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6	An Act relating to the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System; amending 11 O.S. 2021,
7	Sections 49-101 and 49-101.2, as amended by Sections 3 and 4, Chapter 232, O.S.L. 2022 (11 O.S. Supp.
8	2023, Sections 49-101 and 49-101.2), which relate to volunteer firefighter pension amounts; modifying
9	volunteer firefighter pension amount; modifying compensation determination; amending 62 O.S. 2021,
10 11	Section 3103, as last amended by Section 1, Chapter 306, O.S.L. 2022 (62 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 3103), which relates to the Oklahoma Pension Legislation
11	Actuarial Analysis Act; modifying definition; updating statutory language; updating statutory
13	references; providing effective dates; and declaring an emergency.
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15	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
16	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2021, Section 49-101, as
17	amended by Section 3, Chapter 232, O.S.L. 2022 (11 O.S. Supp. 2023,
18	Section 49-101), is amended to read as follows:
19	Section 49-101. A. All retired volunteer firefighters who
20	qualify for retirement shall be entitled to a monthly pension. The
21	monthly pension of a volunteer firefighter who retires prior to the
22	effective date of this act shall be in the amount retired volunteer
23	firefighters are receiving at the time the volunteer firefighter
24	begins to receive a pension for each year of credited service not to

1 exceed thirty (30) years. Volunteer firefighters who retire on and after the effective date of this act shall receive a monthly pension 2 in the amount of Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for each year of credited 3 service not to exceed thirty (30) years. In determining the number 4 5 of years of credited service, a fractional year of six (6) months or more shall be counted as one (1) full year and a fractional year of 6 less than six (6) months shall not be counted in such determination. 7 Retired volunteer firefighters of a municipality shall receive a 8 pension of not less than that which retired volunteer firefighters 9 of such municipality were receiving on June 30, 1985. 10

A volunteer firefighter who terminates service after 11 в. completing ten (10) years of credited service, but less than twenty 12 (20) years of credited service, shall be entitled to receive a 13 vested benefit commencing on the date the firefighter reaches fifty 14 (50) years of age or the date the firefighter would have had twenty 15 (20) years of credited service had the firefighter's service 16 continued uninterrupted, whichever is later. The monthly amount of 17 such retirement benefit shall be the amount being paid to volunteer 18 firefighters at the time the member vests multiplied by the number 19 of years of credited service. Credited service must be established 20 at the time of the volunteer firefighter's termination. If a 21 volunteer firefighter who terminated employment and elected, or was 22 eligible to elect, a vested benefit dies prior to being eligible to 23 receive benefits, the volunteer firefighter's beneficiary, as 24

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1 defined in paragraph 16 of Section 49-100.1 of this title, shall be 2 entitled to the volunteer firefighter's normal monthly retirement 3 benefit on the date the deceased volunteer firefighter would have 4 been eligible to receive the benefit.

5 SECTION 2. AMENDATORY 11 O.S. 2021, Section 49-101.2, as
6 amended by Section 4, Chapter 232, O.S.L. 2022 (11 O.S. Supp. 2023,
7 Section 49-101.2), is amended to read as follows:

Section 49-101.2. Any member serving as an active volunteer 8 9 firefighter who receives annual compensation from the fire 10 department the firefighter is enrolled in as a member of the 11 Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and Retirement System for services 12 related to firefighting, other than reimbursement of expenses in excess of five and one-half (5 1/2) times the annual pension benefit 13 paid by the System to a retired volunteer firefighter with twenty 14 (20) years credited service Nine Thousand Nine Hundred Thirty-nine 15 Dollars and sixty-nine cents (\$9,939.69), shall be considered a paid 16 firefighter and must meet the physical and agility requirements 17 pursuant to Section 49-116 of this title to continue as an active 18 member of the System. Credited service earned as a paid firefighter 19 pursuant to this section shall not be considered actual experience 20 as a paid firefighter for purposes of meeting the qualifications of 21 a paid fire chief as provided in Section 29-102 of this title. No 22 fire department of a participating municipality shall employ a 23

volunteer firefighter from another fire department to perform
 services relating to firefighting for any compensation of any kind.
 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 62 O.S. 2021, Section 3103, as
 last amended by Section 1, Chapter 306, O.S.L. 2022 (62 O.S. Supp.
 2023, Section 3103), is amended to read as follows:

6 Section 3103. As used in the Oklahoma Pension Legislation7 Actuarial Analysis Act:

8 1. "Amendment" means any amendment, including a substitute
9 bill, made to a retirement bill by any committee of the House of
10 <u>Representatives</u> or Senate, any conference committee of the House or
11 Senate or by the House or Senate;

12 2. "RB number" means that number preceded by the letters "RB" 13 assigned to a retirement bill by the respective staffs of the 14 Oklahoma State Senate and the Oklahoma House of Representatives when 15 the respective staff office prepares a retirement bill for a member 16 of the Legislature;

3. "Legislative Actuary" means the firm or entity that enters into a contract with the Legislative Service Bureau pursuant to Section 452.15 of Title 74 of the Oklahoma Statutes to provide the actuarial services and other duties provided for in the Oklahoma Pension Legislation Actuarial Analysis Act;

4. "Nonfiscal amendment" means an amendment to a retirementbill having a fiscal impact, which amendment does not change any

- the lesser of two percent (2%) of the gross 12 (3) 13 annual retirement benefit of the member or One Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$1,400.00) and 14 requires that the benefit may only be provided if 15 the funded ratio of the affected retirement 16 17 system would be greater than one hundred percent (100%) after the benefit increase is paid, or 18 the greater of two percent (2%) of the gross (4) 19 annual retirement benefit of the volunteer 20 21 firefighter or One Hundred Dollars (\$100.00) for persons who retired from the Oklahoma 22 Firefighters Pension and Retirement System as 23 volunteer firefighters and who did not retire 24

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1			from the Oklahoma Firefighters Pension and
2			Retirement System as a paid firefighter.

10 A nonfiscal retirement bill shall include any retirement bill that 11 has as its sole purpose the appropriation or distribution or 12 redistribution of monies in some manner to a retirement system for 13 purposes of reducing the unfunded liability of such system or the 14 earmarking of a portion of the revenue from a tax to a retirement 15 system or increasing the percentage of the revenue earmarked from a 16 tax to a retirement system;

17 6. "Reduction-in-cost amendment" means an amendment to a 18 retirement bill having a fiscal impact which reduces the cost of the 19 bill as such cost is determined by the actuarial investigation for 20 the bill prepared pursuant to Section 3109 of this title;

7. "Retirement bill" means any bill or joint resolution introduced or any bill or joint resolution amended by a member of the Oklahoma Legislature which creates or amends any law directly affecting a retirement system. A retirement bill shall not mean a 1 bill or resolution that impacts the revenue of any state tax in 2 which a portion of the revenue generated from such tax is earmarked 3 for the benefit of a retirement system;

8. "Retirement bill having a fiscal impact" means any
retirement bill creating or establishing a retirement system and any
other retirement bill other than a nonfiscal retirement bill; and

9. "Retirement system" means the Teachers' Retirement System of
Oklahoma, the Oklahoma Public Employees Retirement System, the
Uniform Retirement System for Justices and Judges, the Oklahoma
Firefighters Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Police
Pension and Retirement System, the Oklahoma Law Enforcement
Retirement System, or a retirement system established after January
1, 2006.

14 SECTION 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this act shall become effective 15 in accordance with the provisions of Section 58 of Article V of the 16 Oklahoma Constitution.

17 SECTION 5. Section 3 of this act shall become effective July 1, 18 2024.

19 SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation 20 of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby 21 declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and 22 be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
