NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 839.4 of Title 21, unless there 13 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows: 14 A. No first responder or scene support personnel shall release 15 to the public scene specific information or transmit to a social 16 media site any photographic image or video taken at a collision or 17 crime scene without prior authorization from the investigating 18 agency. 19 B. As used in this section: 20 "First responder" shall mean a full-time, reserve, or 21 volunteer, state, county, or municipal peace officer, firefighter, 22 paramedic, emergency medical technician, rescue service personnel, 23

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- emergency manager, medical examiner or employee of a medical examiner, or wrecker service provider;
- 2. "Investigating agency" shall mean the city, county, or state agency responsible for investigating and reporting the collision to the Department of Public Safety or the crime report to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation; and
- 3. "Scene support personnel" shall include, but not be limited to, towing or remediation services, funeral homes, crime scene cleaners, or city, county, and state road maintenance employees.
- C. The provisions of subsection A of this section shall not prevent the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation or the Oklahoma Highway Patrol from transmitting information when a law enforcement agency requests investigative assistance.
- D. Within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this act, any agency or entity employing first responders or scene support personnel shall notify the employees of the provisions of this act.
- E. Any person convicted of a violation of this section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by a fine not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00), or by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed one (1) year, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

  SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2023.
