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BE IT ENACTED BY THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF OKLAHOMA:
SECTION 1. NEW LAW A new section of law to be codified
in the Oklahoma Statutes as Section 1-1908.2 of Title 63, unless
there is created a duplication in numbering, reads as follows:
For the purpose of modernizing and improving the licensure and
regulatory system for intermediate care facilities for individuals
with intellectual disabilities (ICFs/IID), on or before the
effective date of this act, the State Commissioner of Health shall
update rules governing ICFs/IID including, but not limited to, rules
pertaining to direct care staffing ratios and direct care staff
training and qualifications. Such rules shall consider the
standards provided by federal regulation, shall take into account
the unique setting of ICFs/IID and the needs of residents served,

1	and may alter requirements or standards based on factors determined
2	by the Commissioner including, but not limited to, size of a
3	facility or acuity of the residents. In promulgating such rules,
4	the Commissioner shall consider input from stakeholders including,
5	but not limited to, associations representing long-term care
6	facilities, staff, or residents.
7	SECTION 2. This act shall become effective November 1, 2024.
