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	BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
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19 20 21	SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2500 of Title 70, unless there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

1	1.	"CTP	program" means a degree, certificate, or nondegree
2	program	that	meets each of the following criteria:
3		a.	is offered by an institution of higher education or
4			technology center school,
5		b.	is delivered to students physically attending the
6			institution of higher education or technology center
7			school,
8		с.	is designed to support students with intellectual
9			disabilities who are seeking to continue academic,
10			career and technical, and independent living
11			instruction at an institution of higher education or
12			technology center school to prepare for gainful
13			employment,
14		d.	includes an advising and curriculum structure,
15		e.	requires students with intellectual disabilities to
16			participate on not less than a half-time basis as
17			determined by the institution of higher education or
18			technology center school, with such participation
19			focusing on academic components and occurring through
20			one or more of the following activities:
21			(1) regular enrollment in credit-bearing courses with
22			nondisabled students offered by the institution
23			of higher education or technology center school,
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1	(2) auditing or participating in courses with
2	nondisabled students offered by the institution
3	for higher education or technology center school
4	for which the student does not receive regular
5	academic credit,
6	(3) enrollment in noncredit-bearing, nondegree
7	courses with nondisabled students, or
8	(4) participation in internships or work-based
9	training in settings with nondisabled students,
10	f. requires students with intellectual disabilities to be
11	socially and academically integrated with nondisabled
12	students to the maximum extent possible, and
13	g. is approved by the United States Department of
14	Education pursuant to P.L. No. 110-315, the Higher
15	Education Opportunity Act, as amended;
16	2. "Eligible student" means a student with an intellectual
17	disability who is eligible for the scholarship program;
18	3. "Scholarship program" means the Oklahoma Access and
19	Achievement Program;
20	4. "State educational institution" means a higher education
21	institution or technology center school supported wholly or in part
22	by direct legislative appropriations that provides a CTP program;
23	5. "State Regents" means the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher
24	Education; and

6. "Student with an intellectual disability" means a student: 1 with a cognitive impairment, characterized by a. 2 significant limitations in intellectual and cognitive 3 functioning and adaptive behavior as expressed in 4 conceptual, social, and practical adaptive skills, and 5 who is currently or was formerly eligible for a free b. 6 appropriate public education under the Individuals 7 with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA), including a 8 student who was determined eligible for special 9 education or related services under IDEA but attended 10 a private school or was educated pursuant to the other 11 12 means of education exception provided for in subsection A of Section 10-105 of Title 70 of the 13 Oklahoma Statutes. 14

There is hereby created a program to be known as the С. 15 Oklahoma Access and Achievement Program. The purpose of the program 16 is to provide an award to eligible students with intellectual 17 disabilities who are pursuing studies in this state at a CTP 18 The award shall be an amount equal to the nonguaranteed program. 19 resident tuition at an institution of higher education or the 20 tuition at a technology center school. 21

D. A student with an intellectual disability shall be eligible for the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Program if the student:

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Is a resident of this state or enrolled in a school district
 located in this state that serves students who reside in both this
 state and an adjacent state pursuant to a contract authorized by
 Section 5-117.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes;

2. Is a United States citizen or lawfully present in the United
States. A student who is not a United States citizen or lawfully
present in the United States shall not be eligible to participate in
the scholarship program and qualify for an award;

3. Has graduated within the previous six (6) years from a
public high school accredited by the State Board of Education or a
private school, or has satisfactorily completed within the previous
six (6) years an educational program that was provided through a
means other than a public or private school;

4. Has secured admission to and enrolled in a CTP program at an
educational institution that meets the requirements to be eligible
for federal student financial aid; and

17 5. Has established financial need according to the provisions
18 of Section 3 of this act and standards and provisions promulgated by
19 the State Regents.

E. To retain eligibility in the scholarship program, a student with an intellectual disability shall:

Meet the requirements for retention and completion as
 established by the state educational institution where the student
 is enrolled;

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2. Maintain satisfactory academic progress as required by the
 2 CTP program criteria;

3 3. Comply with the standards related to maintenance of
4 eligibility as promulgated by the State Regents; and

4. Refrain from conduct that leads to expulsion or suspension
of more than one semester from a state educational institution. A
student who violates the provisions of this paragraph shall
permanently lose eligibility for scholarship program benefits.

F. The State Regents shall promulgate rules relating to the
 establishment and maintenance of eligibility under the scholarship
 program.

12 SECTION 2. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 13 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2501 of Title 70, unless there 14 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

A. Subject to the availability of funds, an amount equivalent to the nonguaranteed resident tuition at an institution of higher education or the tuition at a technology center school for which an eligible student is obligated at a CTP program shall be awarded by allocation from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund created pursuant to Section 3953.1 of Title 70 of the Oklahoma Statutes.

