12	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
13	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 27 O.S. 2021, Section 18, is		
14	amended to read as follows:		
15	Section 18. A. The Attorney General shall prepare a written		
16	statement that includes a "Landowner's Bill of Rights" for a		
17	property owner whose real property may be acquired by a person,		
18	acquiring agency, or other entity through the use of the entity's		
19	eminent domain authority under Title 27 <u>this title</u> or Title 66 of		
20	the Oklahoma Statutes. The statement shall be made available to the		
21	public and written in plain language designed to be easily		
22	understood by the average property owner.		
23	B. The Landowner's Bill of Rights shall notify each property		
24	owner of the right to:		

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1 1. Notice of the proposed acquisition of the owner's property; 2 A bona fide good-faith effort to negotiate by the entity 2. proposing to acquire the property; 3 4 3. An assessment of damages to the owner that will result from 5 the taking of the property; 6 4. A hearing under Title 27 of the Oklahoma Statutes this 7 title, including a hearing on the assessment of damages; and 5. An appeal of a judgment in a condemnation proceeding, 8 9 including an appeal of an assessment of damages; and 10 6. First refusal or right of first refusal offer if the 11 acquired land is ever sold by the state or any state agency or any 12 person who acquired the land through the use of eminent domain 13 authority. If the landowner chooses to exercise this right, the 14 price would be the lower of either the current market value or the 15 price received by the landowner under the eminent domain sale. This 16 right shall be available to the landowner in the original eminent 17 domain sale and to the first generation of heirs. 18 However, acquired land may be transferred to another state 19 agency without prompting the first refusal or right of first refusal 20 as provided in this paragraph. 21 С.
