahoma shall be
2 authorized to enter into a licensing agreement with the University
3 of Oklahoma RUF/NEKS for any licensing fees which may be required in
4 order to use the organization's logo or design. The licensing
5 agreement shall provide for a payment to the Mike James RUF/NEKS
6 Memorial Scholarship of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for
7 each license plate issued;

8 105. Tulsa Community College License Plate - such plates shall
9 be issued to persons wishing to support Tulsa Community College.
10 The plates shall be designed in consultation with Tulsa Community
11 College. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a
12 licensing agreement with Tulsa Community College for any licensing
13 fees which may be required in order to use the organization's logo
14 or design. The licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to
15 Tulsa Community College of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for
16 each license plate issued;

17 106. Street Kings Car Club License Plate - such plates shall be
18 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for
19 the Street Kings Car Club in Guthrie. The license plates shall be
20 designed in consultation with the Street Kings Car Club. Service
21 Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into a licensing agreement
22 with the Street Kings Car Club for any licensing fees which may be
23 required in order to use the organization's logo or design. The
24 licensing agreement shall provide for a payment to the Street Kings

1 Car Club of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license
2 plate issued;

3 107. Epilepsy Foundation License Plate - such plates shall be
4 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for
5 the Epilepsy Foundation. The license plates shall be designed in
6 consultation with the Epilepsy Foundation of Oklahoma. Service
7 Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into licensing agreements with
8 the Epilepsy Foundation for any licensing fees which may be required
9 in order to use the organization's logo or design. The licensing
10 agreement shall provide for a payment to the Epilepsy Foundation of
11 not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license plate issued;

12 108. America First License Plate - such plates shall be
13 designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate support for
14 the proclamation of "America First". The license plates shall be
15 designed in consultation with Warriors for Freedom and the Honoring
16 America's Warriors Foundations. Service Oklahoma shall be
17 authorized to enter into licensing agreements with the Warriors for
18 Freedom and Honoring America's Warriors Foundations for any
19 licensing fees which may be required in order to use the
20 Foundations' logos or designs. The licensing agreements shall
21 provide for a payment to the Honoring America's Warriors Foundation
22 of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) and a payment to the Warriors
23 for Freedom Foundation of not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for
24 each license plate issued;

1 109. Diabetes Awareness License Plate - such plates shall be
2 designed and issued to any person wishing to provide financial
3 support for Diabetes Solutions of Oklahoma. The license plates
4 shall be designed in consultation with Diabetes Solutions of
5 Oklahoma. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into
6 licensing agreements with Diabetes Solutions of Oklahoma for any
7 licensing fees which may be required in order to use the Diabetes
8 Solutions of Oklahoma logos or designs. The licensing agreements
9 shall provide for a deposit to the Diabetes Awareness License Plate
10 Revolving Fund established in Section 1104.33 of this title;

11 110. Alliance of Mental Health Providers of Oklahoma License
12 Plate - such plates shall be designed and issued to any person
13 wishing to demonstrate support for the Alliance of Mental Health
14 Providers of Oklahoma. The license plates shall be designed in
15 consultation with the Alliance of Mental Health Providers of
16 Oklahoma. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to enter into
17 licensing agreements with the Alliance of Mental Health Providers of
18 Oklahoma for any licensing fees which may be required in order to
19 use the organization's logo or design. The licensing agreement
20 shall provide for a payment to the Alliance of Mental Health
21 Providers of Oklahoma of not more than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for
22 each license plate issued; and

23 111. Stillwater Public Schools License Plate - such plates
24 shall be designed and issued to any person wishing to demonstrate

1 support for the Stillwater School District. The license plates
2 shall be designed in consultation with the administration of the
3 Stillwater School District. Service Oklahoma shall be authorized to
4 enter into a licensing agreement with the Stillwater School District
5 for any licensing fees which may be required in order to use the
6 school district's logo or design. The licensing agreement shall
7 provide for a payment to the Stillwater School District of not more
8 than Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) for each license plate issued.

9 C. The fee for such plates shall be Thirty-five Dollars
10 (\$35.00) per year of renewal and shall be in addition to all other
11 registration fees provided by the Oklahoma Vehicle License and
12 Registration Act. The fee shall be apportioned as follows through
13 June 30, 2023:

14 1. Twenty Dollars (\$20.00) per year of renewal or any other
15 amount as provided in this title of the fee shall be apportioned as
16 provided or deposited in a fund as specified within the paragraph
17 authorizing the special license plate;

18 2. Eight Dollars (\$8.00) per year of renewal of the fee shall
19 be deposited in the Tax Commission Reimbursement Fund to be used for
20 the administration of the Oklahoma Vehicle License and Registration
21 Act. Beginning January 1, 2023, Eight Dollars (\$8.00) per year of
22 renewal of the fee shall be deposited in the Service Oklahoma
23 Reimbursement Fund to be used for the administration of the Oklahoma
24 Vehicle License and Registration Act; and

1 3. Any remaining amounts of the fee shall be apportioned as
2 provided in Section 1104 of this title.

