14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1210.508-6 of Title 70, unless
17	there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
18	A. Except as provided for in subsection B of this section,
19	beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, in order to graduate from
20	a public high school accredited by the State Board of Education,
21	students shall complete and submit a Free Application for Federal
22	Student Aid (FAFSA).
23	B. A student shall not be required to comply with the
24	provisions of subsection A of this section if:

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The student's parent or legal guardian submits a signed form
 authorizing the student to opt out of the requirement of subsection
 A of this section;

2. A student age eighteen (18) or older submits a signed form
authorizing him or her to opt out of the requirement of subsection A
of this section; or

3. A school counselor authorizes a student to opt out of the8 requirement of subsection A of this section.

9 C. The State Department of Education shall develop and publish: 10 1. Materials for students, parents, and legal guardians 11 explaining the requirements to complete the FAFSA, the benefits to 12 completing the FAFSA, and the opt-out provisions described in 13 subsection B of this section; and

14 2. An opt-out form to be used by school districts, charter 15 schools, and virtual charter schools for the purposes outlined in 16 subsection B of this section.

D. The superintendent of each school district in this state shall designate a school employee to collect information regarding student compliance with subsection A or B of this section. The collection and storage of the information shall comply with the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA).

E. The State Board of Education shall promulgate rules to implement the provisions of this section, which shall address the method by which a student is to provide proof to a school district,

4	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective July 1, 2023.
5	SECTION 3. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
6	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby

8	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
