



1 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified  
2 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 601.6d of Title 10, unless there  
3 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

4 A. Persons who are believed to be homeless children and youth  
5 as defined in Section 600 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes may  
6 be verified as being homeless by:

- 7 1. The director or designee of a homeless shelter;
- 8 2. The director or designee of a transitional living program;
- 9 3. The McKinney-Vento homeless liaison of a public school; or
- 10 4. A continuum of care lead agency or its designee.

11 B. Verification that a child or youth is homeless shall  
12 consist, at a minimum, of the following steps:

13 1. The child or youth shall be known to the person verifying  
14 his or her housing status;

15 2. If verifying the status of a child or youth under eighteen  
16 (18) years of age, the person verifying shall:

17 a. check the National Missing and Unidentified Persons  
18 System (NamUs) referenced in Section 151.3 of Title 74  
19 of the Oklahoma Statutes for the name of the child or  
20 youth,

21 b. send a letter by return receipt mail to the last known  
22 address of the parent or legal guardian of the child  
23 or youth informing the parent or legal guardian that  
24 the person verifying is assisting the child or youth

1 in obtaining a REAL ID noncompliant identification  
2 card, and

3 c. if no response from the parent or legal guardian  
4 objecting to the child or youth obtaining a REAL ID  
5 noncompliant identification card is received within  
6 fifteen (15) business days, the person may prepare  
7 written verification stating that the child or youth  
8 is homeless.

9 The written verification shall be printed on the letterhead of  
10 the entity authorized to verify the housing status of the child or  
11 youth and shall be dated, signed by the person verifying, and  
12 notarized.

13 SECTION 3. AMENDATORY 47 O.S. 2021, Section 6-105.3, as  
14 last amended by Section 6, Chapter 47, 1st Extraordinary Session,  
15 O.S.L. 2023 (47 O.S. Supp. 2023, Section 6-105.3), is amended to  
16 read as follows:

17 Section 6-105.3 A. In addition to the licenses to operate  
18 motor vehicles, the Department of Public Safety may issue cards to  
19 Oklahoma residents for purposes of identification only. The  
20 identification cards shall be issued, renewed, replaced, canceled  
21 and denied in the same manner as driver licenses in this state. A  
22 licensee whose record reflects a notation of the person's proof of  
23 legal presence, verified by the U.S. Department of Homeland  
24 Security, or proof of U.S. citizenship, may obtain a REAL ID

1 Compliant Identification Card or a Noncompliant Identification Card  
2 from a motor license agent or the Department of Public Safety,  
3 regardless of the status of the license held by the licensee.  
4 Provided, the licensee must comply with all REAL ID documentation  
5 requirements to obtain a REAL ID Compliant Identification Card. A  
6 person shall not apply for or possess more than one state-issued or  
7 territory-issued REAL ID Compliant Identification Card pursuant to  
8 the provisions of Section 6-101 of this title.

9 The application for an identification card by any person under  
10 the age of eighteen (18) years shall be signed and verified by a  
11 custodial legal parent or legal guardian, either in person before a  
12 person authorized to administer oaths or electronically if  
13 completing an online application, or a notarized affidavit signed by  
14 a custodial legal parent or legal guardian submitted before a person  
15 authorized to administer oaths by the person under the age of  
16 eighteen (18) years with the application. Provided, that persons  
17 under eighteen (18) years of age who are homeless children and  
18 youth, as defined in Section 600 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma  
19 Statutes and verified as such through the process established in  
20 Section 1 of this act, shall be allowed to apply for a REAL ID  
21 Noncompliant Identification Card without the signature of their  
22 parent or legal guardian. Except as otherwise provided in this  
23 section, the identification cards shall be valid for a period of  
24 either four (4) years from the month of issuance or eight (8) years

1 from the month of issuance; however, the identification cards issued  
2 to persons sixty-five (65) years of age or older shall be valid  
3 indefinitely from the month of issuance.

4 B. 1. The Department of Corrections shall coordinate with the  
5 Department of Public Safety to provide REAL ID Noncompliant  
6 Identification Cards to all inmates who do not have a current state-  
7 issued identification card or driver license upon their release from  
8 custody. The identification cards shall be issued, replaced,  
9 canceled and denied in the same manner as driver licenses in this  
10 state.

11 2. The Department of Public Safety shall allow the use of a  
12 certified copy of a birth certificate coupled with a Department of  
13 Corrections-issued consolidated record card to serve as a valid form  
14 of photo identification documentation to obtain a REAL ID  
15 Noncompliant Identification Card.

16 3. REAL ID Noncompliant Identification Cards issued with a  
17 consolidated record card from the Department of Corrections for  
18 inmates shall be valid for a period of four (4) years from the month  
19 of issuance for an allowable fee to be determined by the Department  
20 of Public Safety and are nonrenewable and nontransferable.

21 4. The fee charged for the issuance or replacement of a REAL ID  
22 Noncompliant Identification Card pursuant to this subsection shall  
23 be deposited in the Department of Public Safety Revolving Fund.  
24 Provided, however, REAL ID Noncompliant Identification Cards issued

1 to individuals required to register pursuant to the Sex Offenders  
2 Registration Act shall only be valid for a period of one (1) year.  
3 No person sixty-five (65) years of age or older shall be charged a  
4 fee for a REAL ID Noncompliant Identification Card.

5 5. The Department of Public Safety is authorized to promulgate  
6 rules and procedures to implement the provisions of this subsection.