3 SECTION 12. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1140, as
4 amended by Section 174, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.
5 2022, Section 1140), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 1140. A. The Service Oklahoma Operator Board shall
7 adopt rules prescribing minimum qualifications and requirements for
8 locating Service Oklahoma locations and for persons applying for a
9 license to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location. Such
10 qualifications and requirements shall include, but not be limited
11 to, the following:

12 1. Necessary job skills and experience;

13 2. Minimum office hours;

14 3. Provision for sufficient staffing, equipment, office space
15 and parking to provide maximum efficiency and maximum convenience to
16 the public;

17 4. Obtainment of a faithful performance surety bond as provided
18 for by law;

19 5. That the applicant has not been convicted of a felony and
20 that no felony charges are pending against the applicant;

21 6. That the location specified in the individual's application
22 for a license to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location not
23 be owned by a member of Service Oklahoma or an employee of Service
24 Oklahoma or any person related to a member of Service Oklahoma or an

1 employee of Service Oklahoma within the third degree by
2 consanguinity, marriage, or adoption and that the location not be
3 within a three-mile radius of an existing licensed operator unless
4 the applicant is assuming the location of an operating licensed
5 operator;

6 7. That a single website, designated by Service Oklahoma, will
7 be used for the distribution of services provided by Service
8 Oklahoma with motor vehicle services to be fulfilled by licensed
9 operators;

10 8. That licensed operators will attend all required training
11 provided by Service Oklahoma; and

12 9. That there should be at least one Service Oklahoma location
13 in each county.

14 B. 1. Any person making application to the Service Oklahoma
15 Operator Board for the purpose of obtaining a license to operate a
16 designated Service Oklahoma location shall pay, when submitting the
17 application, a nonrefundable application fee of One Hundred Dollars
18 (\$100.00). All such application fees shall be deposited in the
19 Oklahoma Tax Commission ~~Revolving~~ Fund. Beginning January 1, 2023,
20 all such application fees shall be deposited in the Service Oklahoma
21 Revolving Fund.

22 2. Any person making application to the Service Oklahoma
23 Operator Board for the purpose of obtaining a license to operate a
24 designated Service Oklahoma location must meet standardization and

1 branding requirements established by the Service Oklahoma Operator
2 Board, upon recommendations from Service Oklahoma. Upon approval,
3 the person must either pay a fee to Service Oklahoma for all costs
4 related to meeting the standardization and branding requirements or
5 obtain approval from the Service Oklahoma Operator Board that the
6 location meets all standardization and branding requirements. All
7 such fees shall be deposited in the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund.
8 The amount of the license fee will be determined by the Service
9 Oklahoma Operator Board. This provision shall not apply to any
10 existing Service Oklahoma location.

11 C. Upon application by a person to serve as a licensed
12 operator, the Service Oklahoma Operator Board is authorized to make
13 a determination whether such person and such location meets the
14 criteria and guidelines established by the Service Oklahoma Operator
15 Board and, if such be the case, may issue a license to operate a
16 designated Service Oklahoma location.

17 D. 1. A licensed operator may be permitted, upon application,
18 to sell or transfer an existing license to operate a designated
19 Service Oklahoma location. Any sale or transfer of a license is
20 subject to approval of the Service Oklahoma Operator Board. In
21 order to sell or transfer an existing licensed operator license, the
22 licensed operator shall meet the following guidelines and
23 requirements:

24

- a. the licensed operator shall be in good standing with the Service Oklahoma Operator Board,
- b. the licensed operator shall have held a licensed operator license, issued by the Service Oklahoma Operator Board, for a minimum of five (5) years, and
- c. the licensed operator shall provide the Service Oklahoma Operator Board evidence that the proposed buyer or transferee of the licensed operator licensee meets the qualifications and requirements set forth in subsection A of this section, has the ability to meet all financial requirements and terms of any current existing contract between the licensed operator and Service Oklahoma, and agrees to the onboarding and training requirements of Service Oklahoma, as established by Service Oklahoma and the Service Oklahoma Operator Board.

