Unless otherwise prohibited by law, a valid 4 physician-patient relationship may be established by an allopathic or osteopathic physician with a patient located in this state 5 through telemedicine, provided that the physician: 6 7 1. Holds a license to practice medicine in this state; 8 2. Confirms with the patient the patient's identity and physical location; and 9 10 3. Provides the patient with the treating physician's identity and professional credentials. 11 12 Telemedicine encounters shall comply with the Health 13 Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 and ensure 14 that all patient communications and records are secure and confidential. 15 16 Telemedicine encounters in this state shall not be used to 17 establish a valid physician-patient relationship for the purpose of prescribing opiates, synthetic opiates, semisynthetic opiates, 18 benzodiazepine or carisprodol, but may be unless the encounter is 19 used to prescribe opioid: 20 1. Opioid antagonists or partial agonists pursuant to Sections 21 22 1-2506.1 and 1-2506.2 of Title 63 of the Oklahoma Statutes; or 23 2.
