10 An Act relating to artificial intelligence; providing
11 definitions; establishing the rights of Oklahomans
12 when interacting with artificial intelligence;
13 providing for codification; and providing an
14 effective date.

15 BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:

16 SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
17 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 160.1 of Title 25, unless there
18 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

19 As used in this act:

20 1. "Artificial intelligence" means:

21 a. a system that:

22 (1) performs tasks under varying and unpredictable
23 circumstances without significant human oversight
24

1 or can learn from experience and improve such
2 performance when exposed to data sets,

3 (2) is developed in any context, including, but not
4 limited to, software or physical hardware, and
5 solves tasks requiring human-like perception,
6 cognition, planning, learning, communication, or
7 physical action, or

8 (3) is designed to:

9 (a) think or act like a human, including, but
10 not limited to, a cognitive architecture or
11 neural network, or

12 (b) act rationally, including, but not limited
13 to, an intelligent software agent or
14 embodied robot that achieves goals using
15 perception, planning, reasoning, learning,
16 communication, decision-making or action, or

17 b. a set of techniques, including, but not limited to,
18 machine learning that is designed to approximate a
19 cognitive task; and

20 2. "Real person" means an actual biological human being as
21 opposed to a system or model meant to emulate human interactions.

22 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
23 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 160.2 of Title 25, unless there
24 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1 All citizens of the State of Oklahoma are entitled to the
2 following rights:

3 1. The right to know when they are interacting with an
4 artificial intelligence engine rather than a real person in an
5 interaction where consequential information is exchanged;

6 2. The right to know when contracts and other legally binding
7 documents that they are being asked to execute were generated
8 entirely by an artificial intelligence engine and not reviewed by a
9 real person;

10 4. The right to know when they are consuming images or text
11 that were generated entirely by an artificial intelligence engine
12 and not reviewed by a real person, provided that the images or text
13 would lead a reasonable person to believe that such content is real
14 and authentic;

15 5. The right to be able to rely on a watermark or some other
16 form of content credentials to verify the authenticity of creative
17 product they generate or consume. Specifically, it shall not be
18 permissible for any websites, social media platforms, search
19 engines, and the like, to remove a watermark or content credential
20 without inserting an updated watermark or content credential that
21 indicates that the original was removed or altered;

22 6. The right to know that any company which includes any of
23 their Personally Identifiable Information in an artificial
24 intelligence model has implemented reasonable security measures for

1 data privacy within the company's industry, and conducts regular
2 risk assessments to assess design, operational and discrimination
3 harm;

4 7. The right to consent to any derivative media that is
5 generated by an artificial intelligence engine and uses audio
6 recordings of the citizen's voice or images of them to recreate the
7 citizen's likeness; and

8 8. The right to be free from unlawful discrimination through
9 algorithmic or model bias which discriminates based on age, race,
10 national origin, sex, disability, pregnancy, religious beliefs,
11 veteran status, or any other legally protected classification to the
12 same extent as if such discrimination were perpetrated by a real
13 person.

14 SECTION 3. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