2. The purchase price of a licensed operator license shall be agreed upon by the licensed operator and the individual purchasing the license to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location. However, the purchaser or transferee agrees to pay a transfer fee to Service Oklahoma in the amount of three percent (3%) of the last annual gross revenue from fees retained at the Service Oklahoma location to be purchased, not to exceed Fifteen Thousand Dollars

1 (\$15,000.00). The transfer fee shall be deposited in the Service
2 Oklahoma Revolving Fund.

3 3. Upon receipt of the application to sell or transfer an
4 existing licensed operator license, the Service Oklahoma Operator
5 Board will determine whether the licensed operator license may be
6 sold or transferred on the condition that the existing location is
7 in good standing and the new licensee meets the requirements
8 outlined in Section 1140 et seq. of this title.

9 4. The Service Oklahoma Operator Board may, at its discretion,
10 buy back a licensed operator license from a licensed operator who
11 desires to sell or transfer its licensed operator license but has
12 held a licensed operator license issued by Service Oklahoma for less
13 than five (5) years. The purchase price for such a license will be
14 one-half (1/2) times the most recent annual gross revenue from fees
15 retained of that Service Oklahoma location, not to exceed Two
16 Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$200,000.00). The purchase price shall be
17 paid out of the excess funds available in the Licensed Operator
18 Performance Fund, created in Section 3-106 of this title, after
19 distribution to licensed operators, pursuant to Section 3-106 of
20 this title.

21 E. 1. Licensed operators shall be subject to all laws relating
22 to licensed operators and shall be subject to removal for cause by
23 the Service Oklahoma Operator Board. Any action taken by Service
24 Oklahoma to revoke a license shall be pursuant to and in accordance

1 with the provisions of the Administrative Procedures Act. For the
2 purposes of this section, "for cause" shall be defined as follows:

- 3 a. repeated violations of written contracts, rules,
4 regulations and statutes pertaining to licensed
5 operators after written warning by the Service
6 Oklahoma Operator Board and an opportunity to correct
7 such violations,
- 8 b. failure of the licensed operator to promptly remit
9 funds owed to Service Oklahoma upon written demand,
- 10 c. being charged with a felony crime involving dishonesty
11 or moral turpitude,
- 12 d. failure to timely file state and federal income tax
13 returns, or
- 14 e. any act of official misconduct as set forth in Section
15 93 of Title 51 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

16 In the event a license is revoked by the Service Oklahoma
17 Operator Board for cause, the Service Oklahoma location operated by
18 the licensed operator will be permanently closed and the licensed
19 operator shall not be entitled to any compensation.

20 Motor license agents and licensed operators in good standing as
21 of November 1, 2022, shall be exempt from the branding and physical
22 standardization requirements to be established by the Service
23 Oklahoma Operator Board, with the recommendation of the Director of
24 Service Oklahoma.

1 2. A license to operate a designated Service Oklahoma location
2 may be revoked by the Service Oklahoma Operator Board for failure to
3 meet the standards for customer satisfaction established by the
4 Service Oklahoma Operator Board. In the event of revocation, the
5 licensed operator shall sell his or her license to operate a Service
6 Oklahoma location to Service Oklahoma at a rate of one-half (1/2)
7 times the most recent annual gross revenue from fees retained of
8 that Service Oklahoma location, not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand
9 Dollars (\$200,000.00). The purchase price shall be paid out of the
10 excess funds available in the Licensed Operator Performance Fund,
11 created in Section 3-106 of this title, after distribution to
12 licensed operators, pursuant to Section 3-106 of this title.

13 F. All licensed operators shall be licensed by and under the
14 supervision of Service Oklahoma; provided, any agent authorized to
15 issue registrations pursuant to the International Registration Plan
16 shall also be under the supervision of the Corporation Commission,
17 subject to rules promulgated by the Corporation Commission pursuant
18 to the provisions of subsection E of Section 1166 of this title.
19 Service Oklahoma shall be the holder of all licenses and has the
20 right to approve and revoke such licenses. After obtaining a
21 license, any such licensed operator shall furnish and file with
22 Service Oklahoma a bond in such amount as may be fixed by Service
23 Oklahoma. Such licensed operator shall be removable at the will of
24 Service Oklahoma. Such licensed operator shall perform all duties

1 and do such things in the administration of the laws of this state
2 as shall be enjoined upon and required by the Service Oklahoma
3 Operator Board. Provided, Service Oklahoma may operate a Service
4 Oklahoma location in any county where a vacancy occurs, as
5 determined by Service Oklahoma.