7 C. No person shall hold more than one state-issued or  
8 territory-issued REAL ID Compliant Driver License or REAL ID  
9 Compliant Identification Card, as defined in subsection G of Section  
10 6-101 of this title. The Department shall not issue a REAL ID  
11 Compliant Identification Card to any applicant who has been  
12 previously issued a REAL ID Compliant Driver License or REAL ID  
13 Compliant Identification Card unless such license or identification  
14 card has been surrendered to the Department by the applicant. The  
15 Department may promulgate rules related to the issuance of  
16 replacement REAL ID Compliant Identification Cards in the event of  
17 loss or theft.

18 D. The fee charged for the issuance or renewal of a REAL ID  
19 Compliant Identification Card shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00)  
20 for a 4-year card and Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) for an 8-year card.  
21 The fee charged for the issuance or renewal of a REAL ID  
22 Noncompliant Identification Card pursuant to this section shall be  
23 Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) for a 4-year card and Fifty Dollars  
24 (\$50.00) for an 8-year card; however, no person sixty-five (65)

1 years of age or older, ~~or~~ one hundred percent (100%) disabled  
2 veteran described in subsection P of Section 6-101 of this title, or  
3 persons who are homeless children and youth as defined in Section  
4 600 of Title 10 of the Oklahoma Statutes and verified through the  
5 process established in Section 1 of this act shall be charged a fee  
6 for an identification card. Of each fee charged pursuant to the  
7 provisions of this subsection:

8 1. Seven Dollars (\$7.00) of a 4-year card and Fourteen Dollars  
9 (\$14.00) of an 8-year card shall be apportioned as provided in  
10 Section 1104 of this title;

11 2. Three Dollars (\$3.00) of a 4-year card and Six Dollars  
12 (\$6.00) of an 8-year card shall be credited to the Department of  
13 Public Safety Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used  
14 solely for the purpose of the administration and maintenance of the  
15 computerized imaging system of the Department;

16 3. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) of a 4-year card and Twenty Dollars  
17 (\$20.00) of an 8-year card shall be deposited in the Department of  
18 Public Safety Revolving Fund;

19 4. Three Dollars (\$3.00) of a 4-year card and Six Dollars  
20 (\$6.00) of an 8-year card shall be deposited to the State Public  
21 Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title; and

22 5. Two Dollars (\$2.00) for a 4-year card and Four Dollars  
23 (\$4.00) for an 8-year card of the fee authorized by this subsection  
24 related to the issuance or renewal of an identification card by a

1 motor license agent that does process approved applications or  
2 renewals for REAL ID Compliant and REAL ID Non-Compliant Driver  
3 Licenses or Identification Cards shall be retained by the licensed  
4 operator through June 30, 2023. Beginning July 1, 2023, these  
5 monies shall be retained by the licensed operator pursuant to  
6 subsection E of Section 1141.1 of this title.

7 E. The fee charged for replacement of a REAL ID Compliant  
8 Identification Card, or REAL ID Non-Compliant Identification Card,  
9 shall be Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00); however, no person sixty-five  
10 (65) years of age or older shall be charged a fee for an  
11 identification card replacement. Of each fee charged pursuant to  
12 the provisions of this subsection:

13 1. Seven Dollars (\$7.00) shall be apportioned as provided in  
14 Section 1104 of this title;

15 2. Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be credited to the Department of  
16 Public Safety Computer Imaging System Revolving Fund to be used  
17 solely for the purpose of the administration and maintenance of the  
18 computerized imaging system of the Department;

19 3. Ten Dollars (\$10.00) shall be deposited in the Department of  
20 Public Safety Revolving Fund;

21 4. Three Dollars (\$3.00) shall be deposited to the State Public  
22 Safety Fund created in Section 2-147 of this title; and

23 5. Two Dollars (\$2.00) of the fee authorized by this subsection  
24 related to the replacement of an identification card by a motor



1 license agent that does process approved applications or renewals  
2 for REAL ID Compliant or REAL ID Non-Compliant Driver Licenses or  
3 Identification Cards shall be retained by the licensed operator  
4 through June 30, 2023. Beginning July 1, 2023, these monies shall  
5 be retained by the licensed operator pursuant to subsection E of  
6 Section 1141.1 of this title.

7 F. The Oklahoma Tax Commission is hereby authorized to  
8 reimburse, from funds available to that agency, each motor license  
9 agent issuing an identification card to a person sixty-five (65)  
10 years of age or older, an amount not to exceed One Dollar (\$1.00)  
11 for each card or driver license so issued through June 30, 2023.  
12 The Tax Commission shall develop procedures for claims for  
13 reimbursement.

14 G. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, when a person  
15 makes application for a new identification card, or makes  
16 application to renew an identification card, and the person has been  
17 convicted of, or received a deferred judgment for, any offense  
18 required to register pursuant to the Sex Offenders Registration Act,  
19 the identification card shall be valid for a period of one (1) year  
20 from the month of issuance, but may be renewed yearly during the  
21 time the person is subject to registration on the Sex Offender  
22 Registry. The cost for such identification card shall be the same  
23 as for other identification cards and renewals.

1 H. Nothing in this section requires or authorizes the  
2 Department of Public Safety to issue a REAL ID Noncompliant  
3 Identification Card without the documentation required by the  
4 provisions of paragraph 9 of subsection A of Section 6-103 of this  
5 title.

6 SECTION 4. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
