14	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
15	SECTION 1. AMENDATORY 12 O.S. 2021, Section 2503.1, is
16	amended to read as follows:
17	Section 2503.1 A. As used in this section:
18	1. An "interpreter" is a qualified legal interpreter for the
19	deaf or hard-of-hearing, as defined by Section 2408 of Title 63 of
20	the Oklahoma Statutes, or a spoken language interpreter for a
21	Limited English Proficient (LEP) person;
22	2. A "deaf or hard-of-hearing person" is a person whose sense
23	of hearing is nonfunctional for the ordinary purposes of life; and

1 3. <u>A "Limited English Proficient (LEP) person" is a person who</u> 2 cannot speak or easily understand English; and

<u>4.</u> A communication is "confidential" if made privately and not
intended for further disclosure except to other persons present in
furtherance of the purpose of the communication.

B. A person has a privilege to refuse to disclose and to
prevent an interpreter from disclosing such person's confidential
communication made while such interpreter is acting in the capacity
as an interpreter for persons who are deaf or hard-of-hearing <u>or</u>
LEP.

11 C. The privilege may be claimed by the interpreter, by the <u>LEP</u> 12 <u>or</u> deaf or hard-of-hearing person, by the guardian or conservator of 13 the <u>LEP or</u> deaf or hard-of-hearing person, or by the personal 14 representative of the <u>LEP or</u> deaf or hard-of-hearing person if the 15 LEP or deaf or hard-of-hearing person is deceased.

D. An interpreter who is employed to interpret, transliterate or relay a conversation between a person who can hear <u>and speak</u> <u>English</u> and a <u>LEP or</u> deaf or hard-of-hearing person is a conduit for the conversation and may not disclose or be compelled to disclose, through reporting or testimony, or by <u>judicial process or</u> subpoena, the contents of a confidential communication.

E. There is no privilege pursuant to this section forcommunications:

If the services of the interpreter were sought or obtained 2 to enable or aid anyone to commit or plan to commit what the LEP or 3 deaf or hard-of-hearing person knew, or reasonably should have 4 known, to be a crime or fraud or physical injury to the LEP or deaf 5 or hard-of-hearing person or another individual; 6 In which the LEP or deaf or hard-of-hearing person has 2. 7 expressed an intent to engage in conduct likely to result in 8 imminent death or serious bodily injury to the LEP or deaf or hard-9 of-hearing person or another individual; 10 3. Relevant to an issue in a proceeding challenging the 11 competency of the interpreter; 12 4. Relevant to a breach of duty by the interpreter; or 13 5. That are subject to a duty to disclose under statutory law. 14 SECTION 2.