6 G. In the event of a vacancy due to the death of a licensed
7 operator, the licensed operator's designee or a licensed operator
8 location employee shall immediately notify Service Oklahoma. A
9 licensed operator may designate an individual to continue to operate
10 the Service Oklahoma location upon the death of the licensed
11 operator. The designee shall apply to obtain a license to operate
12 the vacant licensed operator location with the Service Oklahoma
13 Operator Board within thirty (30) days of the licensed operator's
14 death. In the event that no designee is designated or that the
15 designee fails to apply to be a licensed operator with Service
16 Oklahoma within thirty (30) days, Service Oklahoma may take any and
17 all action it deems appropriate in order to provide for the orderly
18 transition and the maintenance of operations of the Service Oklahoma
19 location, as permitted by law.

20 H. When an application for registration is made with Service
21 Oklahoma, the Corporation Commission or a licensed operator, a
22 registration fee of One Dollar and seventy-five cents (\$1.75) shall
23 be collected for each license plate or decal issued. Such fees
24 shall be in addition to the registration fees on motor vehicles and

1 when an application for registration is made to the licensed
2 operator, such licensed operator shall retain a fee as provided in
3 Section 1141.1 of this title through June 30, 2023. Beginning July
4 1, 2023, the fee shall be retained by the licensed operator pursuant
5 to subsection E of Section 1141.1 of this title. When the fee is
6 paid by a person making application directly with Service Oklahoma
7 or the Corporation Commission, as applicable, the registration fees
8 shall be in the same amount as provided for licensed operators and
9 the fee provided by Section 1141.1 of this title shall be deposited
10 in the Oklahoma Tax Commission ~~Revolving~~ Fund or as provided in
11 Section 1167 of this title, as applicable. Beginning January 1,
12 2023, the fee provided by Section 1141.1 of this title shall be
13 deposited in the Service Oklahoma Revolving Fund or as provided in
14 Section 1167 of this title, as applicable. Service Oklahoma shall
15 prepare schedules of registration fees and charges for titles which
16 shall include the fees for such licensed operators and all fees and
17 charges paid by a person shall be listed separately on the
18 application and registration and totaled on the application and
19 registration. The licensed operators shall charge only such fees as
20 are specifically provided for by law, and all such authorized fees
21 shall be posted in such a manner that any person shall have notice
22 of all fees that are imposed by law.

23 I. Any licensed operator shall be responsible for all costs
24 incurred by Service Oklahoma when relocating an existing Service

1 Oklahoma location. The Service Oklahoma Operator Board may waive
2 payment of such costs in case of unforeseen business or emergency
3 conditions beyond the control of the licensed operator.

4 J. Any existing contracts by or between any motor license agent
5 and the Oklahoma Tax Commission shall be assigned to Service
6 Oklahoma. All existing motor license agents in good standing with
7 the Oklahoma Tax Commission will be offered a subsequent contract
8 from Service Oklahoma to become a licensed operator to take effect
9 on January 1, 2023. The contract between existing motor license
10 agents and Service Oklahoma shall be agreed to no later than
11 December 31, 2022. In the event an existing motor license agent
12 declines to enter into the subsequent contract with Service Oklahoma
13 to become a licensed operator, that motor license agent may continue
14 to conduct business pursuant to the existing contract through
15 December 31, 2025, so long as that motor license agent remains in
16 good standing with Service Oklahoma in accordance with the terms of
17 the existing contract.

18 SECTION 13. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1141.1, as
19 last amended by Section 177, Chapter 282, O.S.L. 2022 (47 O.S. Supp.

4 20. Any amount specifically authorized by law to be retained by

7 21. Beginning July 1, 2009 and through June 30, 2023, each
8 licensed operator shall also be entitled to a portion of the
9 penalties for delinquent registration or payment of excise tax as
10 provided for in subsection C of Section 1115, subsection F of
11 Section 1132 and subsection C of Section 1151 of this title and of
12 subsection A of Section 2103 of Title 68 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

13 22. Beginning January 1, 2023, each licensed operator shall be
14 entitled to retain Three Dollars and fifty-six cents (\$3.56) for
15 each electric vehicle registered pursuant to the provisions of this
16 act and such amount shall be in addition to any other amount
17 otherwise authorized by this section to be retained with respect to
18 a vehicle through June 30, 2025; and

19 23. Beginning January 1, 2023 and through June 30, 2023, each

17 driver licenses, permits, and identification cards,
18 including REAL ID Compliant and REAL ID Noncompliant
19 credentials, pursuant to Section 6-101 et seq. of this
20 title.

21 2. All other fees directed by this section shall default back
22 to the apportionment outlined in Section 1104 of this title.

23 SECTION 14. REPEALER 47 O.S. 2021, Section 1132.5, is
24 hereby repealed.

1 SECTION 15. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.

2 SECTION 16. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
3 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby
4 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