B. Benefits awarded through the scholarship program shall be awarded to all eligible student applicants without any limitation on the number of awards in any year other than the amount of funds

available for the scholarship program and the number of eligible 1 student applicants. Subject to the provisions of subsection C of 2 this section, if funds are not sufficient to provide awards for all 3 eligible student applicants, the Oklahoma State Regents for Higher 4 Education shall make awards on the basis of need. Provided, the 5 State Regents may take into consideration other grants and 6 scholarships received by an eligible student applicant when making 7 awards. 8

C. An award provided for by this section shall not be allowed 9 for courses or other postsecondary units taken more than five (5) 10 years after the eligible student's first semester of postsecondary 11 12 enrollment. The State Regents may award the scholarship program benefits for courses or other postsecondary units taken more than 13 five (5) years after the eligible student's first semester of 14 postsecondary enrollment only in hardship circumstances; provided, 15 however, no eligible student may receive benefits beyond a 16 cumulative time period of five (5) years. 17

D. The State Regents may, at the time an award is made on behalf of an eligible student, set aside in the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund funds for the full commitment made to the student. For all academic years, students who have previously received awards under the provisions of the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Act and who have continued at all times to fulfill the requirements for eligibility to receive awards provided pursuant to the scholarship program shall be given an absolute priority for continued financial support by the scholarship program above any students who are applying for an award for the first time.

4 SECTION 3. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified 5 in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 2502 of Title 70, unless there 6 is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:

Except as otherwise provided for in subsection B of this Α. 7 section, a student with an intellectual disability shall not be 8 found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Access 9 and Achievement Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program 10 award for any year during which the student is enrolled in a CTP 11 12 program at a state educational institution, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) or legal guardian(s) exceeds 13 One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) per year. The 14 determination of financial qualification provided in this subsection 15 shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the 16 parent(s) or legal guardian(s), if a student is determined to be 17 independent of his or her parent(s) or legal guardian(s) for federal 18 financial aid purposes. 19

B. 1. A student with an intellectual disability who was
adopted between birth and twelve (12) years of age while in the
permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the courtordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing
agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the

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federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program award for any year during which the student is enrolled in a CTP program at a state educational institution, the federal adjusted gross income of the student's parent(s) exceeds One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) per year.

2. A student with an intellectual disability who was adopted 8 between thirteen (13) and seventeen (17) years of age while in the 9 permanent custody of the Department of Human Services, in the court-10 ordered custody of a licensed private nonprofit child-placing 11 12 agency, or federally recognized Indian tribe, as defined by the federal Indian Child Welfare Act, shall not be found to be in 13 financial need for purposes of the Oklahoma Access and Achievement 14 Act if prior to receiving any scholarship program award for any year 15 during which the student is enrolled in a CTP program at a state 16 educational institution, the federal adjusted gross income of the 17 student's parent(s) exceeds Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 18 (\$200,000.00) per year. 19

3. The determination of financial qualification provided for in this subsection shall be based on the income of the student, not the income of the student's parent(s), if the student is determined to be independent of the student's parent(s) for federal financial aid purposes. 1SECTION 4.AMENDATORY70 O.S. 2021, Section 3953.1, is2amended to read as follows:

3 Section 3953.1. A. There is hereby created a trust fund to be 4 known as the "Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust Fund". The 5 Oklahoma State Regents for Higher Education shall be the trustees of 6 said the Trust Fund.

B. The State Regents shall utilize said the Trust Fund to
implement the provisions of Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title
and Sections 1 through 3 of this act.

C. The Trust Fund principal shall consist of monies the 10 Legislature appropriates or transfers to the Oklahoma State Regents 11 12 for Higher Education for the Trust Fund and any monies or assets contributed to the Trust Fund from any other source, public or 13 private. All monies accruing to the credit of said the fund are 14 hereby appropriated and may be budgeted and expended by the State 1.5 Regents. Expenditures from said the fund shall be made upon 16 warrants issued by the State Treasurer against claims filed as 17 prescribed by law with the Director of the Office of Management and 18 Enterprise Services for approval and payment. 19

D. Notwithstanding other provisions of law, income and investment return on Trust Fund principal shall accrue to the Trust Fund for use as provided by authorization of the trustees for the purposes provided in Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title <u>and</u> Sections 1 through 3 of this act. The State Regents may also

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utilize the Trust Fund principal for the purposes provided in 1 Sections 2601 through 2605 of this title and Sections 1 through 3 of 2 this act. Except as otherwise provided by law, no such income or 3 investment return or principal shall be used for administrative 4 expenses; expenses incurred by the State Regents in the 5 administration of the Trust Fund and of the Oklahoma Higher Learning 6 Access Program established by the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access 7 Act and the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Program established by 8 the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Act shall be paid from monies 9 appropriated to the State Regents coordinating board for their 10 general operating budget. 11

12 Ε. The State Regents shall adopt rules for accomplishing transfer of funds from the Oklahoma Higher Learning Access Trust 13 Fund to the appropriate institutional Educational and General 14 Operations Revolving Funds, as provided in Section 3901 of this 1.5 title, to private institutions, and to the appropriate technology 16 center school district to cover general enrollment fees or tuition 17 for eligible students pursuant to the Oklahoma Higher Learning 18 Access Act and the Oklahoma Access and Achievement Act. Allocations 19 from the Trust Fund may be made only for the purpose of covering the 20 general enrollment fees or tuition of eligible students. No portion 21 of the Trust Fund may be used or allocated for administrative or 22 operating expenses of any higher education institution or technology 23 center school. 24

1	SECTION 5. This act shall become effective July 1, 2024.
2	SECTION 6. It being immediately necessary for the preservation
3	of the public peace, health, or safety, an emergency is hereby
4	declared to exist, by reason whereof this act shall take effect and
5	be in full force from and after its passage and approval.
