14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:		
15	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified		
16	in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 212.5 of Title 74, unless there		
17	is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:		
18	A. Beginning no later than July 1, 2024, the State Auditor and		
19	Inspector shall conduct a performance audit of expenditures on		
20	homeless programs and services in this state, by:		
21	1. The state;		
22	2. Municipalities and counties;		
23	3. State entities that receive federal funds allocated for		
24	homeless programs and services; and		

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- 4. State and local law enforcement agencies.
- 2 All political subdivisions of this state shall cooperate В. with the audit and grant access, at no cost, to all financial 3 records and other programmatic information necessary for the 4 5 completion of the performance audit. The audit shall examine the awarding of contracts and grants relating to homeless programs and 6 services, any metric used to measure success of the expenditures, 7 whether the contractors and grantees met such metrics, and the 9 efficacy of the use of data management systems in relation to such programs and services. If any service provider in this state is 10 required to provide information as part of the audit provided for in 11 12 this section, the submission of the most recent financial audit of the service provider performed by a licensed third party shall 13 constitute compliance with the information request. 14
 - C. Report of such audit shall be provided electronically to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor, the President Pro Tempore of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives.
 - SECTION 2. It being immediately necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health or safety, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
